





COURSE LEVEL OPTIONS

Foundations: Support-focused, building skills for future success.

College Prep (CP): For students meeting grade-level standards, preparing for college and careers.

Honors: For high-achieving students, offering more rigorous and challenging coursework.

Dual Enrollment: College-level courses taken during high school, earning both high school and college credit.

Advanced Placement (AP): College-level coursework designed for students ready to take on more challenging material and earn potential college credit.
