

from the Principal


Dear RMS-CES Families,

Lunchtime Volunteer Opportunity!



- Stainless Steel Tables & Stools for Food Science Room: Improved facilities for the Food Science room for hands-on learning.





Outdoor Clyb: A New Partnership Between RMS-CES and Three Rivers Parks





Kaari Binsfeld Media Center Paraprofessional Agri-Science Teacher




