

Dear WCCHS Students and Families of the Class of 2025,

It has come to our attention that some students may be organizing or participating in a game commonly known as “Senior Assassin” or “TAG.” This is a hide-and-seek style game where students attempt to “eliminate” other players using water guns, Nerf guns, or similar toy weapons. While this may seem like a harmless tradition, it presents serious safety concerns and can lead to behavior that puts students and others in unsafe situations.

To be clear, **West Chicago Community High School does not sponsor or support this activity in any way.** Any actions connected to this game—including disruptive behavior on campus, the use or possession of look-alike weapons, or anything that causes a disruption to the school day—will not be tolerated. These behaviors violate school rules, and students involved may face disciplinary consequences in accordance with the [Student Handbook](#).

I would also like to remind all students and parents that “Senior Pranks” are not appropriate and will not be tolerated. Participation in the Commencement Ceremony is a privilege. Any senior engaged in a senior prank or in misbehavior that may be construed to be a senior prank may be subject to disciplinary action as outlined in the Student Discipline Policy, and may not be allowed to participate in Honors Night or Graduation.

We ask all students to make good decisions and remember that expectations for conduct remain in place through the end of the school year. Parents, we encourage you to talk with your student about the potential consequences of participating in this activity and support them in making safe, respectful choices.

Seniors, you have been an incredible class and have shown strong Wildcat Pride for four great years. Let’s finish the school year strong, and continue working together to ensure WCCHS remains a safe, respectful place for everyone.
