From Leonardo DaVinci to Florence Nightingale and from Helen Keller to Martin Luther King Jr., the Living Wax Museum, presented Wednesday at Lincoln Elementary School, will take visitors on a journey through time to learn about individuals who made a major impact on society.

As guests press a button to bring the living wax statue to life, Lincoln's fifth graders will dress up in a costume and props to embody their chosen historical figure to give a speech about their life.
