3. Purchase of District Chromebooks (Attachment B)

Jeff Cassin, Director of Technology, is recommending the purchase of 650 Chromebooks to replace existing equipment as part of the district's annual replacement plan. The Chromebooks will be purchased through the REMC cooperative purchasing program. Each Chromebook is \$296.00, and the necessary management license is \$29.80, for a total of \$325.80 per device. Therefore, the total cost for 650 devices is \$211,770.00, from Sehi Computer Products in Rochester Hills, Michigan. This purchase will be allocated to the sinking fund budget.

The recommendation to purchase Chromebooks will be an Action Item at the April 28, 2025, Board of Education Meeting.

Trustee Clark inquired as to where the Chromebooks will be placed, Trustee Polverento inquired about the timing of implementation and President Bird asked for clarification of the cooperative bidding process.

President Bird also thanked Mr. Cassin for his service to the district and wished him the best in his retirement.
