



### The Gist with Fr. Jeremy



### The Good Thief

Today, on Palm Sunday, and on Good Friday we hear the Passion narrative proclaimed in church. Besides making us stand a little longer than normal for the Gospel, these readings also lead us to recall and spiritually relive the most tragic occurrence of all time: the murder of God. The words of the Gospel narratives that recall this horrific episode make a deep impression upon the listener. Speaking

about the Passion narratives, G.K. Chesterton wrote, "The grinding power of the plain words of the Gospel story is like the power of millstones; and those who can read them simply enough will feel as if rocks had been rolled upon them... As the High Priest asked what further need he had of witnesses, we might well ask what further need we have of words."

Part of what makes these accounts so memorable is the inclusion of a large cast of secondary characters who have powerful interactions with Christ. Who can forget about the High Priest's slave whose ear was cut off, but was healed by Christ? Who can forget the part about Peter's betrayal? Who can forget the detail about Simon of Cyrene being forced to carry the cross against his will?

These vivid moments lead us to ask the question, "What would it be like to be Barabbas, chosen to go free instead of Jesus? What was it like to be the centurion who stabbed Jesus' side with a spear? (That centurion actually became a saint, and is my confirmation saint – St. Longinus!) In this way, the secondary characters are kind of like gateways by which we can step into the story ourselves and allow it to become more real for us.

One secondary character is only mentioned in the Passion Narrative of the Gospel of Luke, which we read this weekend, and that is the Good Thief. I would like to share two reflections that emerge from considering the perspective of the Good Thief.

- 1. The Good Thief must have been acutely aware that the timing of Jesus' death worked out very providentially for him. Because Jesus was crucified in that spot at that time, He happened to be there at the same time as the Good Thief, and if He had not been there, the Good Thief would probably have died unrepentant, and he certainly would not have heard the words, "This day you will be with Me in paradise." Jesus certainly died to save the whole world, but the Good Thief could hardly help feeling that there was a special way in which Jesus chose that time and that place so that He could save him singularly. Thus, the Good Thief represents the powerful truth that Jesus did not die to save a faceless mass of humanity. He died to save individuals, and that His death had the same degree of intentionality for you that it had for this thief.
- 2. The conversation between Jesus and the Good Thief occurs after a long string of mockery. First the Scribes and Pharisees mock Jesus as He hangs on the cross, then passers-by, then the Roman soldiers. The ultimate insult comes when even the other crucified criminal starts mocking Jesus. It is precisely at this moment that the Good Thief steps in, and by his words but even more importantly, by his repentance he offers comfort and succor to Jesus. The Good Thief made himself a friend of Jesus at exactly

the moment when Jesus was probably most mocked, scorned, and alone in His whole life. We too have the option of making ourselves friends of Jesus in His time of intense trial, and we do that by our reverent participation in the Sacred Triduum. By attending the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, by praying at the Altar of Repose on Holy Thursday night, by attending the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, by keeping a fast and a prayerful spirit during these sacred times running from Thursday night until Easter, and lastly by attending the Easter Vigil. All of these constitute a decision to walk alongside Jesus during His death and Resurrection. At every step of the way, we make ourselves His friends and bring Him consolation as He undertakes the labor of giving up His life to save our souls.

# GOOD FRIDAY: A DAY OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE:

- ◆ Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and every Friday during Lent.
- ◆ Every person between the **ages of 18 and 59** (beginning of 60th year) must **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When **fasting**, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are <u>not equal</u> to a full meal, according to Canon law & the U.S. Bishops.





# **DC Flashback - Church Dedication**

Dedication ceremonies were held at 10am on Saturday, June 22, 1963. The ceremony began with Archbishop John Francis Dearden blessing the exterior of the building, followed by a procession of 1,700 people entering the church, 300 of whom had to remain outside the building. The Altars were all consecrated the day before the dedication.

Assisting Archbishop Dearden were Msgr. Herbert F. Weier, Msgr. Carroll F. Deady, pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish in Plymouth, Associate Pastor Fr. Kucyk, and former Associate Pastors Fr. Maurice Decker and Fr. Charles Cushing.

Our church from our altar to the exit doors (not counting the gathering space) is a 107ft. long. In the front of the church, from side to side is 110ft. wide and in the rear, it is a 150ft. The capacity of the church is fifteen hundred and there are only twenty five rows of pews. This, of course, makes everybody as close as possible to the altar. The foundation took three months to build and is comprised of five tunnels that used to control the temperature of the building. The Marble on the walls were purchased from the vacant Kerns Department Store in Detroit and also from Italy via the Wolverine Marble Company.










Stations of the Cross came from Rome. They are unique, carved wooden Stations of the Cross. A friend of Msgr. Weier gave him \$5,000 to purchase them. A convert friend of Msgr. Weier, gave him \$6,000 to purchase the Pulpit, and the Marble Altar Railing was also donated to Msgr. Weier which also cost \$6,000. The Sacred Heart of Jesus and St. Anne wood statues, for the side altars, arrived in September of 1963 and were installed shortly after.

### It's not too late for you to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation






### **EASTER EDITION**

Many of us truly desire a stronger, more vibrant faith. To achieve this, we often consider how to "double down" on prayer or Mass attendance. But have you ever considered that a strong faith isn't so much about your own willpower but more about how you allow God to work in you? Giving God permission to heal you and operate through you is the classic response from the spiritual masters.

But what does that look like? How can we allow God to operate through us? We love. And one of the most loving things we can do is to share God (the best thing in the universe) with others. ### **Did You Know?**

Msgr. Weier wanted the name of our new church to be the Divine Infant of Prague, the Infant Jesus Parish, but Edward Cardinal Mooney, former Archbishop of Detroit, said no. He told Msgr. Weier, "You're an athlete. You're a ball player. You'll have ball teams." The other teams are going say, 'We are going to play the Infant Jesus' team and that isn't going to sound right." Because of the danger of irreverence of the Holy Name of Jesus, he told Msgr. Weier to pick out another name. And so he picked out the name Divine Child. The Cardinal okayed that.

### Sacred Heart/Divine Child Conference

As we approach the end of the season of Lent, many of us are reflecting on how the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving have impacted our lives. Perhaps we've experienced true growth or maybe we feel we've fallen short in our initial plans. Regardless of how we judge our Lenten promises, now is not the time to let down. Now is the time to recommit ourselves even more to growing as disciples of Jesus.

In one of his weekly updates in March, John Berry, national president of SVdP USA, wrote about recent changes in government funding that will directly impact so many of the neighbors that SVdP serves. Mr. Berry points to the recent U.S. Department of Agriculture's decision to eliminate \$1.5 billion in food purchase programs for schools and food banks. The elimination of these programs is creating a massive gap that nonprofit organizations like SVdP cannot possibly fill.

Many of those in leadership of these nonprofits are organizing to ask for a hearing from the USDA to share their perspectives and experiences in keeping our neighbors fed. As Vincentians know only too well, food insecurity can easily lead to homelessness. The working poor who struggle to feed their families may find themselves unable to pay next month's rent.

Our SVdP conference anticipates the number of those needing help will continue to grow in the near future. To respond to the increasing need of our neighbors, we are asking for your prayers and financial support. If your Lenten practices have deepened your understanding of our neighbors in need as our brothers and sisters in Christ, we are grateful for your donations. What extras are you willing to sacrifice so that we can help those less fortunate put food on the table?

As we prepare to celebrate our faith in the Resurrection of our Lord, may we recognize His Face in the faces of all those who need our help. May we be a source of hope for a better tomorrow.
