<u>Call to Order:</u> A meeting of the **iFlagler** School Advisory Council was held at the iFlagler campus on **April 24, 2024**. Principal **Erin Quinn** called the meeting to order at 6:05pm.

Introductions: No introductions were needed.

Good Things: Jamie Cordova shared that her son-in-law's restaurant had its soft opening this afternoon and it went well. Erin Ouinn shared that her mother's cancer treatment went well

Minutes: The minutes from the previous meeting were handed out and read. Jamie Cordova made a motion to approve, seconded by Bonnie Cleveland. Approval was unanimous.

Old Business

Tournament of Medieval Minds: The teachers were meeting Tuesday and Thursday this week with students at the GSB to prepare them for the PM3 and EOCs.

School Improvement Plan

Celebrations

- Student earned a perfect score on the US History EOC
- iFlagler performed higher than district and state scores on state assessments
- Most improvement
 - ELA in grades 7, 9, and 10.
 - Last year's SIP focused on improving ELA scores with a focus on providing guided notes, direct teacher feedback, and in-person support sessions.
 - In-person support sessions were the most successful

School Improvement Plan Areas for Growth

- K-5
 - When comparing overall grade level performance of students in K-5, all grade levels performed below the state and district average in ELA, math, and 5th grade science.
- Greatest Gap
 - 5th grade science
- Greatest Decline
 - The data component that showed the greatest decline from the prior year was ELA proficiency in grade 8. Although 95% of the student population tested in grade 8, the students scored at 47% proficiency. The district scored at 53% and the state was 51%. Some contributing factors include attendance at MTSS intervention sessions, pacing, and lack of differentiating to meet the needs of all learners.

School Improvement Plan

- Increase overall student tests scores
 - Implementation of PLCs
 - Meeting twice a month to review student data, learning target goals, achievement gaps
- Build Positive School Culture
 - Capturing Kids Hearts
 - PBIS
- Increase the number of students who participate in supplemental learning activities, such as ESE/MTSS sessions and tutoring
 - Administration will review current practices for communicating a schedule of services to students and families
 - Letters will be generated and distributed to students and families about the importance of student attendance in additional services, specifically for ESE and MTSS services
 - Teachers will learn to create and send notifications through Remind or some other text distribution to be sent one hour prior to the start of the support session

Vision Moving Forward

- Sustaining and possibly increasing student enrollment
- Strengthening our connection to our students and our community
- Providing opportunities for our students to meet with staff and each other in person
- Continuing our PBIS system to encourage positive student behavior

PBIS **Postive** Behavior Interventions **Supports**

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is an evidence based, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional and mental health. PBIS is a way to create positive, predictable, equitable, and safe learning environments where everyone thrives.

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) rewards are used to promote and reinforce positive behavior in schools.

- Encourages Positive Behavior: By rewarding positive behavior, PBIS
 helps students understand what behaviors are desirable and reinforces
 those actions.
- Creates a Positive School Culture: Rewards contribute to a positive and supportive environment, which can improve overall morale and relationships among students and staff.
- Provides Clear Expectations: PBIS frameworks often come with clear behavioral expectations and guidelines, making it easier for students to understand and meet the standards.
- Promotes Consistency: Rewards help ensure that positive behaviors are consistently acknowledged and reinforced, reducing ambiguity about what is expected.
- Motivates Students: Rewards can be a motivating factor, encouraging students to engage in and maintain positive behaviors.
- Builds Self-Esteem: Recognizing and rewarding positive behaviors helps students build self-confidence and a sense of accomplishment.
- Supports Behavioral Improvement: By focusing on and reinforcing good behavior, PBIS rewards can help reduce the frequency of negative behaviors over time.
- Encourages a Growth Mindset: When students see that their positive behaviors are being rewarded, they may be more likely to adopt a growth mindset, believing that their efforts can lead to success.

Overall, PBIS rewards aim to create a more structured and supportive environment where positive behaviors are recognized and reinforced, ultimately leading to improved outcomes for students.


