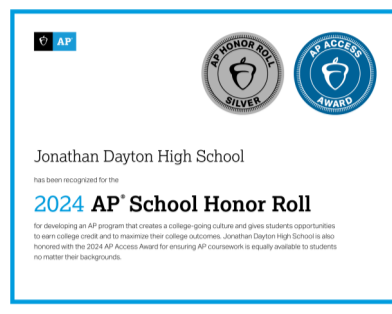


October Updates!
