SORIANO SATISFIED WITH CROCKETT SOCCER REOUND HEADING INTO SPRING BREAK

When you're missing a couple of key cogs in your machine, you have to expect that it's not going to run perfectly well. But you're hoping it will still do its job without breaking down.

Crockett County's soccer team managed to do that Saturday, capturing a 6-3 victory over visiting McNairy County – and while it wasn't a masterpiece performance, first-year coach Joey Soriano will take it heading into the school's spring break week.

The Cavaliers were missing two offensive sparkplugs – Angel Garcia and Luke Carter – due to prior commitments before the McNairy contest was rescheduled for this weekend. And they almost lost two more during the battle with the Wildcats, as Santiago Santos took an inadvertent foot to the face early in the second half and leading scorer Chris Cerda was upended by a sliding goalkeeper with just minutes to play, but both were okay after the match.

That left Soriano somewhat content heading into the break that he hopes will provide his players some muchneeded rest.

"This one wasn't the prettiest match we've played," Soriano laughed when it was over, "but we played much better in the second half. It was really a game of two halves. But considering now how we've bounced back from that first match at the Arlington Ambush, I'm satisfied that we're moving in the right direction as we head into district play when we get back from the break."

The Cavs' win was their third straight since dropping three matches to some of the state's best teams at the Arlington event, and improved the season's mark to 4-3 as Crockett will now be idle until opening district play April 3 at home against Dyer County.

Soriano's club got off to a sluggish start against McNairy in a game that began at 11 a.m. Saturday. The Cavalier defense performed well in the first half, but the offense didn't get on the scoreboard until past the midway point of the opening period. Braulio Marquez did the honors for the hosts, netting a shot from the right side with 16:23 remaining before intermission. It was the only goal for either team in the first half.

Crockett came out with a much more concerted effort after the break. Less than three minutes in, Cerda scored the first of what would be three second-half goals as the Cav attacker posted his second straight hat trick.

Brandon Carcamo scored Crockett's next tally with 21:48 left to play for a 3-0 Cav advantage, but McNairy answered less than a minute later to cut it to 3-1 and inject some newfound hope into the Wildcats' morale.

That was quickly expunged when, with 17:29 remaining, Aiden Markgraf took a crossing pass from Cerda and drilled in a shot from the left side to make it 4-1. Less than two minutes later, Cerda blistered a shot from outside the box with such force that, while deflected into the air by a defender, it still sailed above the arms of the keeper and just below the crossbar to push the margin to 5-1

Cerda completed his three-goal hat trick with 12:11 to play when he punched in a shot off a perfectly placed corner kick by Marquez. McNairy scored twice in the game's last five minutes after Soriano had replaced the majority of his starters to make the final 6-3.

In addition to the goal scorers, Marquez, Cerda, and Daniel Grajeda recorded assists, and Noah Mayfield collected eight saves in going the distance as Crockett's goalkeeper.




