CMAS Testing

On April 9th, 10th and 11th, students will be taking the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS), a state mandated assessment that determines a student's achievement and academic growth in relation to the Colorado Academic Standards, which are aimed at preparing students for college and career success.

Students will take the assessments on the following dates:

ELA and Math (All Grades)

- All grades will take the Math and ELA sessions throughout the day on April 9, April 10, and April 11
- On the testing dates of April 9, 10, and 11, students will have an early release from school at 1:20 pm. Buses will pick up students at the early release time and drop off students 2 hours and 45 minutes earlier than usual drop off times.**
 - **Students who will receive extended time for their assessments will need to stay longer in the day. If they use all of their testing time, they will be finished by 3:00 pm. The students can call for a ride when they are finished or they can stay until 4:05 pm for a bus ride home. Families will be receiving communication if your student is receiving extended time.
- SSN students will be released at 1:20 and will depart on their regular bus routes, arriving to their stop 2 hours and 45 minutes earlier than usual.

Science (8th Grade ONLY)

- 8th graders will take the Science assessments on **Wednesday, April 16**. 8th grade students will take 3 sessions of science on April 16. They will not have regular classes on this day. No early dismissal.
- 6th & 7th grade students will attend all classes following a typical schedule on April 16.

Deer Creek is committed to using a body of evidence to inform us about instruction and students' learning and progress. The data generated from a variety of measures, including CMAS, helps us meet the needs of all of our students and allows us to make decisions to improve student learning and growth.

Here are some additional important facts about the CMAS assessments:

- Please ensure that your student is attending school on testing dates. Please avoid late arrivals and early dismissals, as they might interrupt your child's testing session.
- Student Chromebooks must be fully charged and brought to school daily.
- Lunch will be served for all students before dismissal. Students may continue to bring a water bottle to testing, but should not bring any snacks or food items.
- Students who miss a testing session will make up that session. Make-up testing ends April 24.

At Deer Creek, we are committed to preparing students for a promising future full of choices. We value CMAS and other performance and growth data to make instructional decisions, while at the same time preserving instructional time in the classroom.

The unit question is, "How do I make informed choices about my body and relationships through a decision-making model?"

- Students will further develop their knowledge of sexual health, ATOD (alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs), healthy relationships, and confidence in using a decision-making model.
- Students will compare and contrast healthy and unhealthy relationships, they will analyze the internal and external factors that influence sexual decision-making, and they will know how to prevent sexually transmitted infections (STIs/STD's) including human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS).
- Students will analyze the consequences of using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.

As a result of this unit, students will be able to effectively use a decision-making model to make informed choices about their health. A parent letter will be posted on Mrs. Saueracker's and Mrs. Mattivi's Google Classroom as the start of the unit approaches.



Mountaineers Go To Belize

Over spring break, 13 Mountaineers, 2 Parents, and 3 DCMS teachers traveled through the country of Belize.

We had a great time learning about Belize's diverse culture and their practices of conservation throughout the country. Students got to zipline through the jungle and help track and collect data for turtles, fish and bats. They also got to visit Mayan ruins and visit a village where they learned to make homemade tortillas and learned how to basket weave.

DCMS also planted trees at local riverbanks to help with reforestation, visited a sustainable farm and tried local fresh fruits, took traditional creole drumming classes, snorkeled along the largest barrier reef in the western hemisphere and helped monitor the manatee population. Signing up for Schoolpool is free, easy, and secure! There is no cost to participate. Your information will only be shared with families from our school. To maintain the highest level of privacy and security, Deer Creek Middle School's registration link is unique to families attending our school.

How do I participate? It's simple!

- 1. Go to this registration link and create an account and enter your address or intersection.
 - Pro-tip: Use a computer. While it works on a smartphone and tablet, there is more functionality on a computer.
- 2. Add comments to indicate interest, such as "can provide morning rides in exchange for afternoon rides," "student is in after-school activities," or "looking for a walk buddy in the mornings."
- 3. Find and contact interested families.

Tips from carpooling experts to help you be successful:

- Get acquainted—contact the parents on your list and arrange a get-together prior to your first day carpooling.
- Exchange important information and emergency contacts.
- Decide on a schedule: How many days a week will you travel to/from school together? Who's driving on which days? What if a parent needs to switch a day?
- Plan ahead and be on time.
- Establish a back-up plan.
- Set ground rules.
- Have fun
