Counselor Referral System

Students can make a self-referral to see the prevention counselor or academic counselor in the following ways:

- \circ Ask a teacher who will then complete a referral form.
- \circ Email the school counselor.

If a situation is URGENT, students should inform their teacher for immediate assistance!!! (A situation is considered URGENT if there is a threat or harm to self or others).

Course Registration for the 2025-2026 School Year

The Rising 10th Grade Course Cards, and the Rising 10th Grade Course Registration PowerPoint Presentation are available on the Bartlett Academy Website.

Honors Contracts:

All students who are requesting an Honors, AP, or Pre-AP course are required to submit a signed Honors Contract to the Counselor facilitating their course registration. If the student does not submit an Honors Contract, all Honors, Pre-AP, & AP courses will be removed from their schedule.

(Mrs. Isaac has students with last names "A-K", and Ms. Sumlar has students with last names "L-Z".)

An announcement regarding Honors Contracts will be made each day, from March 24th – 31st, informing all students that the deadline to submit their Honors contracts is Monday, March 31, 2025, by 2pm.

Final Verifications for Course Registration for the `25-`26 School Year:

Course Verification Sheets will be sent home with your student during April 2025. (Date to be determined)

<u>All course verification forms need to be returned by Friday, April 11, 2025.</u>

You and your child will need to review their current course requests for next school year. If the course selections are correct, sign the green verification sheet, and have your student return it to their Science teacher. The Math teachers will submit the course verification forms to the Counselors.

If there are classes that need to be changed, please mark through the class that your student no longer wants or needs, and write the new class next to it. Then, sign and return the course verification sheet to your child's Science teacher. If your student added an Honors, AP, or Pre-Ap course, they will also need to submit a signed Honors contract with the verification sheet in order to make that change.

• Final Date for Course Request Changes for the '25-'26 School Year:

Friday, May 22 2025, is the final date that you, or your student may request a change to their course requests.

You, or your student will need to email the counselor, facilitating your student's course registration, to make any additional changes after the verification deadline (Fri., April 11). No additional changes will be made after May 22rd.

TN Requirements for High School Promotion

PROMOTION CRITERIA & GRADE CLASSIFICATION:

Students must earn a minimum number of credits each year to be promoted to the next level:

- 9th Grade: promotion or placement from 8th Grade.
- 10th Grade: <u>minimum of 5 credits</u> including English 9 are needed to be promoted to 10th Grade.
- 11th Grade: <u>minimum of 11 credits</u> including English 9 and 10 are needed to be promoted to 11th Grade.
- 12th Grade: <u>minimum of 16 credits</u> including English 9, 10, and 11 are needed to be promoted to 12th Grade.

Helpful Tips...

To Improve Your Test-Taking Skills:

- prepare thoroughly with a study plan
- manage your time effectively
- read questions and instructions carefully
- practice relaxation techniques to reduce anxiety and boost performance.

I. Develop a Study Plan:

Create a structured plan to allocate time for studying and cover all the material.

1. Cultivate Good Study Habits:

Make a habit of reviewing notes daily, doing homework assignments carefully, and writing your own study guides.

2. Take Practice Tests:

Simulate test conditions to familiarize yourself with the format and time constraints.

3. Arrive Early:

Arrive early to the test location to relax and avoid feeling rushed.

4. Get Enough Sleep:

Ensure you get a good night's sleep before the test to improve cognitive function.

5. Eat a Balanced Meal:

Fuel your body with a healthy and balanced breakfast and snacks to maintain energy and focus.

6. Learn Relaxation Techniques:

Practice relaxation techniques like deep breathing or meditation to manage test anxiety.

II. During the Test:

- **Read Instructions Carefully:** Pay close attention to all instructions, including time limits and specific requirements.
- **Read Questions Carefully:** Thoroughly read each question to understand what is being asked and avoid misinterpretations.
- Manage Your Time: Allocate time for each section or question and pace yourself accordingly.
- Answer Easy Questions First: Start with the questions you feel most confident about to build momentum and reduce anxiety.
- Use Process of Elimination: If you are unsure of the answer, eliminate the obviously incorrect options to increase your chances of selecting the right answer.
- Address Skipped Questions: If you encounter questions you cannot answer immediately, mark them and revisit them later.
- Maintain a Positive Attitude: Believe in your abilities and stay focused throughout the test.
- **Rely on Your First Impressions:** Trust your initial gut feeling when answering questions.
- Plan to Finish Early: Aim to finish the test with some time to spare for review.
- Analyze Your Performance: After the test, review your answers and identify areas for improvement.

Do you have access to your student's PowerSchool grades, Canvas account, and LightSpeed Internet Filter report?

Power School

Check student grades and attendance. You should have received an email with your username and password. The code for the mobile device app is MBPZ.



Teachers post handouts, presentations, videos, worksheets, etc. to Canvas. Parents have an observer account that they can use to view their student's account.



Light Speed

Every Sunday, you should receive an email report about your students internet usage and history from the previous week.

Canvas Observer Accounts



Canvas Observer accounts give a read view only look at a student's Canvas account. You can see agendas, assignments, notes, etc. Grades should always be referred to in PowerSchool.

All parent observer accounts will be auto created and paired with your student. Your username is the same email as is listed in Powerschool for your contact information. Returning to BCS parents – if you need to reset your password please email Melissa Marshall. New to BCS parents will receive an email for their Canvas Observer accounts on Friday, August 30th.


