District Accountability Committee (Farah)

- DAC February Meeting was on February 4th
- Farah attended the Parent Engagement subcommittee meeting

- Charter Application update: The application for Grove Elementary School in Bal Swan

#### **Review Family Survey Results**

Tracy Durland presented the survey completion results:

(522 students were represented in completed surveys = 36%) This is lower than our goal of 60%. Tracy administered a Popup Survey during the next Weekly Digest and presented the following results:

Yes, took the survey	155
No, did not	141
Forgot	57
Overall Happy	33
Survey too long	11
Started but didn't finish	9
Other	31

Tracy Durland presented the amount of time survey respondents took to complete the survey. 63% took 10 minutes or less. Two respondents completed the survey in Spanish, eight attempted the survey in Spanish, but only two completed the survey. We did have a larger than typical number of respondents abandon the survey before completing, approximately 15%.

Cathy presented the preliminary comment themes based on survey results. The Family Survey Report will have four major themes for the Board and ELT to address:

- 1. Facilities and Operations
- 2. General Communication
- 3. Instruction and Testing
- 4. School Climate

Recommendations for next year:

- Shorten survey or divide survey into multiple smaller surveys
- Add a progress bar that is more clear on how much survey is left to complete
- Add video content in the Executive Response in the fall.

The Comment Theme Subcommittee could not agree if Athletics should be included as a major theme, it did warrant a number of concerns and is listed at the top of the *Needs Improvement* category. Jennie Klein and Tracy Durland mentioned that leadership was addressing this concern in a number of ways, including a recent Focus Group. We decided that Athletics would not be listed as a major theme in this year's report but would be addressed under *Does Well/Needs Improvement*.

Q: Since the Accountability Committee Chair will be presenting to the Board of Directors on April 2nd, before our next meeting on April 7th, is it possible for the Committee to vote by email to approve the final report document around March 14th?

A: Yes, that will be acceptable.

### Mid-year Academic Review

Jennie Klein presented the standardized testing results from Middle of the Year (MOY).

- Elementary uses I-Ready, Middle uses CommonLit and Star Math, High uses CommonLit.
- Leadership is very pleased with the results, academic performance is treading up and mid-year assessment indicators all met or exceeded expectations for grade level.

#### Miscellaneous

Q: Drew noticed that Peak to Peak had not been awarded a E470 grant for prom expenses, why?

A: Update via Rachel Hirt: The E470 grant is lottery based, Peak to Peak applied but was not awarded.
