


Jewish American Heritage Month

Michigan.




Later waves of Jewish immigrants were attracted to the region for religious freedoms, public education, and profitable trade networks across the region.





Ruth Behar



SooJi Min-Maranda is a non-profit executive who advocates for strategic partnerships, racial justice and efficient, effective resource allocation.




Zilka Joseph
