
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Pi in the Petals: Spring's Mathematical Bloom

WEEK OF PI- TASTIC FUN!

The festivities kicked off on Monday with a Paint and Sip activity in the breezeway. Students unleashed their artistic side by painting the Pi symbol on mini canvases, which were later combined into one creative masterpiece. On Tuesday, the competition heated up with the highly anticipated Pi Eating Contest. Teachers and students went head-to-head, racing to finish an entire pie-hands-free! With enthusiastic cheers from the crowd, the winner earned a special pie trophy and prize for their efforts.



By **Wednesday**, it was time for some athletics, as students and teachers faced off in a 3-Point Shootout Contest in the gym. With only 31.4 seconds on the clock (a nod to Pi's decimal form), participants took their best shots, aiming to make as many three-pointers as possible before time ran out.


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Foreign Language Week






