

### **Reports:**



- Mr. Lippitt, student ex-officio member, reported on STAP-Comm. Registration is open for the Erie County Student Leadership Summit, which will be held on March 6. OPHS is holding a spring fling faculty foosball game in April. The STAP-Comm Panera fundraiser is on Feb 28 at Panera in Orchard Park from 4-8 pm. STAP-Comm thanked the district office for relationships with students and including students on committees.
- Mrs. Hornung reported on District Community Engagement and Wellness Committee Meeting. The committee reviewed a recent survey from the surgeon general centered around parent stressors and how as a district, we can support parents. The committee also discussed character education transition and improvement. Mrs. Hornung also reported on the Inclusive Learning and Student Support Committee meeting. The committee heard a presentation from the ENL (Englished as a new language) **teachers** who gave a high-level **overview of the program** and all of the support in place for students in the program.

#### Discussion

Mr. Lilleck presented information on the **first draft** of the comprehensive Pre-K-12 grade program operating budget. The goals for the budget are to align with DCIP and Board goals, support current programs and remain within the tax cap levy requirements. The State's proposed budget has a current estimate for Orchard Park to receive a 2% increase in foundation aid. The current allowable tax levy cap for Orchard Park Central School District is 6.26%. The five-year average tax levy in our budgets (since 2020) has been 1.7 %. The Board requested the administrative team work to implement **necessary budget adjustments to lower the tax levy** to between 4-5% and not go up to the tax cap in this budget but also expressed the importance of **maintaining student programs**. The next updated budget presentation will be March 11, 2025, with a goal of the Board adopting the budget on April 8.

#### Action:

- Declared 18 athletic wrestling mats as surplus and four iPads as surplus.
- Approved the Public School Registration Resolution for Pre-K.
- Accepted a donation from the Foundation for Academic Excellence. A t-shirt launcher will be • donated to the physics department to calculate velocities, angles, and distances.
- Acceptance of a donation from the South Davis PTO of \$1,000 to be used by the South Davis Library.
- Approved the Phase #4 Capital Project Bid Awards Bids for Site Work, General Construction, • Roofing, Plumbing, Mechanicals, and Electric. Total amount of bids is \$26,909,025.
- Nominated incumbents Ronald Catalano, from the Westfield School District, Kathleen Chiavetta, from the Lake Shore School District, Dwight Eagan, from the Orchard Park School District, Linda Hoffman, from the Springville Griffith Institute School District and Anita Ray, from the Fredonia School District. as candidates for the Eric 2 BOCES Board of Education.
