Dr. Cunningham stated the following:

This initiative has profoundly impacted student motivation, attendance, and academic performance across Thornton Township High School District 205.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

The Pyramid of Success: Purpose and Vision

Our mission as educators is to teach, inspire, and empower students to reach their full potential. The Pyramid of Success was designed with this in mind—to create an incentive-based system that encourages students to improve their attendance and academic performance. Through a structured tier system, students are given realistic goals to visualize their growth while being rewarded for their achievements.

The Student Board of Education took the lead in developing this system, ensuring

that it reflected the needs and desires of their peers. The committee gathered student input through surveys and data collection to determine the most effective incentives, leading to an engaging and impactful model. This has been completed over multiple years.

Motivation: The Key to Student Success

At the core of the **Pyramid of Success** lies a deep understanding of motivation. The system taps into both **intrinsic and extrinsic motivation** to encourage student progress:

- Intrinsic Motivation Students feel a sense of accomplishment and pride when they improve their academic performance and attendance.
- Extrinsic Motivation Meaningful incentives such as monetary prizes, edible rewards, and parental recognition provide immediate reinforcement and encourage continued success.

By integrating these motivational strategies, we are improving student engagement and instilling lifelong habits of discipline and perseverance.

The Student Board's Process and Implementation

The Student Board of Education's Superintendent's Special Committee has worked diligently since 2021 to refine and implement this system. Their process included:

- 1. **Developing a tiered structure** that categorizes students based on attendance and academic performance:
 - Exemplary (Straight A's, 0 unexcused absences)
 - **Honorary** (A's & B's, max 0.5 unexcused absences)
 - Satisfactory (A's, B's, up to two C's, max 1 unexcused absence)
 - Standard (More than two C's, D's, or below, more than 1 unexcused absence)
- 2. Collecting student feedback through surveys to determine the most effective incentives.
- 3. Launching a comprehensive rollout plan, ensuring parents, students, and faculty were well-informed through emails, orientations, class meetings, student handbooks, flyers, and posters across all three schools.
- 4. **Quarterly evaluations** where students receive placement notifications in their English classes.
- 5. Public recognition and reward distribution at honor roll assemblies, through mailed certificates, and tier-based incentives such as gift cards, concession stand coupons, and special events.

This Year's Skating Party and Student Feedback

One of the most anticipated incentives for students who achieved the highest tier was the 1st annual skating party that was held on February 26, 2025, at the Lynwood Roller Rink. This event celebrated student achievement and motivated continued effort. The recent skating party was met with overwhelmingly positive feedback, with students expressing high satisfaction levels.

• Survey Results:

- o 36 out of 39 students rated their experience 4 or above on a satisfaction scale.
- Students suggested expanding reward options to include arcades,
 museums, and Six Flags as potential future incentives.
- Chaperone and Staff Observations:
 - o Students were well-behaved and respectful, receiving positive remarks from the skating rink staff.
 - Minimal cleanup was required, demonstrating a sense of responsibility among the students.

This event showcased the **power of positive reinforcement**—rewarding students for their efforts in a way that is both fun and meaningful.

Next Steps and Continuous Improvement

While the **Pyramid of Success** has been a resounding success, we recognize that **continuous improvement** is necessary. The committee is committed to:

- 1. Expanding incentive options based on student feedback.
- 2. Refining attendance tracking processes to ensure fair and accurate tier placements.
- 3. Strengthening communication efforts with parents and faculty to maximize student engagement.
- 4. Exploring additional long-term benefits, such as scholarships or community-based rewards, to further incentivize academic excellence.

Final Thoughts

The **Pyramid of Success** is more than just an incentive system; it is a **cultural shift** toward academic excellence and student accountability. Through student-led initiatives, evidence-based motivation strategies, and strong administrative support, we are creating an environment where **every student is encouraged to succeed**.

I want to commend the **Student Board of Education's Superintendent's Special Committee** for its dedication, innovation, and leadership in making this initiative a reality. Their work benefits students today and sets a **foundation for future generations** in District 205.
