OF GULF SHORES CITY SCHOOLS



A Letter from Kevin Corcoran Gulf Shores School Board President

Greetings Dolphin family! As a founding member of the Gulf Shores City Schools Board of Education and the current president, it's hard for me to believe we're entering our 6th year as Gulf Shores City Schools. What an incredible journey! The success our administration, faculty, and staff have achieved in such a short time is truly remarkable.

When Dr. Harrison asked me to reflect on the journey that began nearly nine years ago, I gladly accepted.

In June 2015, mayors from the 9 major cities in Baldwin County were asked to appoint members to a Community Advisory Task Force for education. Mayor Craft appointed Doug Warren and me, and I was honored to serve as chairman.

By October, we presented 19 recommendations to the Baldwin County Board of Education (BCBE).

Later that year, Mayor Craft asked us to narrow our focus to the island's education concerns. We worked hard to develop a plan to improve education from Fort Morgan to Ono Island. After months of hard work, we realized forming a multi-municipal school system wasn't feasible due to Alabama's state constitution.

During this time, BCBE projected island high school enrollment would drop to 739 by 2026, which pushed us to take ownership of the future of education for our children. Today, Gulf Shores High School's enrollment is over 900.



In 2017, we held eight meetings across the city with over 200 Gulf Shores residents, presenting the facts. A survey revealed that 95% were dissatisfied with academic standards, and 97.5% rated our facilities as below average or unacceptable. Action was needed.

That summer, concerned citizens packed city hall, urging the Mayor and City Council to explore forming Gulf Shores City Schools. A petition with 200+ signatures and \$12,000 for a feasibility study was presented. Mayor Craft and the council listened and took action! They engaged the Public Affairs Research Council of Alabama (PARCA) to conduct an economic feasibility study. The results suggested that with current funding levels, the city could form and operate an independent city school district.

On October 9, 2017, the City of Gulf Shores mayor and council adopted and approved resolution #5876-17 thus establishing Gulf Shores City Schools! In November of 2017, the inaugural Gulf Shores City Board of Education was formed and appointed.

Then began the hard work! A team of consultants was formed to perform the arduous task of the first ever city school separation in Baldwin County. Let's just say the process was lengthy, complicated and frustrating. After 15 months of deliberation, an 18-page Separation Agreement was executed by both parties on March 21, 2019. It ordered the official start date of Gulf Shores City Schools to be June 1, 2019. Oh boy was the end result worth it!

Gulf Shores, the REALLY hard work began; we had to get these schools ready to accept students in August for the first "First Day!" A dedicated team of city employees, architects, engineers, and contractors completed over \$8,000,000 in city-funded repairs, upgrades, and improvements in just over two months. As evidenced by the accompanying photos, the results were outstanding. That investment has grown to over \$30 million in improvements to our existing campuses!

I am going to leave the "look where we are now" portion of the story to others. Just know if you love Gulf Shores City Schools as much as we do, you are forever indebted to Mayor Robert Craft, Mayor Pro-Tem Philip Harris, Dr. Jason Dyken, Steve Jones, Joe Garris and Gary

dreaming about what could be!



U.S. SECRETARY OF EDUCATION NAMES GULF SHORES CITY SCHOOLS A U.S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION GREEN RIBBON SCHOOL DISTRICT

Enthusiasm was buzzing in Gulf Shores during the 2023-2024 school year when the U.S. Department of Education announced that Gulf Shores City Schools was 1 of 11 school districts in the country to be named a U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon School District. Gulf Shores City Schools was the only school district in the southeastern United States to win the district award.

The U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Award recognizes schools, districts, and higher education institutions that nurture and promote environmental, health, and sustainability education and practices. This includes demonstrating responsible stewardship of natural resources, promoting the safety and wellness of children and adults, and encouraging an appreciation of our natural heritage. Assistant Superintendent Dr. Stephanie Harrison said, "Our outdoor science education program, Science by the Shore, as well as our innovative STEAM programs provide opportunities for students to engage with the environment so that they are equipped to appreciate and care for our rich natural resources.

The award focuses on the following pillars:

• Pillar I:

Reducing environmental impact and costs

Pillar II:

Improving the health and wellness of students and staff

Pillar III:

Providing effective environmental and sustainability education, incorporating STEM, civic skills, and green career pathways

From its inception, Gulf Shores City Schools established a set of core values that correlates with the standards of U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools: "to provide engaging learning environments, rigorous academics, and to incorporate unique resources of our community to empower all students to achieve success." School Board President Kevin Corcoran said, "The district's Core Values will shape the future of our environment, our commitment to innovation, and our local community for generations to come."



Notable environmental sustainability education projects completed by Gulf Shores City Schools include:

- Schneider Electric partnership to replace lighting and air conditioning systems and improve air quality, as well as the installation of solar features that are tied into the power grid to help reduce energy use.
- New STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) building at Gulf Shores Elementary School that includes multiple aquariums and a rain barrel to irrigate the nearby garden, as well as space for robotics and drone flight lessons.
- Gulf Shores High School Farm-to-Table Program.
- Upgraded transportation program with half of the school bus fleet replaced with ultra-low sulfur, clean diesel engine models, reducing carbon emissions by 89.5%.
- Developed and implemented Science by the Shore, a system-wide outdoor, place-based science education program.



- All schools have gardening programs and outdoor classrooms.
- Comprehensive recycling efforts, composting, and water conservation.
- Partnership with Center for Ecotourism, including a school visit from Jean-Michel Cousteau.
- Active wellness, nutrition, and mental health committees to support physical and mental health of students and staff.

FIRST FLIGHT

For the last two years, students in the Gulf Shores High School Aviation Academy have been building a two-seater Van's RV-7 airplane, and during the spring, it received FAA approval. School officials and students celebrated this unique accomplishment by hosting a "First Flight" event with Alabama State Superintendent of Education, Dr. Eric Mackey, taking the first public flight in the newly built plane.

The Gulf Shores High School Aviation Academy is open to all high school students and includes courses in the mechanics of flight, aerospace engineering, and aircraft maintenance. Students in the academy can also earn their drone pilot certification and prepare for the written exam of the FAA private pilot license.

Aviation Academy Instructor Haley Kellogg is a former Gulf Shores High School student who went on to become a commercial pilot. Upon returning to Gulf Shores, Mrs. Kellogg joined the Gulf Shores High School faculty with a passion for inspiring students, particularly young women, to pursue a career in aviation. Most of the courses that

Mrs. Kellogg teaches meet at the hangar labs at Gulf Shores International Airport at Jack Edwards Field. She immerses students in hands-on learning activities, ensuring that academic content is seamlessly connected to real-world career experiences.

Local expert residents who are passionate about aviation as well as organizations including Gulf Air Center, Gulf Shores International Airport, and Aeropro provide generous and ongoing support for students and the aviation program.






The dedication to the arts is also commendable. Band, choral, art, and theatre students will hone their skills in dedicated spaces connected to an advanced visual and performing arts center including a costume design lab, a set production workshop, a greenroom, and an auditorium. These facilities will not only enhance students' creative abilities but also serve as venues for school and community events, fostering a sense of community engagement and pride.





Furthermore, the provision of a Dolphin athletics center equipped with advanced training facilities, two gymnasiums, tiered meeting rooms, and a covered practice pavilion underscores the importance of physical health and extracurricular activities in a well-rounded education. By offering top-notch amenities for athletes, the school ensures that students have opportunities to excel both academically and athletically.

The new Gulf Shores High School will accommodate 1,000 students with the opportunity for future expansion. Construction of the 287,000 square foot building is already underway in anticipation of welcoming students to the new campus in the 2026-2027 school year. The project is being led by an awardwinning project team that includes architects Goodwyn Mills Cawood (GMC) and DLR Group as well as Rabren General Contractors for construction and Volkert, Inc. as the program manager. With such expertise involved, there's confidence that the new Gulf Shores High School will meet and exceed expectations, providing a transformative educational experience for generations to come.








EMPLOYEE AND STUDENT GROWTH 2019-2025








FISCAL YEAR 2024 REVENUES
