


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Fun with fruits and veggies

Fruits and Vegetables

Fruits grow on trees and vines. They contain the seeds of the plant. Vegetables grow on plants, above or below the ground. They usually do not contain seeds. Color the examples below and draw two other examples of your own

What's on the menu this month? This month we are spotlighting two veggies.



Enjoy!

Snow Peas

Snow peas should be shiny and flat and their peas should be very small, barley able to be seen through their pod. Snow peas are high in vitamin C and are a good source of iron. You can freeze snow peas, but if you don't you should use them as soon as possible.

Parsnip Sticks

Parsnips should be chosen firm and without pits. The smaller they are the more flavorful and tender they are. Parsnips are good sources of vitamin C, fiber, vitamin K and are very low in sodium. You can refrigerate parsnips and keep them unsealed for 3 weeks or more.



- Red, orange, and yellow peppers are actually very ripe green peppers.
- Melons are related to squash and cucumbers.
- The paler white the parsnip is, the sweeter it will taste.

Please follow these guidelines for dropping off and picking up your student(s):


