Summer Reading Project for Incoming Freshmen

Due Date: The first full day of school

Objective: To encourage critical thinking, comprehension, and creativity through a summer reading assignment that will be discussed and utilized in the first few weeks of school.

Instructions:

- 1. Book Selection Guidelines:
 - Students may choose any book that meets the following criteria:
 - Must be a fiction or nonfiction book appropriate for high school-level reading.
 - Must be at least 150 pages in length.
 - The book must be **new to you**—no re-reading books you've already studied in school.
 - If unsure about a book choice, get approval from the teacher.

- 2. **Read Actively** Take notes on key themes, characters, and significant passages that resonate with you.
- 3. Complete One of the Following Projects:
 - Creative Response: Create a visual representation (poster, collage, or digital artwork) that illustrates a key theme or major moment from the book.
 - **Written Response:** Write a two-page reflection discussing the book's themes, characters, and how it relates to your personal experiences or current events.
 - Character Diary: Write three journal entries from the perspective of a main character, capturing their emotions and thoughts at different points in the story.
 - Book Soundtrack: Create a five-song playlist that represents key moments or themes from the book. Write a brief explanation for each song choice.

Assessment: Projects will be graded based on creativity, effort, depth of analysis, and adherence to the instructions.

Discussion: Be prepared to discuss your book and project in small groups during the first week of school.
