Counselor Corner


Executive functioning skills are the basis for planning, organizing, initiating, and following through with all tasks, assignments, and problems inside and outside of school. This week's Cowboy TV lessons specifically focused on time management, but children need to regularly use all of the executive functioning skills at school. In their extensive work in the field, Peg Dawson and Richard Guare termed 11 executive functioning subskills: response inhibition, working memory, emotional control, flexibility, sustained attention, task initiation, planning/prioritizing, organization, time management, goal-directed persistence, and metacognition. These skills need to be taught and developed both inside and outside of school; however, we also need to give ourselves and our children grace, as some of these skills are not fully developed until the age of 25! This document gives a brief definition of each of the executive functioning skills described in a slightly different way than Dawson and Guare did.
