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Superintendent update . . .

The Tri-Valley Local Schools Board of Education appointed Mr. Kirk Henderson as the next Superintendent on Thursday, February 13, 2025 at the Board of Education meeting. Mr. Kirk Henderson will become superintendent effective August 1, 2025.

Mr. Henderson surfaced as the top candidate for the job based on his extensive background in school leadership, his ability to connect with individual stakeholders, and his clear passion for serving the students, staff, and community of Tri-Valley Local Schools. According to Board president, Mr. Scott Ford, "Mr. Henderson's experience and professionalism set him apart with the different stakeholder groups of the district and we feel he is going to be a great fit here at Tri-Valley. We are excited for the future!"

Mr. Henderson is an experienced educational leader. He started his administrative career as an assistant middle school principal at Teays Valley Middle School and then at Canal Winchester High School. He assumed the head principal position at Canal Winchester High School and served in that role for a decade. He is currently the assistant superintendent of Circleville City Schools, overseeing day-to-day operations of the school district. Mr. Henderson holds a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education from The Ohio State University, a certificate in Learning Disabilities from Capital University, and a Master of Education from Ashland University.

Mr. Henderson and his wife Jenny are the proud parents of five children, Marissa, Kelly, Amanda, Jimmy and Mya and eight grandchildren. In addition to spending time with his family, Mr. Henderson enjoys the occasional golf outing with his sons-in-law.

In Mr. Henderson's words, "I'm excited to move into the district and start getting to know the people in the Tri-Valley family."

Mr. Henderson is eager to begin his transition as superintendent and plans to be visible in the district over the coming months prior to his official start date of August 1, 2025.

The Works

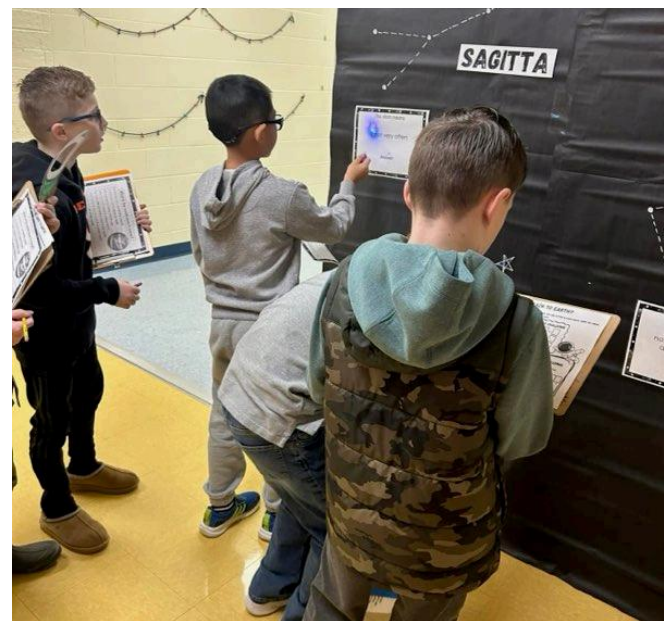

Yearly, the Middle School art students are super talented, however this year, Art teacher Amity Ryan, had so many incredible pieces that she took it all! The Middle School students loved the Chihuly art sculpture artwork, and went above and beyond creating fantastic sculptures and received many compliments, as these are always a crowd favorite. Another favorite were the yarn art projects. Not only were they a crowd favorite, the students loved them as well! Another fantastic result this year were the realism drawings, 8th graders did people, and 7th graders did animals. Both grades rose to the challenge producing picturesque artwork. Mrs. Ryan was approached by many parents, family members, and friends complementing the art displays, to say she is proud of her students is an understatement!

Adamsville and Dresden Elementaries displayed artwork from 1st Grade, 3rd Grade, 5th and 6th Grade. 6th graders displayed their ceramics and famous portraits, 5th grade displayed their clay food projects and digital collages, 3rd grade displayed their 3D Ice Cream or Popcorn as well as works on paper, 1st grade displayed mixed media projects and works on paper. 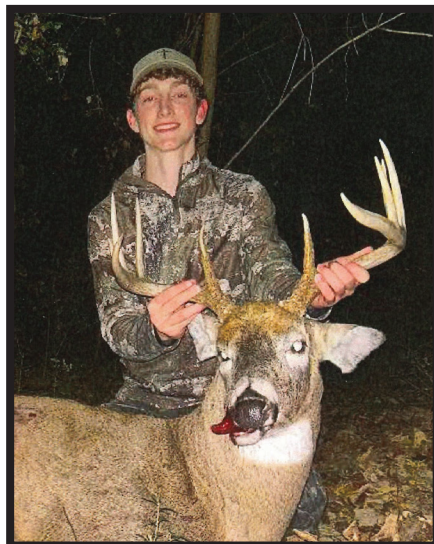

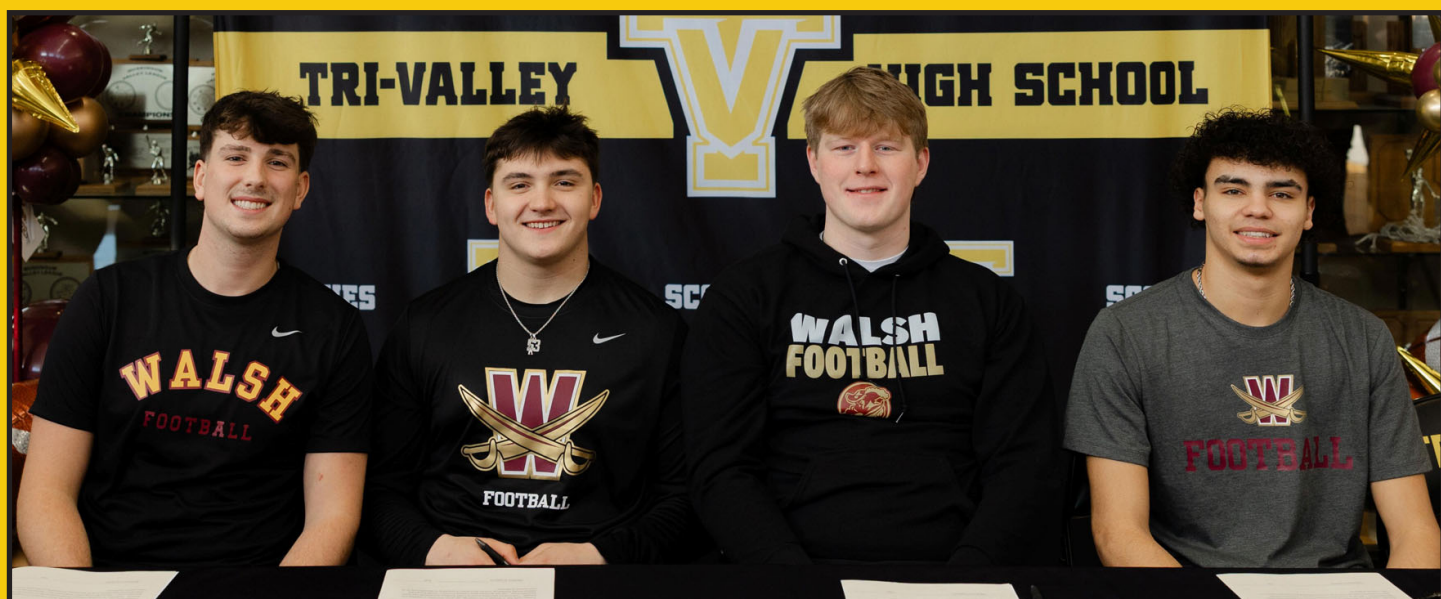

Immunizations Required for Incoming Kindergarten Students

- 5 doses **DTaP** vaccine
- 4 doses **Polio** vaccine
- 3 doses **Hepatitis B** vaccine
- 2 doses **MMR** vaccine
- 2 doses **Varicella/Chicken Pox** vaccine

Immunizations Required for Incoming 7th Grade Students

If your child is currently up to date on all immunizations he/she will need 2 vaccinations prior to beginning 7th gr.

- 1 dose **Tdap** vaccine
- 1 dose **Meningococcal** vaccine

Immunizations Required for Incoming 12th Grade Students

If your child is currently up-to-date on all immunizations, he/she will need a second dose of the **Meningococcal** Vaccine prior to beginning 12th Grade.

(Note: If the first dose of the Meningococcal Vaccine was administered after the child's 16th birthday, only one dose is required).

Please provide updated immunization records to the school immediately following the appointment. **DO NOT** wait until the beginning of the school year.

Students who have not presented proof of vaccination may be excluded from attending school.



A Search for All Children with Disabilities

Every school district has the responsibility of seeking out and identifying children in need of special education services. Although school-age children are identified through each building's intervention assistance team and referral process, parents of children not yet enrolled, who reside within the Tri-Valley Local Schools boundaries, may not be aware that services are available.

What does a disability mean:

For ages birth to 3: an established condition known to result in delay or a developmental delay.

For ages 3-5: a documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas:

- communication
- vision
- hearing
- motor skills
- self-help skills
- cognitive skills
- social/emotional/behavioral functioning

For ages 5-21: identification of one of more of the following conditions

- autism
- hearing impairment including deafness
- intellectual disability
- multiple disabilities
- orthopedic impairment
- other health impairment
- emotional disturbance
- specific learning disabilities
- speech or language impairment
- traumatic brain injury
- visual impairment including blindness
