#### **BUILDING FOR TOMORROW: PHASE 3A UPDATE**

Exciting progress is being made on Phase 3A of our "Building for Tomorrow" capital project! Thanks to your support and God's blessings, the transformation is well underway.

Here's what's been accomplished so far:

- Interior demolition is complete
- Underground plumbing and new footings have been installed
- Framing is finished
- A new roof now covers the former courtyard area

With the project structure taking shape, we're looking ahead to completion this July—just in time to welcome students to the Tekton Building, our brand-new Career and Technical Education (CTE) space for the 2025–26 school year.

Demand for hands-on learning continues to grow. In response, we'll be offering seven CTE courses for high school students and reintroducing wood shop for middle schoolers—equipping students with practical skills and preparing them for a variety of career paths.

We are currently 60% funded, with \$1,330,000 in cash and commitments toward our \$2,150,000 goal. We're incredibly grateful for everyone who has already partnered with us—but we still need your help to finish strong.
