Care for Seniors, A message from your guidance counselors...

We are coming into a stressful time for seniors. The next few months will require substantial thoughtfulness while making potentially life-direction decisions. Deciding where to attend college is the biggest one students have had to make in their lives. Way more impactful than "do we want bacon or pepperoni from Nick's?"

Students who are not going to college may be feeling some of the same anxiety. Working full time when friends are no longer around on a daily basis can be equally stressful. Those who are enlisting in the military - well... thank you, and the level of uncertainty should go without saying.

Anxiety towards the end of school...

Saying goodbye to what was known or comfortable over the past 12 years...

Figuring out what goes into the perfect promposal...

Making what is considered life altering decisions...

It's a lot.

There will be a time when kids will need to give parents a break. But right now, it's their time.

It may be stressful in various households over the next few weeks / months. Be sure to take a step back and give some space and time. Let your senior know you are there and understand.

May 1st will be "decision day" and families will have some semblance of a plan. (We'll talk about transitions and moving later.) But keep in mind that along with all the excitement of change or the "adventure" of going away to college, there can be genuine fear of the unknown. Most kids these days have not participated in summer sleep-away camp and this will be their first time out of the home.

Regardless of your student's plans, be aware that the next few months will be stressful for them. Give some space. Ensure they know you love them. Trust you raised them right. Make sure their wings are strong and let them fly.

Financial Aid Sessions for High School Seniors, April 16th

The Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority (MEFA) will host two virtual Financial Aid Offer Hotline events from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 19 and Wednesday, April 16 to help college-bound students and their families understand financial aid offers. Each student/family will meet with a financial aid expert to walk through each college financial aid offer the student has received, calculate the estimated balance due at each school, and consider their options for paying the remaining college costs. Families can drop in virtually to either event. Interested students and families can register online.

College Acceptance Letters and/or Future Plans


