ROBBINSDALE Statewide Funding Challenges





We Are Not Alone

Rdale's \$21 million shortfall is part of a much larger trend across Minnesota.

- Association of Metropolitan School Districts (AMSD) districts (50+) project \$280M+ in shortfalls for 2025–26
- Rising costs + unfunded mandates are straining school budgets across Minnesota
- 23 districts will see current shortfalls grow because of cuts under the Governor's proposed budget

- Larger class sizes in many schools
- Reductions in staffing across the district
- Service model changes in multiple areas





Larger Class Sizes and Reductions in Staffing

- Fewer FTE allocation to buildings with principals making difficult decisions:
 - Security EAs will remain with fewer FTE
 - Counselors and Media Specialists impacted by FTE allocation and decisions of principals
- Seven multi-age classrooms at the elementary level

Service Model Changes

- Health Services being restructured

- Center-based classrooms
 - Staffed to ratio in the teacher contract
 - Assessing locations

Middle Schools: 0.7 mile to 1.0 mile

High Schools: 1.0 mile remains 1.0 mile

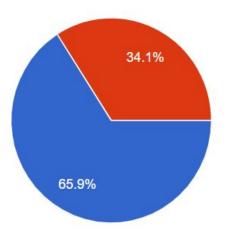


Walk Zone Changes

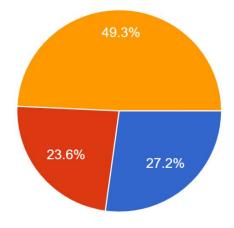

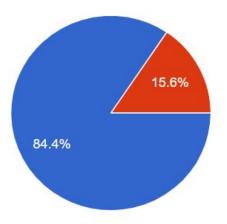

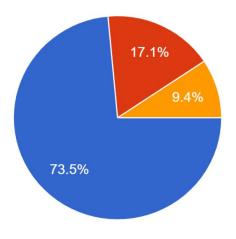

Bell times for 25-26: Please choose the option that would work best for you/your student. 374 responses

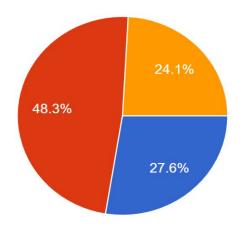

Bell times for 25-26: Please choose the option that would work best for you/your student. ²⁹ responses



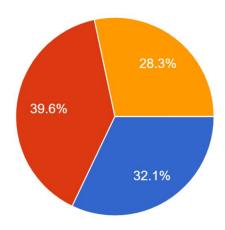
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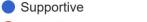

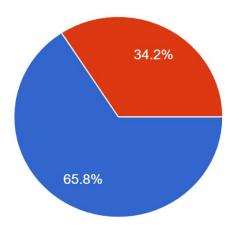
