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### ***BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS***

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#### General Business, Board Reports

- Board Members shared information regarding committee reports and other community related activities.

#### Superintendent's Report

##### a) MUSD Update

- Dr. Hays reported on the following: all three preschool sites earned a 5-star rating from the VCOE, which is the highest possible rating through the California QRIS, she thanked the entire preschool staff for their tremendous work; details regarding the March in-person LCAP Parent Meeting; the MHS culinary arts class Iron Fork competition; and details regarding the MHS CTE product innovation & design class.

##### b) Wellness Center Update

- Dr. Wagmeister presented an update/additional information regarding the District's wellness centers, including: check-in procedures, times of visits, check-out procedures, reasons for visits; coping strategies; and statistics regarding average visits.
