

Additionally, we will sort and describe attributes of two-dimensional figures. We will determine the perimeter of two-dimensional figures. We will solve real-world problems involving perimeter and unknown measurements. Lastly, we will collect, display, and analyze data on scaled picture graphs and related bar graphs.



We are also preparing for the 3rd grade LEAP daily by reviewing skills and strategies taught this school year. This preparation includes us learning different types of questions stems such as multiple choice, multi-select, technology enhanced, evidence based selected response, and prose constructed response which will be seen on this end of the year assessment.

4TH GRADE

Keep on swimming!


In ELA students have been working on learning and applying test taking strategies for reading and responding to texts. Students will also be participating in a week-long writing boot camp in which we will be discussing test taking strategies for responding to prompts.

In social studies, students are learning about early Louisiana peoples. Students are learning about the people who lived in our backyards!



5TH GRADE

The school year is swimming by at full speed, and we're in crunch time! It's more important than ever for students to buckle down and stay focused. In **Math**, students have been diving deep into geometry with Module 5, where they've been constructing, analyzing, and classifying shapes like trapezoids, kites, parallelograms, rectangles, rhombuses, and squares. They've explored these shapes like navigating through an underwater coral reef, uncovering all their unique properties. In **Science**, students have been exploring the phenomenon question: What separates Earth from outer space? They examined the boundary between Earth's atmosphere and outer space, coming up with analogies to better understand it. They discovered that Earth's atmosphere is like a glowing ocean of gas particles that scatter sunlight, giving it a bright blue appearance, while outer space is a vast, empty abyss, black as the deep sea. In **ELA**, students will soon wrap up Unit 3 by composing an essay, deciding if coming to America was worth the journey. Afterward, they will dive into the Application Unit, focusing on writing, poetry, and vocabulary—ready to explore new depths of creativity. In **Social Studies**, students have completed all units for the year. Students will revisit all the units to help them prepare for the upcoming assessments. With the finish line in sight, it's time to dive in headfirst and make the most of every moment!

FITNESS FACTS for KIDS

Kids this age need physical activity to build strength, coordination, and confidence — and to lay the groundwork for a healthy lifestyle. They are also gaining more control over how active they are.

School-age kids should have many chances to do a variety of activities, sports, and games that fit their personality, ability, age, and interests. Brainstorm with your kids on activities that feel right. Most kids will not mind a daily dose of fitness as long as it is fun.

Physical activity guidelines for school-age kids recommend that they get 1 hour or more of moderate to strong physical activity daily.

Most of the physical activity should be aerobic, where kids use large muscles and continue for a period of time. Examples of aerobic activity are running, swimming, and dancing.

School-age kids usually have brief bouts of moderate to strong physical activity alternating with light activity or rest throughout the day. Any moderate to strong activity counts toward the 60-minute goal. Children naturally build strong muscles and bones when they run, jump, and play.

Here are some ways to keep your kids moving at home:

Make physical activity part of the daily routine. From household chores to an after-dinner walk, keep your family active every day.

Allow enough time free play. Kids can burn more calories and have more fun when left to their own devices. Playing tag, riding bikes around the neighborhood, and building snowmen are fun and healthy.

Keep a variety of games and sports equipment on hand. It does not have to be expensive — an assortment of balls, hula-hoops, and jump ropes can keep kids busy for hours.

Be active together. It will get you moving, and kids love to play with their parents.

Limit time spent in sedentary activities, such as watching TV, using electronic devices, being online, and playing video games.

If you run out of possibilities at home, take advantage of local playgrounds and athletic fields. Make family fitness outings part of your regular routine. Let family members choose an activity — go hiking, or try out the rock-climbing gym. Anything goes, as long as everyone can participate.


Fun Facts About Strawberries!


