## Dear AP Exam Student,

This letter is sent to you because you registered for one or more AP exam(s) this year. If you have any questions or concerns, see Dr. Carrillo immediately. Below is important information regarding your registration and exam(s).

All AP exams have been ordered, and you will be responsible for either taking the exam(s) or paying an additional \$40.00 fee for each returned exam if you do not take the exam. The \$40.00 obligation fee must be paid before graduation if you are a graduating senior.

All AP exams will be taken at Lanier High School. Students will receive notice before the exam as to the exact room location. You must arrive no later than 30 minutes before your exam: Arrive at 7 a.m. for the morning administration, and at 11:15 a.m. for the afternoon administration. Students <u>may not</u> be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. If you play a sport or have a job, you must inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly. Afternoon exams will not be over by the 2:10 dismissal bell, so please plan your transportation accordingly.

Whether registered for a morning or an afternoon exam, you will be excused for the entire day.

Please read the following information carefully for exam day instructions:

## You <u>should</u> bring the following items to the exam room:

- <u>A government-issued or school-issued photo ID.</u>
- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets (hybrid exams).
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions (hybrid exams).
- Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. (Visit <u>https://apcentral.collegeboard.org/exam-administration-ordering-scores/administering-exams/on-exam-day/calculator-policy</u> to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams, and for a list of authorized calculators.)
- A ruler or straightedge only if you are taking an AP Physics Exam. (Protractors are not allowed.)

## You <u>should NOT</u> bring the following to the exam room:

- NO Electronic equipment: (phones, fitness tracker, tablet computer, etc.), portable listening or recording devices (MP3 player, iPod, etc.), cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the Internet, and any other electronic or communication devices.
- Unapproved aids: Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper
- Computers or calculators (except as noted above).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm, or smartwatches.
- Clothing with subject-related information.

You must abide by the policies of the College Board and Lanier High School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score. If you decide not to take an exam, please inform me as soon as possible before the test administration.
