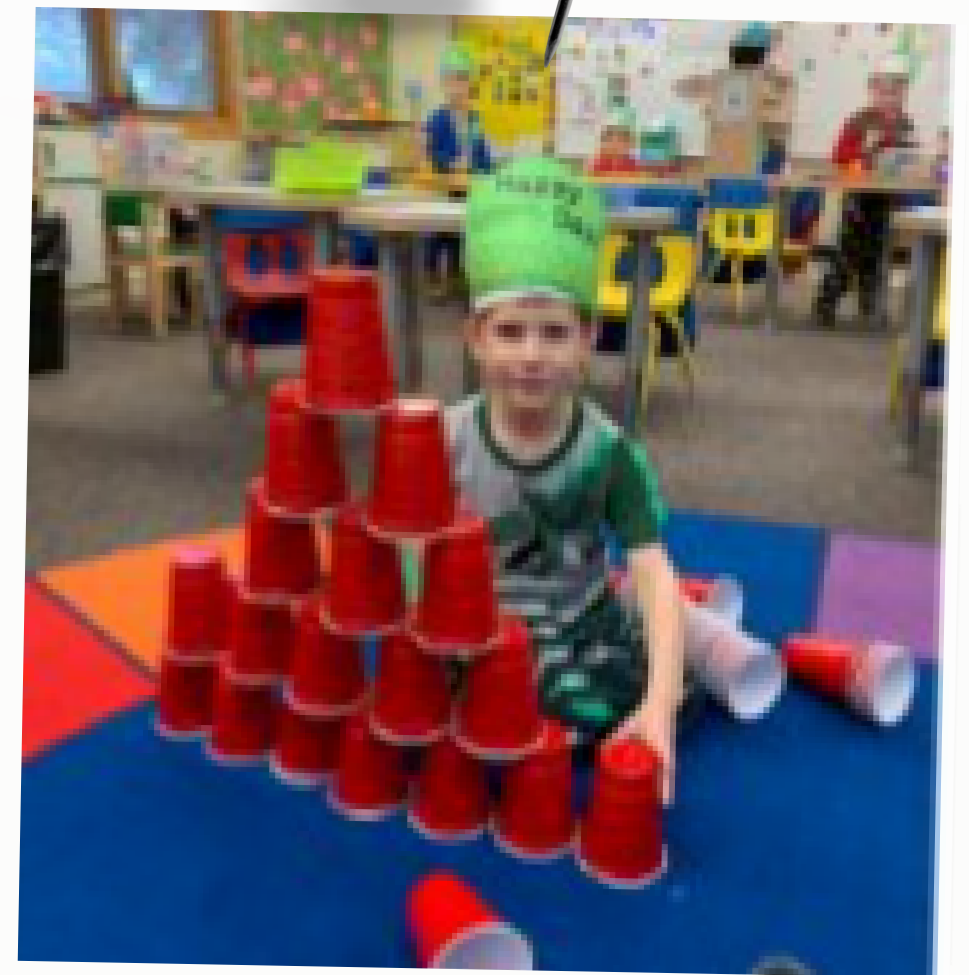

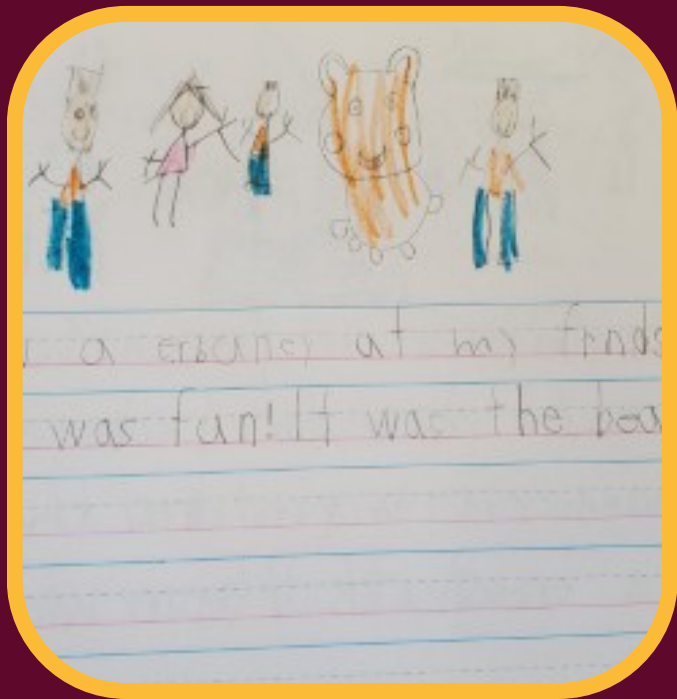

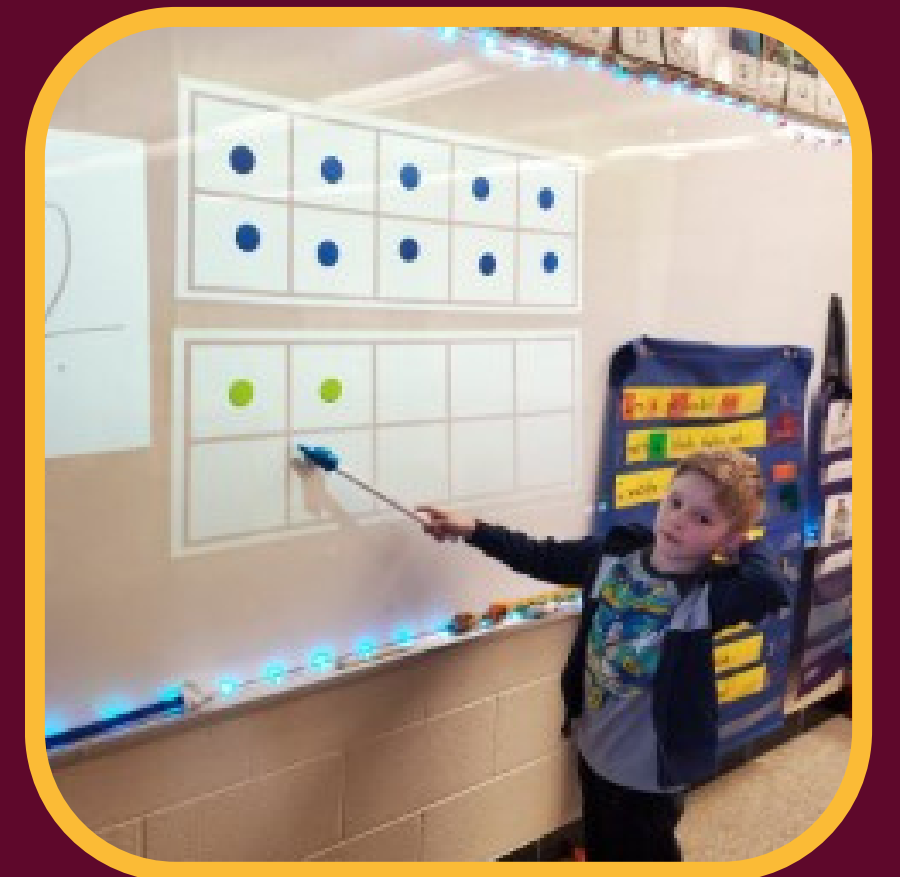

- Open containers in my lunch



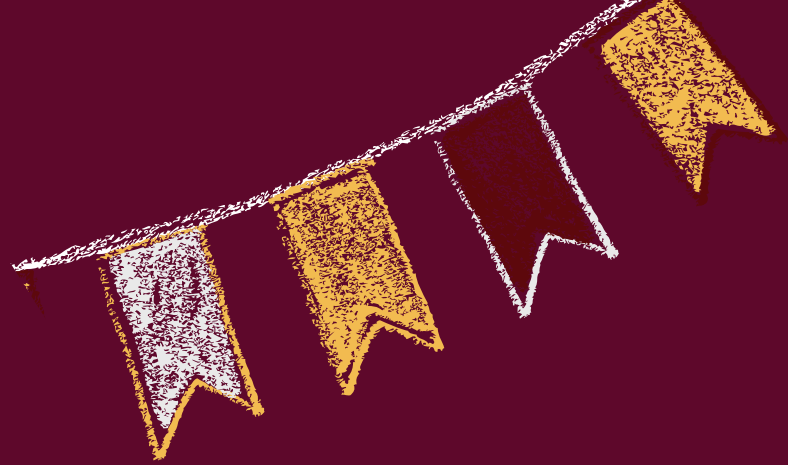
Academic Kindergarten Readiness

I can:

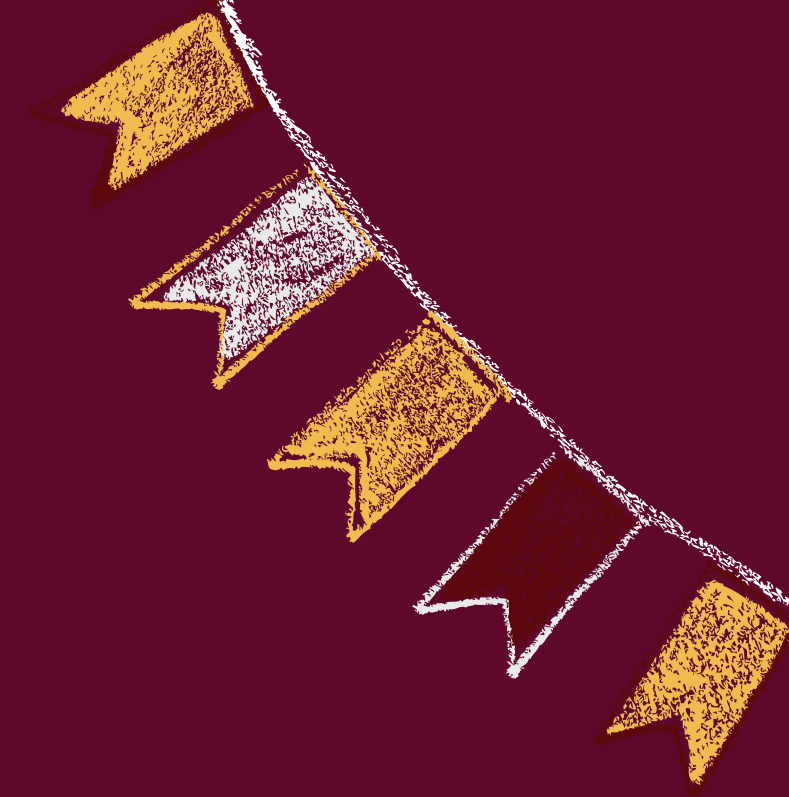
- Read and write my name

- Sort items by color, size, and shape



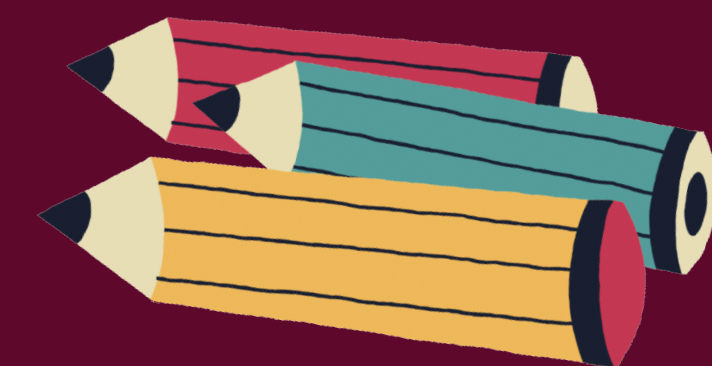

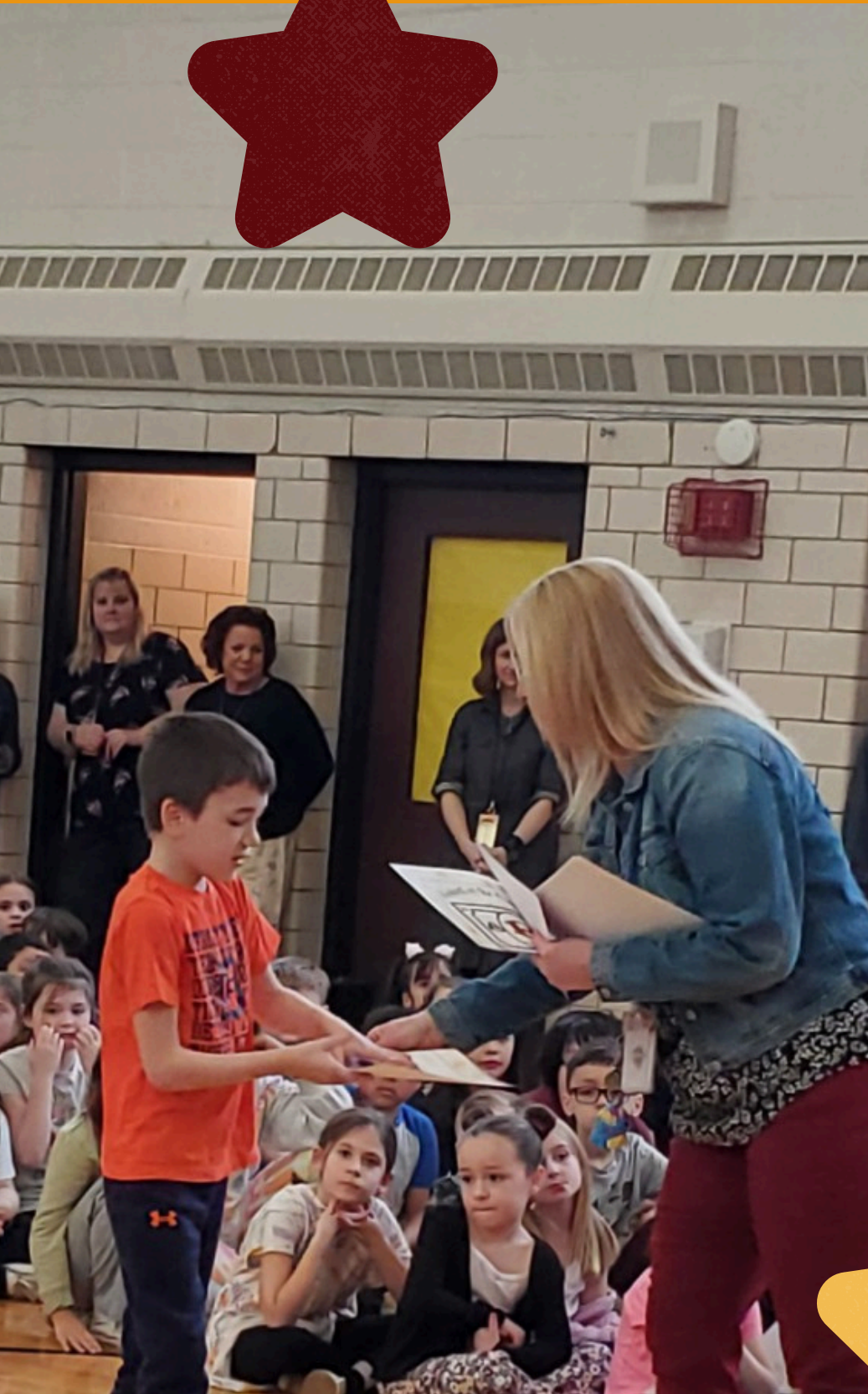

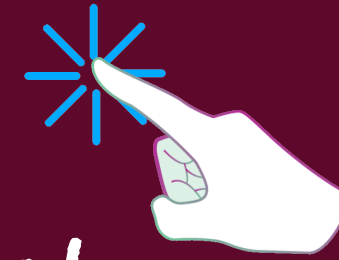

2024-2025 Kindergarten and Young 5's Enrollment Information

Riverview Community Schools offers full-day kindergarten and Young 5's classes. We provide a well-rounded curriculum in language arts, math, science, STEAM, and physical education.

To be eligible to enroll, students must be five years of age on or before September 1, 2024. Waivers are available for those who are ready for Young 5's or kindergarten and they will be five on or before December 1, 2024. Detailed enrollment information and requirements are linked below.
