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Notice to Parents

- This bulletin contains information about all summer school academies and recreational programs offered by the Brownsville Independent School District.
- Students who participate in a BISD summer school academy/program will be held accountable for their behavior and are subject to the disciplinary consequences outlined in the 2024-2025 BISD Student Code of Conduct Student-Parent Handbook.
- Elementary and middle school students who participate in BISD Summer School Academies will not be required to wear the standardized attire (uniform) designated by their respective campus during the regular school year.

PK4-5th Elementary Accelerated Learning Academies

Overview: The purpose of the program is to provide a series of academies for all students who need summer instruction and credit for grade advancement.

I. Bilingual/ESL PK4 and K Accelerated Learning Academy

- **A.** <u>Bilingual Enrichment Academy</u> is for *current and identified* preregistered Emergent Bilingual students entering Kindergarten and 1st grade in the 2025 2026 school year.
- B. Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten Emergent Bilingual Students currently enrolled:
 - 1. PRE-KINDERGARTEN: <u>Currently enrolled</u> identified Pre-Kindergarten Emergent Bilingual students eligible for kindergarten for the 2025 2026 school year.
 - 2. KINDERGARTEN: <u>Currently enrolled</u> identified Kindergarten Emergent Bilingual students eligible for 1st grade for the 2025 2026 school year.
- C. <u>Pre-Registered for Kindergarten and 1st grade for the 2025 2026 school year and NOT currently enrolled in BISD.</u>
 - 1. PRE-KINDERGARTEN (4-year-old): Children, who are identified and pre-registered for kindergarten as Emergent Bilingual students with parental approved placement into the BISD Bilingual Academy for the 2025-2026 school year, are eligible for the Accelerated Learning Academy.
 - 2. KINDERGARTEN: Children, who are identified and pre-registered for first grade as Emergent Bilingual students with parental approved placement into the Bilingual Academy for the 2025-2026 school year, are eligible for the Accelerated Learning Academy.

II. Grades 1st-5th Accelerated Learning Academy (ALA) will be for students meeting the criteria listed below.

- **A.** Currently enrolled students in grades 1st through 5th who <u>failed to be promoted</u> based on District Policy EIE Local. New students to the district must have been enrolled for the COMPLETE sixth (6th) six weeks to be eligible.
- **B.** District students with excessive absences (18 days or more).
- **C.** 3rd through 5th grade students who did <u>NOT</u> meet the Approaches Performance Requirement on either the Reading, Math, and/or 5th grade Science 2025 STAAR state assessments.

NOTE: All students in grades 1st through 5th who are enrolled in the Elementary Accelerated Learning Academy (ALA) will also participate in an enrichment program that will be an extension of the Accelerated Learning Academy program. This enrichment program will use a variety of activities to support TEKS in partnership with the Afterschool Centers for Education program (ACE) for participating summer hosting sites

D. Transportation

V. Elementary Promotion Requirements

A student who attends at least 90% of the Accelerated Learning Academy and who satisfies the requirements for promotion shall be promoted to the next grade level at the beginning of the next school year. A student that fails to meet the 90% attendance rate and satisfies the requirements for promotion for the failed subject(s), will be individually reviewed by the Accelerated Learning Academy attendance committee to determine if the student's extenuating circumstances and successful work merit promotion.

The attendance committee members (4) shall include:

- Accelerated Learning Academy Administrator
- Accelerated Learning Academy Lead Teacher
- Accelerated Learning Academy Teacher of Record
- Accelerated Learning Academy Teacher from the same program.

VI. House Bill 1416

Students failing to meet the approaches standard on the Math, Reading, and/or Science STAAR assessments will be required no less than 15 or 30 hours, depending on student performance, of accelerated instruction in Math, Reading, and/or Science. Students who attend the Accelerated Learning Academy will be eligible to receive targeted instruction for HB1416 during the Accelerated Learning Academy program.

The following documentation needs to be monitored and kept at the campus, readily available as well as uploaded to the Elementary Accelerated Learning Academy OneDrive folder by the end of the ALA summer program:

HB1416 Notification of Student Eligibility signed by parent/guardian should be kept on file at the campus.

VII. Camp Ignite 1st Grade Summer Program

Camp Ignite is a summer ADSY Pep program for 1st grade students with the goal of providing engaging, hands-on learning experiences that help 1st-grade students build confidence, strengthen academic skills, and develop teamwork through a mix of reading, math, science, social studies, STEM, art, and physical activities through the camp's theme; TEAM UP, DREAM BIG. By the end of camp, students will have **new skills, great memories, and a stronger foundation** for success in the upcoming school year!

Camp Ignite will be for students meeting the criteria listed below.

- Currently enrolled 1st grade students entering 2nd grade in the 2025 2026 school year from the following elementary campuses only:
 - Cromack-Castaneda Elementary
 - Del Castillo-Morningside Elementary
 - El Jardin Elementary
 - Judge Reynaldo G. Garza at Southmost Elementary
 - Palm Grove Elementary
- New 1st grade students to the district must have been enrolled for the COMPLETE sixth (6th) six weeks at one of the five eligible campuses in order to be eligible.

Grades 6th- 8th Middle School Summer Academy

Overview: To provide a series of academies for all Middle School BISD students who need summer instruction for course recovery.

I. Regaining of Credit Academy: This Academy is to provide instruction ONLY to currently enrolled BISD students who failed one or two courses during the 2024 - 2025 school year.

A. 6th, 7th, and 8th Grade Regaining of Credit Summer Academy

- 1. The district grading procedures require students to pass each of the core subject areas with a yearly average of 70% and pass electives with a 70% (composite) overall yearly average.
- 2. **ONLY** currently BISD students who failed to meet district promotion criteria, are eligible to attend the Middle School Regaining of Credit Academy.
- 3. Currently enrolled BISD 8th graders not meeting proficiency (69% or lower) in English I, Algebra I, and/or Biology must enroll in the course(s) during summer school at one of the hosting high school sites (Porter ECHS or Veterans Memorial ECHS) or repeat the course in Grade 9.

B. Course Offerings:

- 1. Math, Science, Social Studies, ELAR, ESL I, English SL, Art, and Health.
- 2. If the student failed an elective during the regular school year, the student would need to select from the summer school electives offered to regain an elective credit.
- 3. Dyslexia teachers will be available at each site to work in conjunction with summer school teachers to provide additional support for eligible Dyslexia students.
- **II. Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP)** is for district students who did not pass all their classes as per district policy EIE local and or failed to meet promotion criteria due to excessive absences.

Registration will be done at home campuses from May 1 - 30, 2025.

III. House Bill (HB1416) Students failing the Math, ELAR, Science, and/or Social Studies STAAR in the 2024-2025 school year will require no less than 15 or 30 hours, depending on student performance, of accelerated instruction in Math, Reading, Science, and/or Social Studies during the 2025-2026 school year.

Students who attend the Summer Academy will be eligible to receive up to 30 hours of targeted instruction for HB1416. The following documentation needs to be monitored and kept at the campus, readily available as well as uploaded to the Secondary Summer Academy OneDrive folder by the end of the summer program:

HB1416 Notification of Student Eligibility signed by parent/guardian should be kept on file at the campus.

Grades 9th- 12th High School Summer Academies

Overview: The purpose of the program is to provide a series of academies for all high school BISD students who need summer instruction for course and credit recovery.

I. Regaining of Credit Program: This Academy is to provide instruction ONLY to currently enrolled BISD students who failed one or two courses during the 2024-2025 school year.

A. Course Offerings:

- 1. English, Math, Science, and Social Studies required courses for graduation are offered in the Regaining of Credit Academy.
- 2. Dyslexia teachers will be available at each site to work in conjunction with Summer Academy teachers to provide additional support for eligible dyslexia students.

VI. House Bill 1416 Students failing the English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, and or U.S. History EOC in the 2024 - 2025 school year will require 30 hours of accelerated instruction in Math, Reading, Science, and or Social Studies during the 2025-2026 school year.

Students who attend the Summer Academy will be eligible to receive up to 30 hours of targeted instruction for HB1416. The following documentation needs to be monitored and kept at the campus, readily available as well as uploaded to the Secondary Summer Academy OneDrive folder by the end of the summer program:

• HB1416 Notification of Student Eligibility signed by parent/guardian should be kept on file at the campus.

Early College High School / Dual Enrollment

Overview: Brownsville Independent School District will be offering dual enrollment summer school through Texas Southmost College and the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley for qualified high school students. Students must meet the entrance criteria for either TSC and/or UTRGV and meet each higher education partner's application deadlines.

Eligibility: Dual enrollment summer school is open only to current 9th, 10th and 11th grade students for TSC and current 10th and 11th grade students for UTRGV. Dual enrollment summer school will be offered during TSC's and UTRGV's summer sessions. Dual credit will be awarded only for <u>selected</u> courses. Students may take up to 2 courses per higher education partnering school per summer session (2 for TSC and 2 for UTRGV).

Please note:

- 1. Dual credit will only be awarded for any course(s) on this list.
- 2. Summer school is at no cost to participating BISD students. Tuition and textbooks are provided.
- 3. TSC and UTRGV will have online registration. All deadlines must be met.
- 4. Meeting all deadlines is the sole responsibility of the student and parent(s)/guardian(s).
- 5. Students must submit proof of bacterial meningitis vaccination or an exemption form.
- 6. Transportation is the responsibility of the student and parent(s) /guardian(s).
- 7. If a student takes a dual credit course for which BISD credit has already been earned, neither the dual credit course nor the dual grade will replace this BISD course or grade; and the dual credit course/grade will not figure into the student's GPA.

I. Texas Southmost College (TSC)

Students who are *rising* sophomores, juniors, and seniors are eligible to take up to two dual credit courses per summer session on TSC's campus (6 college hours per summer session or up to 7 college hours if taking a BIOL or MATH course).

A. TSC Summer School Registration

TSC has online registration for BISD students attending Summer Sessions I and/or II. Therefore, it is mandatory that all enrollment documents be submitted by the campus deadline for registration clearance. Any student who is not cleared will not be allowed to register. Check with the high school counselor for campus deadlines.

Online registration for cleared students will be March 31 – May 30, 2025. Students must self-register for their selected courses approved by their counselor. The registration period will open first to seniors, followed by ECHS cohort students, and then dual enrollment students.

Dual credit will NOT be awarded for non-approved courses. Additionally, parents of students wishing to take courses other than those listed above must be aware that any fees, dues, tuition, and costs associated with attending TSC and acquiring required textbooks are the sole responsibility of the parent and/or guardian. In this case, students must follow the individual approval admissions process for concurrent enrollment at TSC.

D. TSC Drops and Withdrawals

Students who wish to drop or withdraw from a course are responsible for completing required documentation by TSC's deadlines. Not dropping or withdrawing from a course will result in an "F" in the student's college transcript.

E. TSC Summer School Location

All courses will be traditional courses taking place at the Texas Southmost College campus.

II. University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV)

Students who are *rising* juniors and seniors are eligible to take up to two dual credit courses per summer session.

A. <u>UTRGV Summer School Registration</u>

Students seeking Dual Credit opportunities with UTRGV must first apply to the program using the Apply Texas Application. Using the information included on the student's application, individual academic profiles will be created based on a variety of factors, including but not limited to: High School Class Rank; GPA; College Entrance Exams (SAT/ACT) (PSAT/ACT-PLAN); Extracurricular Activities; Community Involvement. Academic profiles are created with submitted documentation and admission decisions are based on that profile. Students must be classified as a Rising Junior or Senior in high school and be graduating under the Foundation with Endorsement or Distinguished Plan. Students interested in the summer dual credit program must submit all required forms to UTRGV. For more information visit: www.utrgv.edu/dualcredit

All eligible students may register for Summer Session I and/or II beginning on February 24, 2025. Registration is online through the university's website and can only be completed after a student has attended program orientation. Proceeding with registration is the responsibility of each student based on course recommendations by their high school counselor. In order to attend program orientation and register for courses, students must: 1) Be admitted to UTRGV for the semester in which they plan to enroll; 2) Have submitted all required college readiness assessment scores (e.g., TSI exam scores or other approved measures); 3) Have submitted a valid proof of immunization for bacterial meningitis or a valid affidavit for exemption from immunization available through the Texas Department of Health and Human Services website. Courses are not set-aside for dual credit students; all registration occurs with the general population at UTRGV and, therefore, seats are available on a first-come, first served basis.
