Purpose	In light of the recent rise in Fentanyl overdoses, SBCUSD is working to ensure we have the necessary staff trained and supplies on hand to support this potentially life saving process.  Additionally, we want to ensure all students in middle school and high schools across the district receive our prevention/awareness lesson to ensure they are informed of fentanyl and the dangers of its usage.
<b>Prevention &amp; Awareness Building:</b> Provide all middle and high school students with a Fentanyl prevention lesson, including: what Fentanyl may look like; where it can be found; the dangers of its usage; and what to look for in peers that may be suffering from an opioid overdose.	
Fentanyl Prevention Lesson	The SWSS staff have prepared the Fentanyl Prevention and Awareness Building Lesson for staff to utilize.  All middle and high school students will receive this lesson before Thanksgiving Break.  The resources includes a lesson plan and a presentation to guide the full class lesson, including:  A student level video  Processing discussion questions facilitated in a Community Building Circle or class discussion
