Message from The Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the publication of our OFSTED report at the start of the term, we have been extremely busy building on all the positive aspects of life at our Academy.

I would like to say a particular 'Thank you' and 'Well Done' to all our Year 11 students who conducted themselves so well during their mock exams. We received many comments from the exam invigilators on how focused and polite the students were – this bodes well for the final exams in Terms 5 and 6. We want the very best for our year 11s and have introduced a range of revision workshops and targeted support for Lesson 6 which begins next term.

This term has seen Parents/Carers' Evenings for several year groups together with an Options Information Evening – thank you to all parents / carers who have attended. Our students really thrive from support from both home and school; if you were unable to attend, please do contact your child's subject teachers.

We are working hard as a school to develop our standards in reading and writing. This week we are introducing DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) time – this is a whole-school strategy where all students and staff will devote time to reading for pleasure. I would ask for your support in ensuring that your child brings a book to school; please use the fantastic local library in Burgess Hill!

Since Christmas, we have started to expand our curriculum to incorporate a Forest School. Our Forest School students have begun to design the layout of the plot of land, visited a garden centre to purchase equipment and have sown a variety of seeds. We are at an exciting stage in our development as a school and it is most encouraging to see how our students are responding – we have already seen a reduction in our suspension rate and attendance is improving. Both of these are areas we need to improve following our OFSTED report and I am confident that we will continue to move in the right direction. Thank you, as always for your support.

Outside of lessons, our students have been engaged in representing our Academy at the Holocaust Memorial Event in Burgess Hill. Our student ambassadors have helped with tree planting and a group of Year 10 Science students participated in the GCSE Science Live day in Brighton.

Finally, we have launched a number of opportunities to enrich school life – these include a Prayer Room for use at lunchtime, a Year 7 History visit to Dover Castle, a Year 10 History visit to the Battlefields in France and Belgium, visits to The Depot, Lewes and a Year 10 Spanish/Geography visit to Granada, Spain. Please look out for other opportunities which we hope to offer for Years 8 and 9 soon.

Finally, it remains for me to wish you a relaxing break. Let's hope that we begin to see a little more of the Spring sunshine so that the daffodils finally begin to bloom!

Although they left with sore fingertips, they also left with smiles.







Careers



Careers at TBHA Term 3

The focus this term has been with Year 9 as they choose which GCSEs they would like to study in Year 10. We started with workshops with the University of Brighton where we looked more closely at the reasons for choosing GCSEs. Students considered the subjects that they were currently doing well in and the skills that they learnt from them. Student ambassadors from the University supported them in looking more closely at their reasons for choosing GCSEs.

This was followed by two workshops with our Careers Adviser from Elev8Careers, Carl Jackson, who worked with selected students on how to make an informed decision, understanding the levels that they are working towards and what criteria might be needed in order to study a particular subject.

We held two special assemblies where teachers of subjects that are not taught at Key Stage 3 such as; Business, Photography, Film Studies & Engineering gave presentations about their subjects and explained what studying them might look like and lead into.

Finally, Year 9 students with their parents and carers came to Year 9 Guided Choices Parents Evening where they had a chance to speak to subject teachers directly about whether their subject was suitable for them.

11 Year 8 students who are taking part in the BHAFC Social Enterprise Challenge have been working hard on their ideas to raise awareness of the work that the Foundation do in two workshops – supported by Hayley from BHAFC and some volunteers from American Express. They are looking forward to going to the AMEX Stadium in March to present their ideas.

We celebrated National Apprenticeship Week with a series of assemblies. We were delighted to welcome Annie from Edwards Vacuum to speak to Year 7 students about the benefits of an apprenticeship and explain what it involves. It's fantastic to have the support of such a large local company.



Our Year 8 students heard about the variety of apprenticeships available in the Land-Based industries with an assembly from Plumpton College and our Year 9 and 10 students were given a greater understanding of apprenticeships with individual assemblies from Amazing Apprenticeships.



Year 11 students interested in pursuing apprenticeships Post 16 took part in a workshop from Carl from Amazing Apprenticeships helping them to understand where vacancies are advertised and how to apply for them. Some valuable tips given on the best way to answer questions and prepare for assessment centres.

Finally, Year 11 students were encouraged to think about a potential route into university by The University of Brighton Outreach who gave students practical information about the cost of university, student loans, researching now to ensure that you will meet entry requirements for the course that you are interested in.

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme (<u>https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/education-</u> <u>children-and-families/support-for-families/holiday-activities-and-food-programme/</u>) provides children who are eligible for benefits related Free School Meals (FSM) access to a wide range of activities and free nutritious meals over the school holidays.

Eligible children can attend their chosen HAF provision for a maximum of four days per week for one week at Easter, four weeks during the Summer and one week at Christmas. To register and book a place, please click <u>here</u>.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Is my child eligible?

Free school meals in all West Sussex maintained and free schools and academies are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
