7.0 Feature Presentation (20 Minutes)

7.1 Matrix Parent Network - Hillary introduced Matrix Parent Network and her personal experience with them and her children. Rachel talked about attending a state capital events and spoke on the Assembly Bill for Community Agencies to advocate for parents of students in Special Education like Matrix Parent Network. Rachel introduced David Poeschel.

David Poeschle spoke about the Matrix Parent Network, an organization that started in 1983, that gets funding from federal, state, and donations. Matrix provides parent trainings, has Education Centers, California Family Resource Center, and the counties served: Marin, Sonoma, Napa and Solano. Matrix attempted to present but there were technical issues and could not present, the presentation will be shared with the group. David Poeschle continued to expand on the services provided by Matrix Parent Network. Speak to parent to assist with special education programs. They can do a file review, (IEP, assessments etc.) Open from 9a-2p Monday - Thursday. Services are available in Spanish and English.

Trainings available - helps parents analyze and understand what special education is. Can attend IEP meetings. The goal is to train parents and families to understand the special education process. Trainings are available: Assessments, Goals, and Behavior

Monthly newsletter will be sent, with training schedules, podcasts, behavior training support, and expert trainings on behavior. Website has links to national and local resources. Helping parents navigate North Bay Regional Center. Focus is to train parents and families to advocate for their students.

Spanish speaking programs in Sonoma County. Spanish support groups available. Sibling Workshops - peer support for siblings of special needs siblings. Youth TikTok students can come together and interact with their peers, students of the same age group.

Parent, Wendy Ahumada - Are the trainings noted on the matrix website? Trainings are live, YouTube channel is available with other trainings.

Hilary asked if a parent needs help, call or email, and a parent advisor will get back to you.

Ana Acosta, Spanish-speaking parent advisor. Parent support group in Santa Rosa called Luna - Napa Solano. Meetings on the first Friday of the month. Everyone is welcome. Share information with any parent that may be interested. Matrix helps parents if they have questions with IEP or know what NBRC has to offer.

Hilary: Spoke about North Bay Regional Center experience and Matrix.

Emily Koehler spoke about North Bay Regional Center, IDEA Specialist - evolving positions to support service coordinators and families to better understand the special education system. A resource that partners with Matrix and school districts.

Hilary clarified - IDEA - federal law that set up special education laws. Not all special education students are NCRB clients, assessments are needed to become a NCRB client.

Ms. Angeles asked what specifically Emily Koehler does for NCRB. Emily explained that she can assist in clarifying questions about the special education process. The service coordinator can facilitate a meeting with Emly. Clarified that they are not advocates.
