Principal's Report - Kelly Sundeen, OPM/Central Elementary Principal

Superintendent's Report - John Hood, Superintendent

- HR Director Position Open (Mario left, need to fill)
- Question about exit interviews: We do not do them
- We have done lots of hiring recently, many stay. Okemos is an intense place to work with high expectations.
- Policies: were redone as of 7/1.
- LSJ did a story regarding Immigration policies. We did not redo these policies because we are already in a good place.
- Hard to find on website
- Communication going out about updated policies.
- Strategic planning
- Early childcare community ed. Will present plan at tonight's Board of Ed meeting.
 - More GSRP offerings (free pre-school).
 - Increased costs (employment/salaries)
 - Management not meeting expectations
 - Before and aftercare enrollment down
 - Ratings went down from 4 star to 1 star
- District mission: K-12. Maybe we want to enhance/focus on pre-K. Proposal: sunset infant 1& 2 yr old rooms, increase preschool, 3 & 4s.
- Trying to increase sales for Wolf gear. Seven Brew, no Meijer, others in the works. Yearly renewal (over 3 years) so don't need to stay with Fabricated Customs. Want to keep control of trademarked logo and maximize profits for the district.
- School cancellations Text and/or call notifications are coming next school year.
- Closings: Bennett Woods 3 extra days (power outage, gas leak, motor burnout/smoke)'
 - High School 5 days
 - o Rest 4 days
- 3 accidents by Bennett Woods this school year. (Ingham County Road Commission). Katie Diehl security assessments on-site.

Board of Education Report - Jillian Winn

- Background in tech and education, ASL and business. (Taught web development and design at MSU)
- Orientation, webinars,
- Three of our lawyers came to talk about protecting students
- Must have warrant/parent present
- Sec. e taking students into custody need parent consent or warrant or court order, etc. Exceptions: hot pursuit (weapons)
- We will reach out to our legal team if something happens (schools no longer protected zones)
- Webinar: Navigating Executive Orders (MASB) student records, confidentiality. PTO piece - keeping data safe.
- School staff have scripts established and printed out so people know what to say. Pushes up to John or Stacy or principal.
- Raising Resilient Wolves presentations wellness series
- Strategic planning: 3-5 years. February 2020 was our last one.
- Strategic plan working with MASB
- Short survey link on OPS site: okemosk12.net

Presentation - Stacey Bailey - Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction Curriculum:

- K-8, 5-8 purchase rotations
- High School: Each course has its own calendar for purchasing.
- \$100k spent annually for updated curriculum/courses. Try to spread out purchases so we don't need the big ones at the same time.
- There is a committee for renewals (teachers of all voices included). 6-9 months for recommendations. District Advisory Council looks at recommendations; presentation to the Board of Education; parents then notified.
- Never unilateral curriculum selections.
- Teachers get training needed for updates.
- Course offerings are on the district website: Academics.
- Question on going in and out of honors classes
- 4th and 7th grades math testing, not 5th and 6th as well.
- There is now an appeals process for testing
- Question about having only 6 class periods per day at the high school. Not enough room for required courses plus electives. Forces kids to quit arts or make tough choices. (Versus having shorter classes with an additional one or 2 periods). Help with being competitive with other states for higher ed admissions.
- Scheduling information all online. Course guide. Group comments about wishing parents could be more involved with scheduling (or notified earlier so can better discuss options with children).

New Business/Action Items

- Question: Can we opt for texts vs voice calls for school closings? Yes! Happening soon.
- Okemos strategic planning process The district is working in conjunction with the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) to hold listening sessions that will inform the new strategic plan. We would like members of the District Parent Council to participate in a dedicated session for that group. We are hoping to

conduct the session during your regularly scheduled meeting on March 17. It is expected to take about an hour and would happen via a Zoom link from the MASB.
