School-wide Writing Focus At Shadow Butte, we placed a school-wide focus on writing during February and March, with all grade levels participating in writing projects designed to strengthen the writing process and showcase student growth. While writing is a year-round priority, this focused effort allowed classrooms to collaborate across grade levels by reviewing samples, identifying common strengths and areas for growth, and fostering shared goals. Teachers selected exemplary student work, which was proudly displayed throughout the school over the past month to celebrate our young authors and their accomplishments.

PBIS in Action As part of our commitment to proactive behavior support, our PBIS team reviewed school-wide data and noticed a significant increase in behavior reports during February of last year. In response, our PBIS team collaborated with our specialists to revamp our system with a more student-centered approach. Rather than drawing names for the same standard prizes, we gave students more choice in their rewards. This included options like lunch with the principal, helping with morning announcements, extra recess, spinning the prize wheel, selecting from the prize box, or choosing a favorite treat. This shift not only increased student engagement but also encouraged positive behavior, leading to a noticeable decrease in behavior reports
