St. Thomas-St. John District Announces Temporary Summer Employment Opportunities for 2025 Summer Food Service Program

The Virgin Islands Department of Education's School Food Authority in the St. Thomas-St. John District is pleased to announce the availability of temporary employment opportunities for the 2025 Summer Food Service Program (SFSP).

Funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the SFSP ensures that children across the Virgin Islands continue to receive nutritious meals even when school is not in session. This federally supported program provides free meals that meet established nutritional guidelines throughout the summer break.

Interested individuals are encouraged to apply for temporary positions supporting the program's operations. Application forms are available via the QR Code or can be picked up at the School Food Authority Office, located at #21 Subbase, St. Thomas, VI 00802. Forms can also be sent via email upon request.



Applicants must submit all original documents, along with a copy of a valid photo ID and Social Security card, to the School Food Authority Office on St. Thomas. Email submissions will not be accepted. The deadline to submit applications is Monday, May 5, 2025.
