





Register now to receive \$20 athletic physicals



Volunteer to mentor a Brewer High School student through new Mentors Care program

Brewer High School will partner with Mentors Care during the 2025-26 school year to serve 75 at-promise students at BHS. Mentors will commit 1 hour a week to work with their student.

Mentors must undergo a criminal history background check and complete a 2-hour, in-person training with the Mentors Care team. The organization will provide talking points for the weekly meetings.
