- ▶ Suffolk districts include Babylon, Brentwood, Harborfields, Lindenhurst, Longwood, North Babylon, Sayville, Smithtown, West Babylon

 - Migration from grade to grade
 - Birth Persistence Analysis
- ▶ Facilities
 - Tours of each facility
 - Programmatic considerations
 - Floor Plans examined – square footage reviewed
 - Capacity developed

- Tours of The Early Childhood Center were conducted and floor plans and square footage were examined
- A rough capacity was developed
- However, for the purposes of this presentation it is not included in the analysis

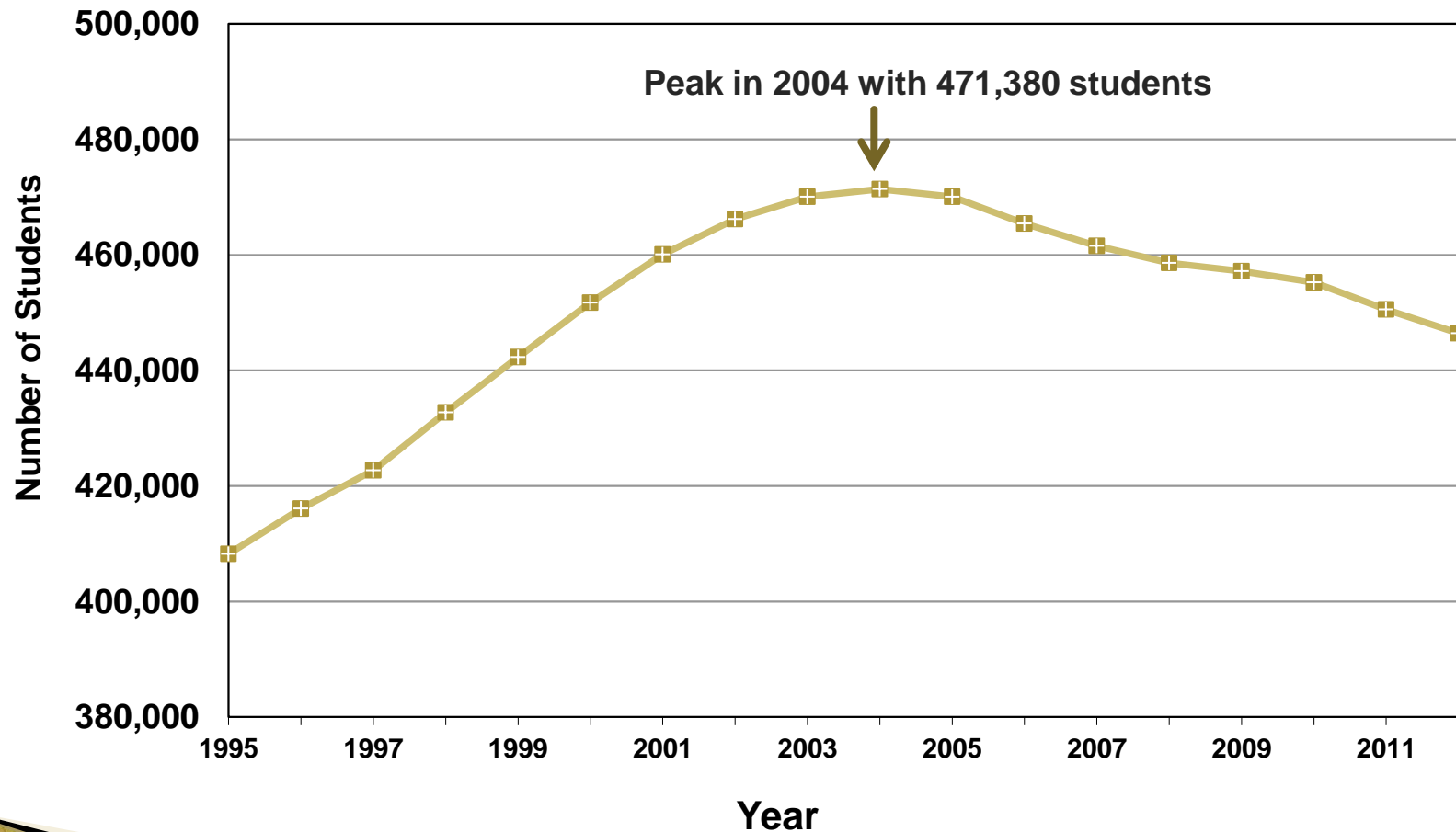

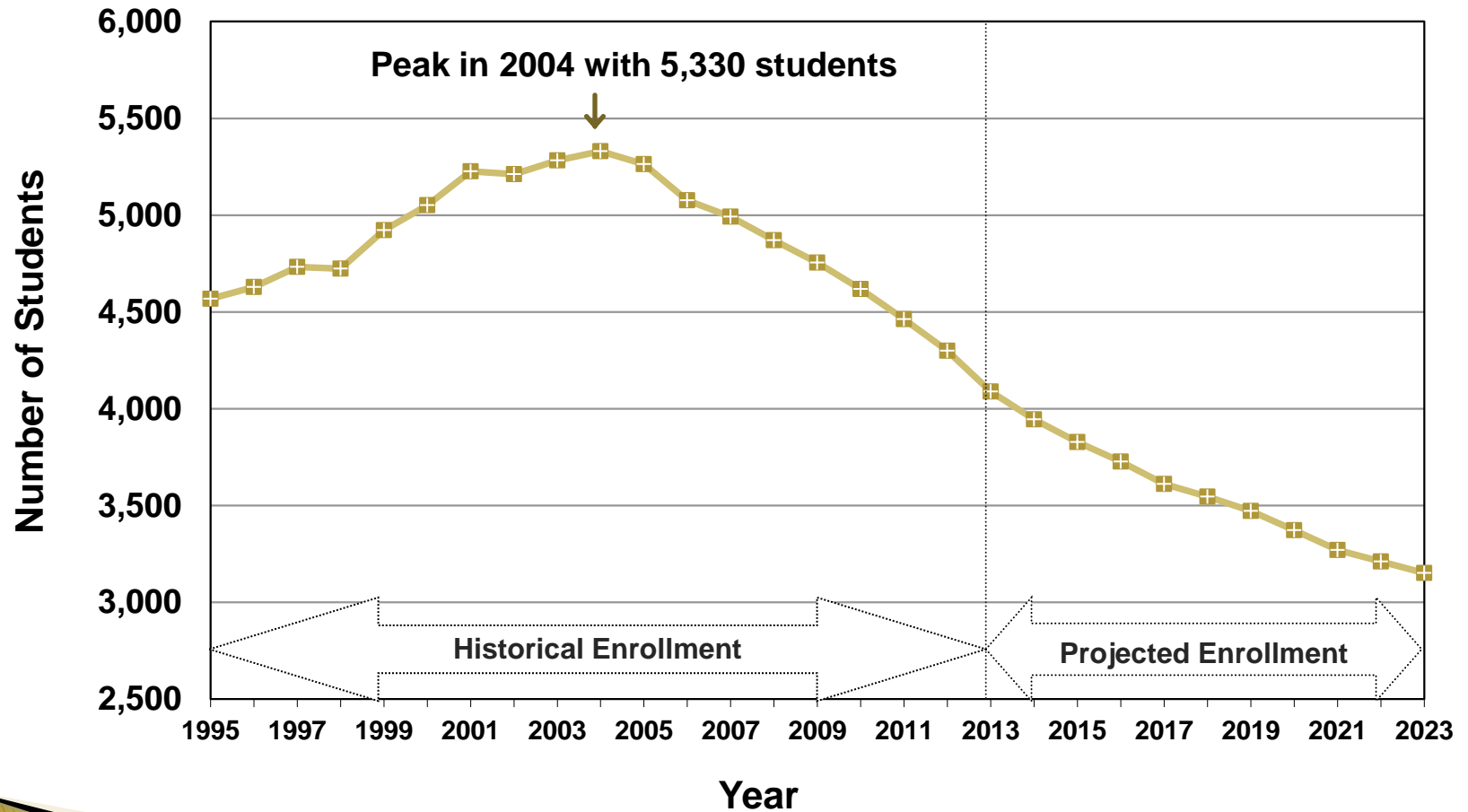
Enrollment by Grade Configuration, 2003 – 2023

East Islip UFSD Enrollment, 1995 - 2023



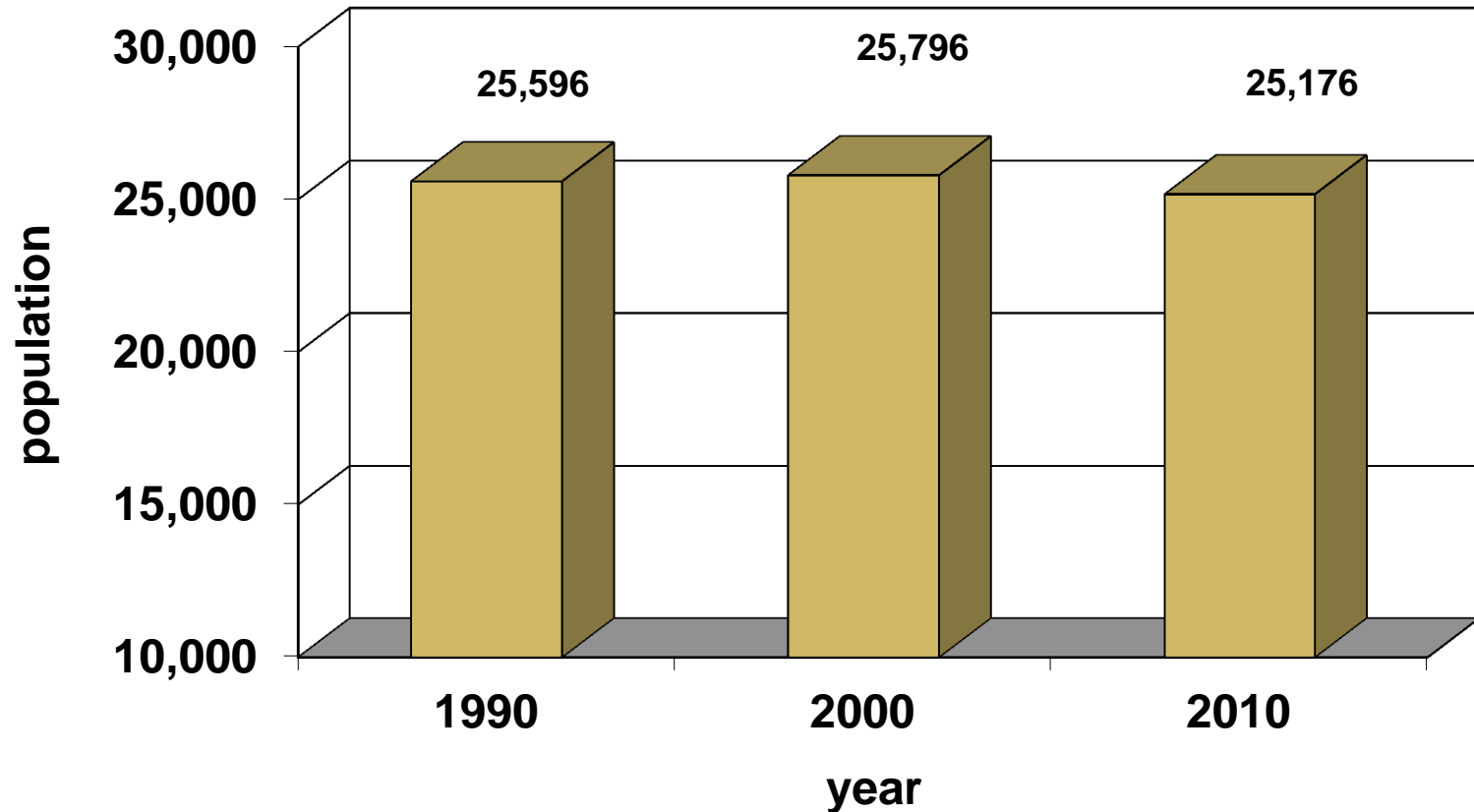

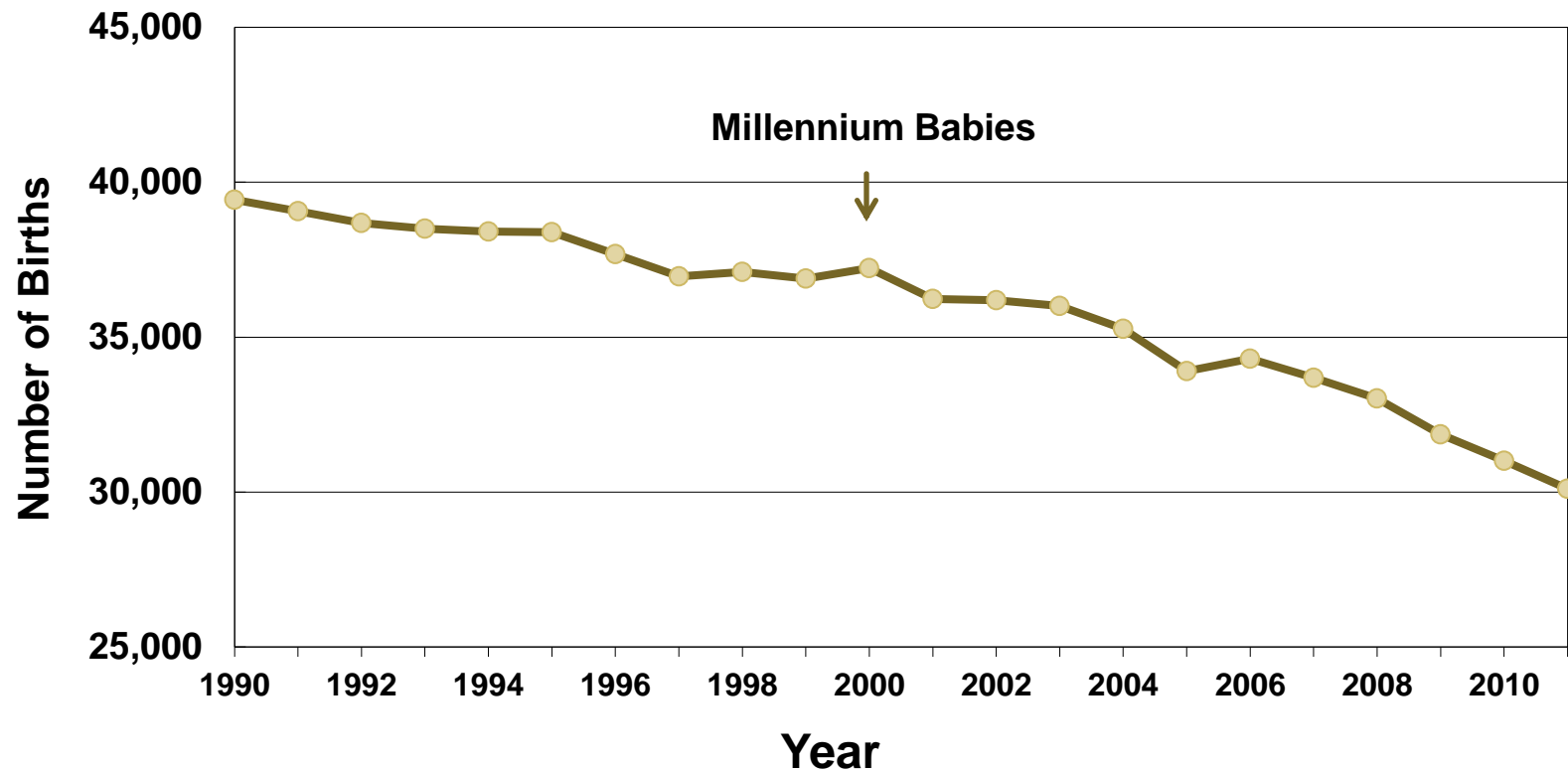

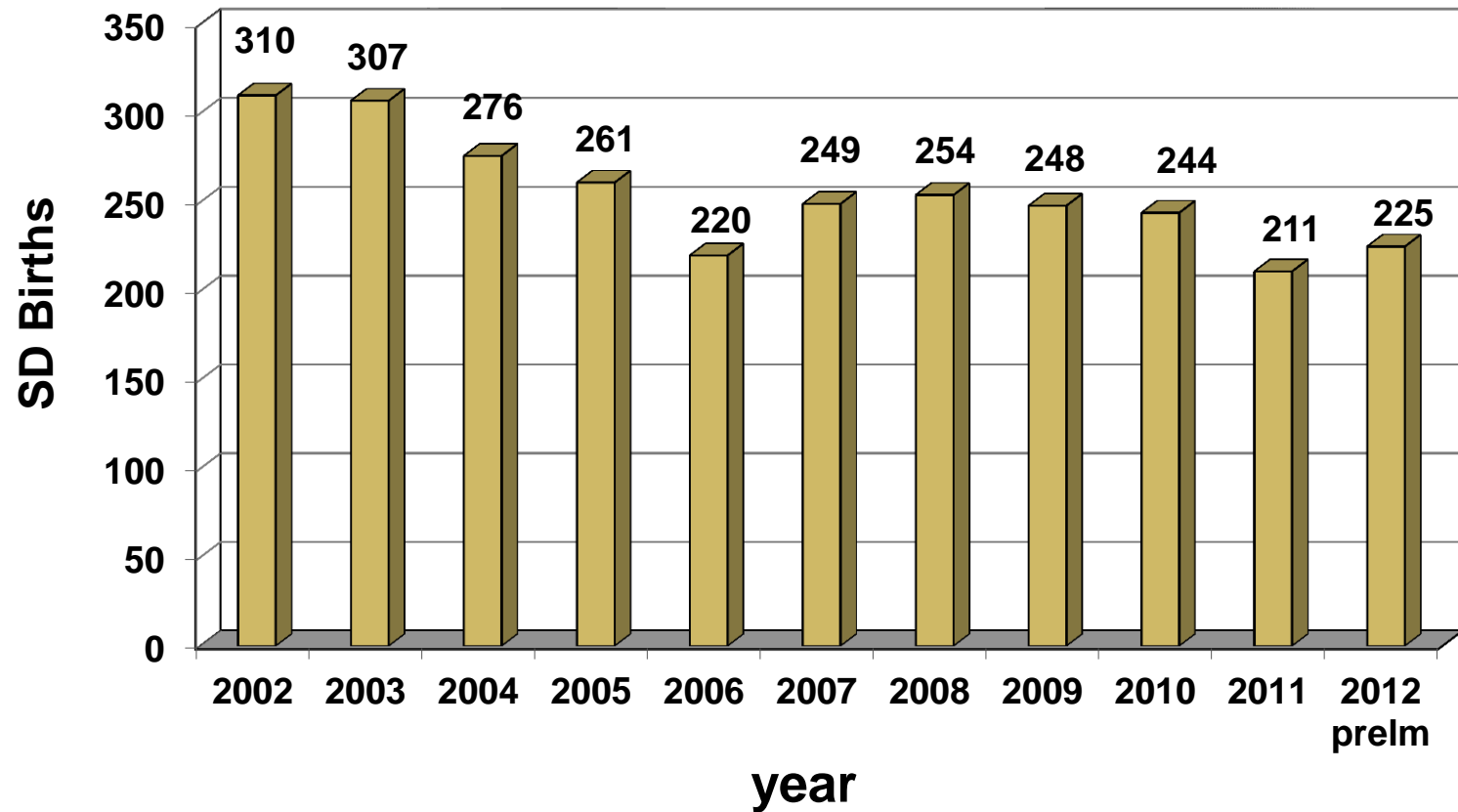
decreased by 1.6% (420 persons) between 1990–2010



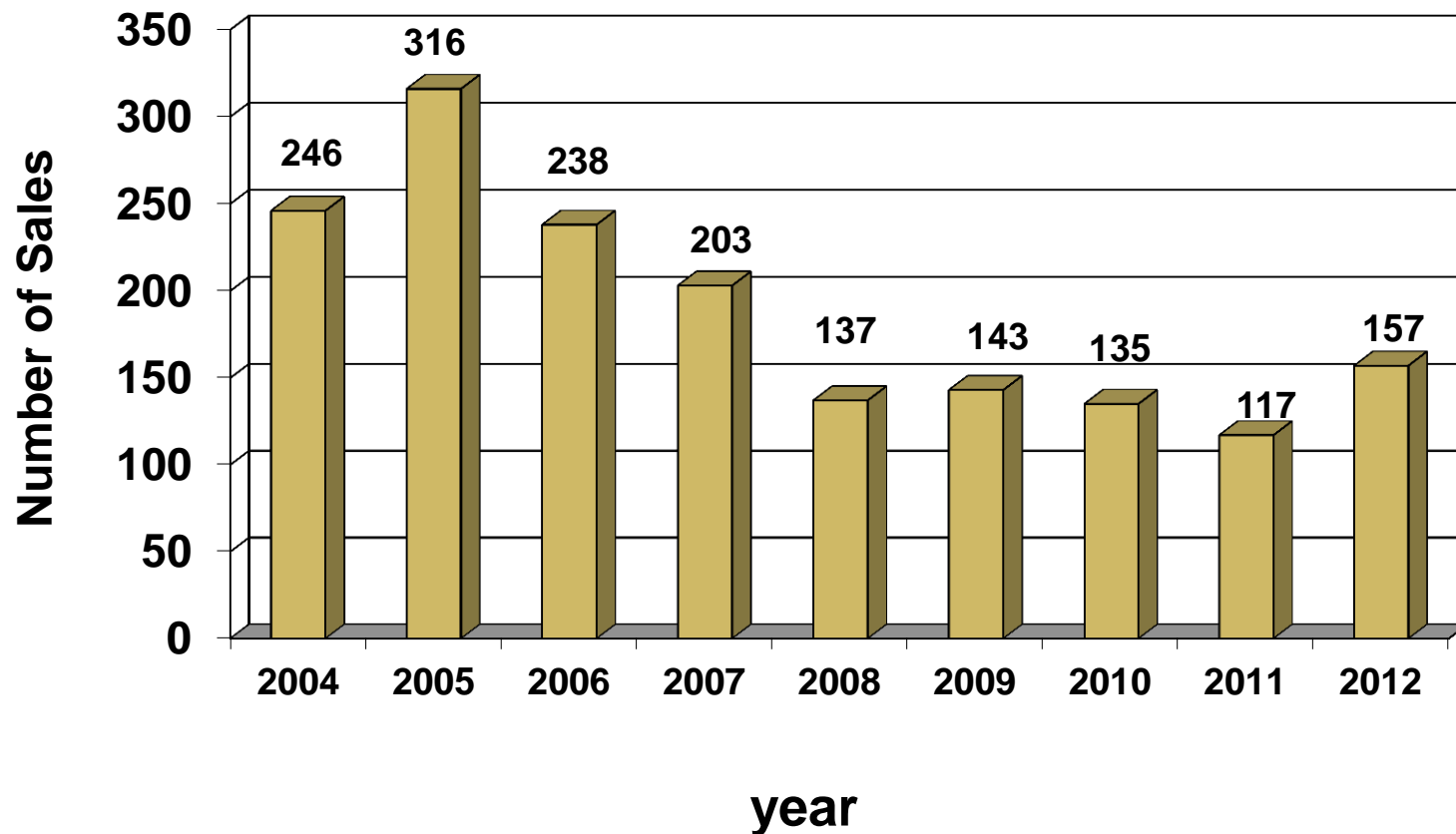
Births on Long Island 1990 - 2011

East Islip UFSD: Kindergarten Enrollment

- ▶ **Between 2003 – 2013:**

kindergarten classes:

247 – 390 students

- ▶ **Between 2013 – 2023:**

kindergarten classes expected :

217 – 266 students

East Islip UFSD:

Displacement Between Entering and Exiting Classes

► Between 2003 – 2013:

- Smaller kindergarten groups replaced larger exiting 12th grade groups in nine years
- Displacement ranged between –134 and +36 students

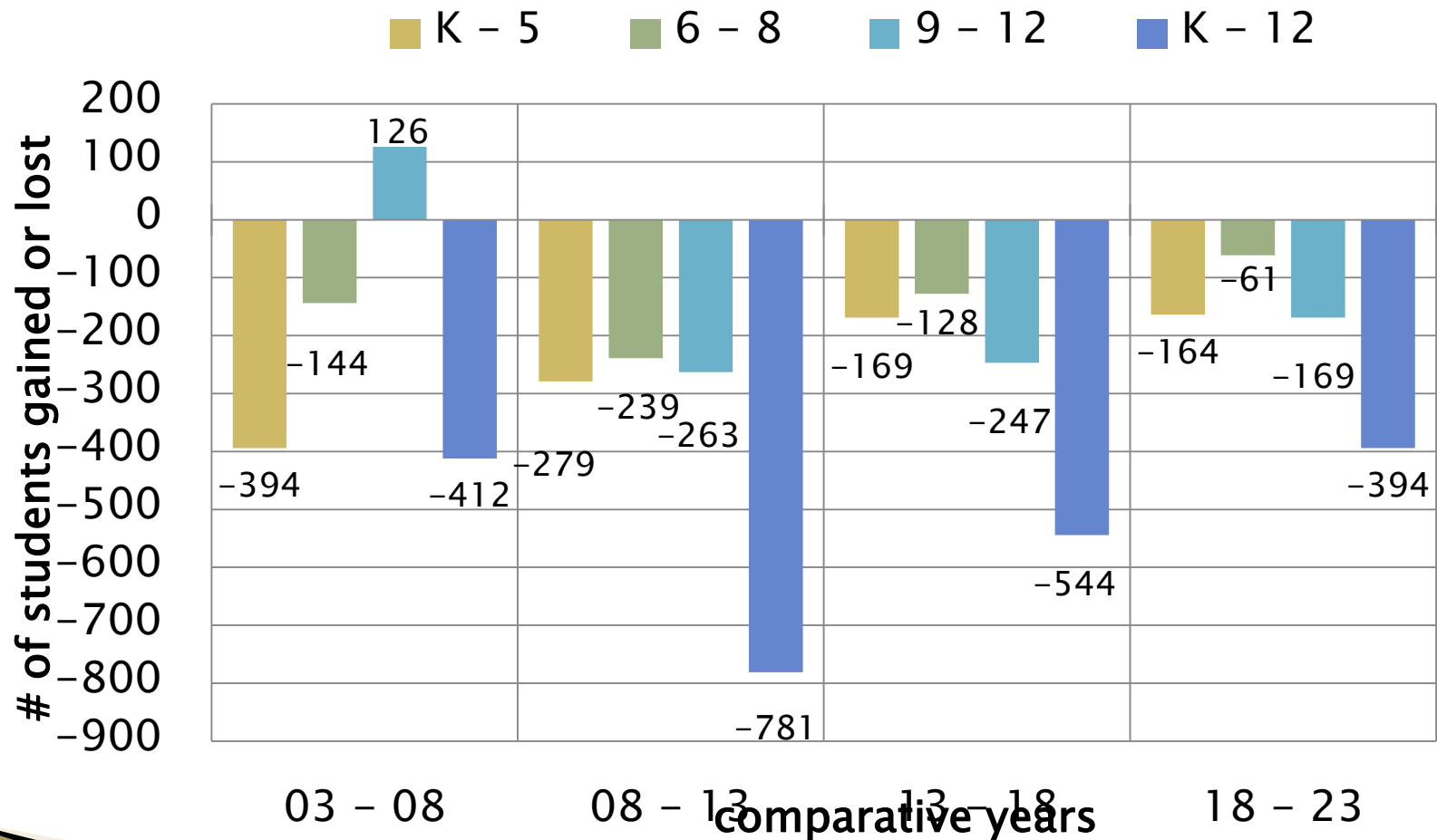
► Between 2013 – 2023:

- Smaller kindergarten groups to replace larger exiting 12th grade groups in all years
- Displacement will range between –112 and –32 students

East Islip UFSD: Migration Patterns

- ▶ On average –
 - Stable or Positive migrations to most grades
 - Losses are seen to three grades:
9th , 10th and 11th

Capacity...What is it ???

- For the purposes of this analysis, it is an “operational” capacity – how the building is currently being used
- Takes into account current programs, class sizes, special education needs, square footage
- Optimal capacity utilization
 - elementary schools between 80% – 90%
 - secondary schools between 70% – 80%

Projected Facility Utilization: 2014 – 2023

School	Capacity	Range of % Utilization (higher class size limits)	Range of % Utilization (smaller class size limits)
CES (K – 5)	559	52% – 63%	57% – 59%
JFK (K – 5)	652	47% – 58%	54% – 65%
RCK (K – 5)	627	59% – 68%	67% – 76%
TP (K – 5)	787	51% – 62%	57% – 70%
EIMS (6 – 8)	1,800	43% – 56%	47% – 60%
EIHS (9 – 12)	2,219	45% – 59%	50% – 64%

Conclusions:

- ▶ Enrollment has been decreasing and is projected to continue to decrease over the next ten years
- ▶ Facilities –
 - ▶ Elementary Schools are projected to have more space available as enrollment continues to decrease
 - Middle School and High School will be under-utilized during the next ten years

Conclusions:

- ▶ Middle School and High School are projected to have decreased enrollment as smaller cohorts move up through the grades
- ▶ Elementary Schools are relatively “balanced” in terms of capacity usage – ranging between 63% and 67%
