





Bundled up tight and with their GPS in hand, students ventured through the woods of Baker Park Outdoor Learning Center to find waypoints in the woods.

The club not only provides a break from screens but also promotes an appreciation for nature, teamwork, and essential outdoor skills. It's an opportunity to learn, have fun, and make new friends, all while exploring Baker Outdoor Learning Center. The program is divided into four sessions, each diving into different aspects of the environment, outdoor skills, and exploration: snowshoeing, orienteering, archery, and rock climbing. 
Favorite Things:
