TRUANCY FACT SHEET



COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE

Students who are at least six years of age - or who have been previously enrolled in first grade - and who have not yet reached their 19th birthday, shall attend school for the entire period the program is offered, unless exempted. Upon enrollment in prekindergarten or kindergarten, a student shall attend school. **Education Code 25.085**

- Tier I Beginning of the Year Notice/General Attendance Agreement Pledge (GAAP)
- Tier II 3 unexcused Absences within a 4-week period campus Truancy Prevention Measures applied
- Tier III 5 unexcused absences within a 6-month window central Truancy Prevention Measures applied
- Tier IV 7 unexcused absences within a 6-month window conference with campus administrator
- Legal Intervention 10 unexcused absences within a 6-month window possible court case filled with Dallas County

- Wake Up Your Mind (WUYM) Online student attendance intervention course for 9th 12 grade students with 5 or more unexcused absences. The course strives to identify barriers preventing students from attending school regularly, offer support, provide information and strategies to improve student attendance as well as avoid truancy court proceedings.
- Parent Attendance Success Initiative (PASI) An online truancy intervention
 course created to assist parents and guardians of elementary and middle
 school students with identifying barriers that may prevent students from
 attending school regularly.
