

Supporting Scholars with Test Anxiety

- **Ease pressure**-Try not to put too much pressure on your child. Reinforce that as long as they worked hard during the year and di their absolute best you will be proud of them.
- **Visualize success** Encourage them to rehearse what it will feel like to get a good score on the test.
- **Focus on breathing**-Stress is often caused by insufficient oxygen to the brain. Work with your child to take time before the day of testing to take a number of deep, cleansing breaths, exhaling slowly. Focusing on breathing by taking some time when stress levels rise helps to focus the mind during testing.
- **Positive attitude/language** Use a positive language and attitude in general around your child and emphasize their ability to demonstrate what they have learned rather than the consequences of not doing well.





Chronic Absenteeism

Chronic absenteeism is when a student misses **10% or more** of the school year. As of 4/15, we have accumulated a total of **149 days of school**, chronic absenteeism applies to students who have missed **15 or more days**. For the entire school year, chronic absenteeism applies to students that miss **18 or more** days of school.

Chronic absenteeism is a key indicator of academic risk, as it can lead to lower achievement, disengagement, and increased dropout rates. It can also lead to retention and put your scholar in jeopardy of not returning to STEAM Academy next school year.
