First team

LEROY BLYDEN

6-0, Sr., G, U-D Jesuit

Blyden is an elite point guard who can do it all — drive and find his teammate for an open look, score in transition or attack the rim and score by himself. He also had great range, where he shot 66% from the field and made 40% of his 3s and 87% of his free throws. He averaged 20.5 points, 5.7 assists, 2.4 steals and put on 20 pounds during the offseason to help him get 6.8 rebounds and 1.4 blocks. He was a Mr. Basketball finalist who will play next year at Toledo.

XAVIER JOHNSON

6-4, Sr., G, U-D Jesuit

Johnson developed into a strong all-around player, having an outstanding mid-range game and showed his ability to attack the basket and score and also get offensive rebounds for second chance opportunities. He averaged 18 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists and nearly two steals to help his team reach the Catholic League title game. He shot 54% from the field and has multiple Division I offers.

MAREON KNOTT

6-4, Jr., G, Detroit King

Knott missed most of the first half of the season due to an ankle injury, then returned to lead King to the PSL championship game and a Division I state quarterfinal appearance, a loss to Wayne Memorial at Calihan Hall. He averaged 18.5 points and eight rebounds while being a defensive stopper with his physical style.

JORDAN SIGMON

6-2, Jr., G, Detroit Renaissance

Sigmon used his size, quickness and ball skills to help Renaissance win the PSL championship for the first time since 2004. He was named Mr. PSL and joined Detroit-bound point guard Lance Stone to give Renaissance the best backcourt in the state. He averaged 24 points, six rebounds and four assists and owns multiple major offers, including Alabama and LSU.

LANCE STONE

5-7, Sr., G, Detroit Renaissance

Stone grew up the son of a coach and learned lessons while watching LaMonta Stone as an assistant coach at Bowling Green, then as a head coach at River Rouge High School when it advanced to the Division 2 state title game in 2019. Lance finished his career by averaging 22 points, 11 assists and three rebounds to help Renaissance win the PSL championship while becoming a Mr. Basketball finalist. He will play next year at Detroit-Mercy, where LaMonta is an assistant coach.

Coach of the Year

JOHN D. WHITE

Detroit Renaissance

White guided Renaissance to its first PSL championship since 2004 behind the strong play of its backcourt, Lance Stone and Jordan Sigmon.

“This group of young men believed in the vision and culture of this program,” White said. “They played for each other and made history in the process by winning the city championship.”
