Little Free Libraries-Update

We are excited to share about the new Little Free Libraries that have launched, thanks to grant funding, and the incredible work and dedication of the South-Central Early Learning Hub's Family Governance Advisory Committee. Their thoughtful efforts in writing and submitting a successful grant made it possible to implement the Little Free Libraries across our region. We now have five locations in Douglas County, three in Klamath County (with one more to be placed soon!), and two in Lake County (with one more to be placed soon).

Thanks to their commitment and vision, families now have greater access to books and resources in areas that largely did not have access in the past. These books support early literacy and a love of reading in our communities, bringing books that celebrate diversity to our region. These unique libraries offer a curated collection of multi-cultural and multi-lingual children's books, carefully selected to be age-appropriate and reflective of a wide range of cultures and backgrounds. Designed to promote inclusivity, these libraries aim to foster a love of reading and learning while helping children from all walks of life see themselves represented in the stories they read.

Apply for Preschool Promise Today!

Enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year is now open in Douglas, Klamath, and Lake counties!



About the Program:

The South-Central Early Learning Hub accepts applications for Preschool Promise year-round. Eligible students must turn 3 or 4 by September 1st of the school year the applicant is applying for, are residents of Oregon, and have a family income of up to 200% of Federal Poverty Level. We encourage families who think they might be over income to apply. Preschool Promise is accepting applications for the 24-25 and 25-26 school year now.



Requirements:

- Family must reside in Oregon
- Family income must be at or below 200% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) -*some exceptions may apply
- Children must be 3 or 4-years-old by Sept. 1 of the school year the applicant is applying for
