NEW! SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS | High School Students - Current 9th, 10th, 11th & 12th Graders

SPPS Credit Recovery (summer school):

· High school students who owe core credits will be enrolled for summer school by high school counselor Jolene.

Summer school sites for in-person programming:

- -Grade 9 seat-based...... Johnson High School, each course carries 1 credit, up to 8 credits
- -Grade 10 seat-based.....Como High school, each course carries 1 credit, up to 8 credits
- -Grade 11 seat-based......Como High school, each course carries 1 credit, up to 16 credits
- -Grade 12 seat-based......Como High school, each course carries 1 credit, up to 24 credits
- -Grade 10-12 Experiential Learning...Johnson High School, each course carries 1 credit
- -Instruction is on-site during scheduled class time
- -Coursework is available on Schoology and allows students to have flexibility to work on materials outside of summer school hours.
- -School hours: 8:45 2:45

· Attendance:

- -Daily in-person attendance is expected.
- -Students are marked *present* when they are at school and in class.
- -Each program will "end date" any student who has not attended <u>and</u> has not completed any work on day 6.

· Session 1 (June 24-July 25)

-All students will be referred for term 1 and for in-person learning.

Families who need online learning and/or TERM 2 must let Jolene know April 28th. Summer school for online learning:

- -Session 1 (June 24-July 25)
- -School hours: 8:45 2:45
- -Students work on course content material that is online and self-paced. Teachers are available online for instruction and help students during a scheduled time. Students must be motivated, independent learners.

· Attendance:

-Each program will "end date" any student who has not attended <u>and</u> has not completed any work on day 6.

Session 2 Information:

-Students who participate in any Credit Recovery program during Session One, who still need credits will be enrolled in the online Credit Recovery Network extended time program from **July 29-August 14 (13 days**). Information will be shared with students during Session 1.

Last Week of April students in grades 6-8 will be taking the MCA math test. This test will occur during first and second period on the following dates; 6th grade - Monday 4/28, 8th grade - Tuesday 4/29, 7th grade - Wednesday 4/30.

First week of May students in grades 8-9 will take the MCA science test. This test will occur during first and second period on the following dates; 9th Grade (Biology classes) - Monday 5/5, 8th grade - Wednesday 5/9.

Important Reminder about Attendance:

If your child is going to miss school, please call, email owlattendance@spps.org or write a note to explain the reason for the absence. If we do not hear from you, the absence is documented as unexcused. After 3 days of unexcused absences, you will receive a letter from the school reminding you to please communicate with us so the absence(s) may be documented accurately. If your child continues to miss school, unexcused, he/she will be referred to the SAM (School Attendance Matters) Program for intervention.

The following reasons for absence qualify as an excused absence; illness, doctor, dental or therapy appointment (please be sure to obtain a note to give to the school), extreme family emergency or religious holiday not already recognized by our school district. When a student misses 3 or more class periods in one day, this is considered to be a full day of absence. Please call us if you have any questions/concerns.
