Happy Spring Medford!

We've had a busy month since the last newsletter, launching our Keep Medford Beautiful chapter, working on the proposed new city charter, awarding grant funding through our Vacant Storefront Program, and more. As we move into April, we're looking forward to events like our Citywide Cleanup, Patriots' Day festivities, annual Egg Dash with Medford Recreation, and National Arab American Heritage Month events.

Here are some of our recent updates:

- We delivered a <u>compromised version of the City Charter</u> to the City Council for review and a final vote at its April 8 meeting which restores ward representation and removes the Mayor as Chair of the School Committee. You can read the revised charter at <u>medfordma.org/charter</u>.



Main Street Intersection Improvements Public Meeting



Medford Main Street Intersection Improvements Design Public Hearing

What is happening?

The purpose of this design public hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Intersection Improvements at Main Street/South Street, Main Street/Mystic Valley Parkway Ramps, and Main Street/Mystic Avenue project. All views and comments made at the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

How will this affect you?

The proposed project consists of intersection improvements on Main Street at South Street, Mystic Valley Parkway (Route 16) Ramps, and Mystic Avenue with traffic signals and signalized crosswalks. Main Street at Emerson Street will also be receiving a signalized crosswalk. Separated bicycle accommodations will be provided on Main Street where possible within the available right-of-way. Buffered bicycle accommodations will also be provided through the Mystic Avenue intersection. New ADA-compliant sidewalks and pedestrian curb ramps will be installed on both sides of Main Street, and critical crosswalks will be provided across Main Street.

MassDOT is hosting a public hearing for the Medford Main Street Intersection Improvements Design project on April 23 at 6pm at the City Hall Council Chambers. This will be the last public meeting before MassDOT finalizes the project design.

The proposed project consists of intersection improvements on Main Street at South Street, Mystic Valley Parkway (Route 16) Ramps, and Mystic Avenue with traffic signals and signalized crosswalks. Main Street at Emerson Street will also be receiving a signalized crosswalk. Separated bicycle accommodations will be provided on Main Street where possible within the available right-of-way. Buffered bicycle accommodations will also be provided through the Mystic Avenue intersection. 

Mayor Lungo-Koehn Delivers Final Compromised Version of City Charter to City Council

After reviewing all of the City Council's edits, the <u>final version</u> of the City's long anticipated City Charter has been delivered back to the City Council for a final vote at the April 8 regular meeting before being sent to the legislature in hopes of appearing on the ballot for voter approval in November, Mayor Lungo-Koehn announced.

Skin By Terry Awarded \$10,000 Vacant Storefront Program Grant from City

The City has awarded Terry Gavin, a master licensed esthetician and owner of Skin by Terry, the first Medford Vacant Storefront Grant, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. This program allows businesses to expand and occupy vacant retail storefronts through grant funding and refundable tax credits.

This final compromised version upholds the survey results and the recommendation from the Charter Study Committee of increasing the number of City Councilors to 11 with 8 councilors being elected by each ward and the remaining 3 members being councilors-at-large who shall be nominated and elected by and from the voters at large.

City Launches 'Keep Medford Beautiful' Chapter

This week, the City created a Keep Medford Beautiful chapter and is looking for steering committee members to help lead this group, announced Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn. Keep Medford Beautiful is a community effort to organize local volunteers interested in cleaning up and beautifying Medford's public spaces.

The mission of the chapter is to instill accountability through action and foster social responsibility by urging residents to not litter and pick up litter when they see it. This will be a volunteer-led organization that works alongside the Department of Public Works, the Mayor's Office, other

Medford Launching YouthWorks Program to Help At-Risk and Low-Income Young People Develop Skills for Future Careers

The City, with the amazing help of School Committee member Aaron Olapade, has secured over \$40 thousand in grant funding to launch a YouthWorks job placement program for youths aged 14-25, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The grant, through MassHire, will allow the City to place young people in on-site job settings, exposing them to real word experience that will help develop a variety of usable skills and set them on a path to a meaningful career. The group will meet weekly with a job training coach to discuss progress, challenges and work on resume building as well as interpersonal communication skills.
