REGISTRATION DEADLINES:

Session 1: May 16

Session 2: June 12

All classes will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Students requiring course as credit recovery will take precedence over students taking a course as enrichment or advancement. It is important to ENROLL EARLY because courses will be closed once registration reaches maximum size. Courses will be offered based on sufficient enrollment, facility, and teacher availability. We will determine if classes run on Date of Deadline. We will take registrations after deadline depending on availability. In the event enrollment is insufficient, or staff unavailable, tuition will be refunded.

TUITION

Please see course offerings to see tuition.

There are NO tuition waivers for summer school.

CREDIT, GRADING, & REPORT CARDS

Students will receive semester credit or quarter credit upon successful completion of each course. Summer School grades are included in computation of students' cumulative grade point averages, except for pass/fail courses.

If a grade earned is higher than the grade on the transcript, the grade will **REPLACE the grade on the transcript. If a student earned a D in Algebra 1 and takes summer school and earns a B. The D will be removed.

REFUNDS

All monies paid for a canceled course will be refunded at the end of summer school. If a student withdraws a week before the start of class, a refund will be granted. If students are dropped from a class due to a breach of regulations, they will forfeit their tuition.

SOCIAL BEHAVIOR

Regular school-day behavior regulations, dress code rules, and expectations are in effect. Infractions may lead to loss of credit with no refund.

STUDENT ID'S

All students must wear their student ID. New students will be issued an ID. ID's must be worn at all times.

CONFIRMATION AND SCHEDULES

Receipt from registration is confirmation that the student is enrolled. Argo will NOT mail any confirmation or schedules. Students will consult posted schedules for classroom information when they arrive on the first day. When information (bus schedules, classroom assignments) become available, it will be posted on the website: www.argohs.net.

STUDENT PARKING

Students should park in the **student parking lot** and enter through the Cafeteria.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Summer School is very concentrated, with every class equivalent of approximately one week of regular school.

Each summer school day is only a few hours of instruction. It is important that students do not miss any days.

Students should NOT miss more than 1 day per session.

Once a student has reached 2 absences, the student may receive NO credit and NO refund.

Three (3) tardies = one (1) absence

NO Early Finals are allowed.

SCHOOL BUSES

School Buses are included in the fee for Summer School. Please indicate during registration whether or not bus service is needed. Bus routes and stops are determined by student enrollment and safety concerns. **Summer School bus routes are not the same as during the school year.**

Time constraints limit bus service to centralized pick-up locations. Bus service cannot extend to student pick up at individual addresses. Bus route information will be posted on the week before the start of session 1.

It is the student's responsibility to make it to school. If the student misses the bus or the bus fails to make the stop, the student is responsible for making it to school.

Bus routes will be posted to our website a week before summer school starts.

MEALS

Argo High School provides free breakfast to all students and community members who are under the age of 18.

PLEASE NOTE

- Counselors DO NOT register you for summer academic courses. You must do this on your own.
- Students should NOT register for summer courses if they have vacation plans, or if for any reason, they will miss more than one day of class during a session.

MATHEMATICS

Algebra 1 (Credit Recovery Only)

MA320C: June 2- June 18

MA320D: June 23 - July 10

Cost: \$140 per semester

Open to: This course is for students who need to recover credit for Algebra 1. A TI-Nspire calculator is encouraged.

Geometry (Credit Recovery Only)

MA330C: June 2 - June 18

MA330D: June 23 - July 10

Cost: \$140 per semester

Open to: This course is designed for students who need Geometry, 2nd Semester. A TI-Nspire calculator is encouraged.

Algebra 2 (Credit Recovery Only)

MA620C: June 2 - June 18

MA620D: June 23 - July 10

Cost: \$140 per semester

Open to: Students in need of recovering credit in Algebra 2. Students need to select the correct semester. A scientific calculator is required for this course.

Intro to Algebra & Geometry (Credit Recovery Only)

MA100C: June 2 - June 18

MA100D: June 23 - July 10

Cost: \$140 per semester

This course serves two different purposes. 1. It is the class that a future 9th grader may take to get more practice in math. If this student earns a C or higher in both sessions and passes the final exam, the student will have the option to start in Algebra 1 during the next school year. 2. A student who is in need of credit recovery (a current Argo Student) can take the class to earn credit and/or replace a grade with a better grade.

**This class does NOT count toward graduation requirements for non-credit recovery.

ENGLISH

Writing 1 (Credit Recovery Only)

EN050C: June 2 – June 18

Cost: \$140 per semester

This course is open only to students who need to recover Writing 1 or to upperclassmen who need to complete an English credit and don't already have Writing 1 on their transcript.

English 1 (Credit Recovery only)

EN250D: June 23 - July 10

COST: \$140 per semester

This course is open to Students in need of credit to recover English 1 or another literature class and have not yet taken English 1 in summer school.

SPEECH & COMMUNICATION (Credit Recovery Only)

EN050D: June 23 - July 10

COST: \$140 per semester

This course is open to students who need to recover Speech & Communication credit. It is also open to upperclassmen who need to complete an English credit and don't already have Speech & Communication on their transcripts.

English 2 (Credit Recovery Only)

EN250C: June 2 - July 18

COST: \$140 per semester

This course is open to students who need English Credit for English 2 or for another literature base English class (and who haven't already earned credit for English 2 in the summer)

LITERATURE & WRITING 3, 4 (Credit Recovery Only)

DATES : June 2 - June 18

June 23 - July 10

COST: \$140 per semester

This is an independent English class offered in our Online Credit Recovery Room. Students are expected to be in the building each school day. Certain assignments and all assessments will be available only in a proctored environment. This course is open to students who need English Credit for English 3 or 4. Students with permission from the summer school director and head of counseling may also take the course to help with early graduation.

Etymology, Grammar, & Writing

Dates: June 23 - July 10

Cost: \$140

Credit: .5 / Pass/Fail

This elective course is designed for students looking for extra Language Arts lessons. It will focus on word study, grammar, and writing. This course is geared for incoming 9th graders, but current students may take it for elective credit.

Social Science

Human Geography

SS330: June 2 – July 10

Open to: Grades: 9 (incoming)-10-11-12

Cost: \$280

This course follows the standard full-year Human Geography curriculum. Students should expect substantial reading and writing for homework. This class requires work outside of the in-person meetings in order to meet the state minimum requirement.

ENRICHMENT / ELECTIVE

Digital Photography Basics

AR105C: June 2 - June 18

Open: All students

Credit: .5 (course can be taken Pass/Fail or for a grade)

Cost: \$140

Looking to make your digital photos better? Three areas of instruction will be emphasized: photo composition principles, qualities of light, and the use of professional editing software including Adobe Lightroom and Photoshop. This course is great on its own or as a preview of our digital photography program.

Welding Enrichment

IT361SUM1: June 2 - June 18

Open: All Students

Credit: .5 (course can be taken Pass/Fail or for a grade)

Cost: \$140

This class will have two tracks. One is advance and for returning Welding students. The other track is for anyone interested in taking Welding at Argo and getting a jump start for the fall. This is a hands-on, in-person class designed to provide beginning level instruction as well as advanced instruction to all that want to learn about welding. Basic Arc, Gas, and MIG Welding skills will be covered. There is a lot of differentiating so advance students and beginning students are welcome. See if Welding is something you like. Students who earn a C or better and who haven't taken Welding 1 can advance to Welding 1 or Welding 2.

CULINARY BASICS

FC105D: June 23 - July 10

OPEN: All Students (incoming 9th graders encouraged)

Credit: .5 (course can be taken Pass/Fail or for a grade)

Cost: \$140

This introductory course lays the foundation for a lifetime of healthy eating and wellness. Students will learn essential skills to plan and prepare nutritious meals, with a focus on balanced food choices and meal planning principles that support overall well-being. Through hands-on lab experiences, students will explore food preparation techniques for fruits, vegetables, grains, dairy, and more, while also creating delicious desserts.

Students will only be enrolled if counselors and/or case managers have created a credit recovery plan for the student. *Students cannot take a course online that is offered non-online. Course will only be open in the building during school hours. **Prerequisite:** Counselor, Summer School Director, or Director of ESS approval.
