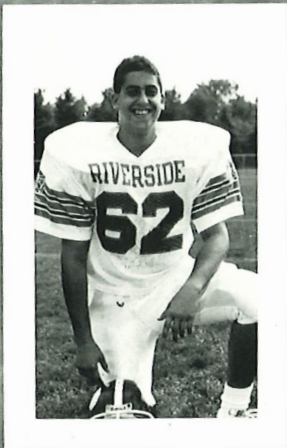
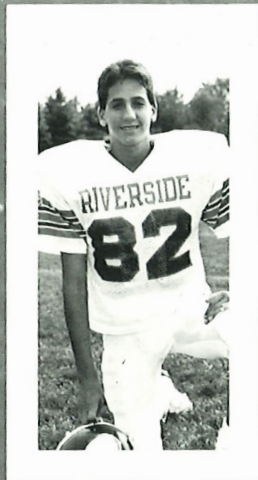
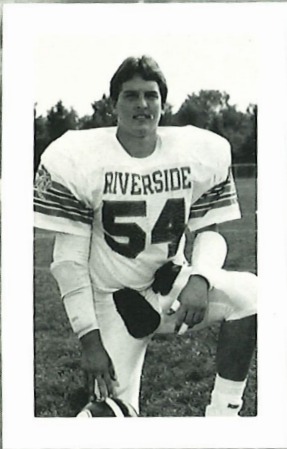


## GOLF — 1989-'90

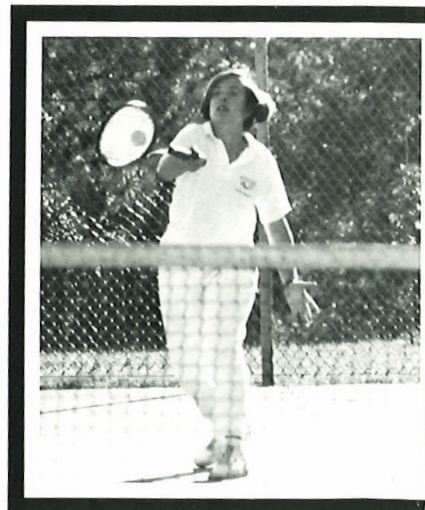
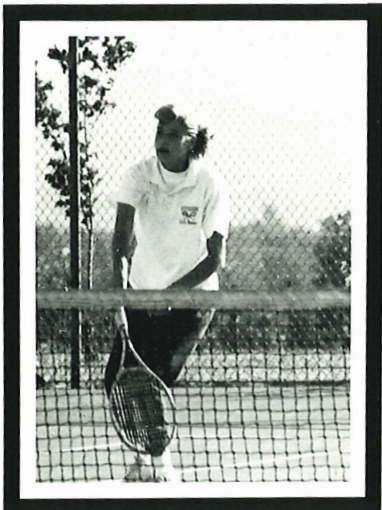
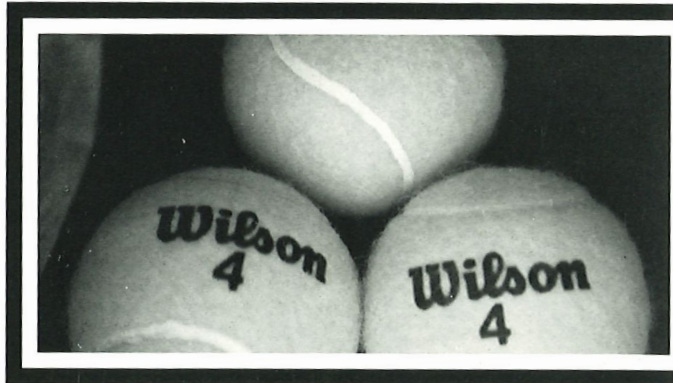
Although the 1989-1990 Girls' Tennis team didn't have a winning season, they showed competitiveness and school spirit.

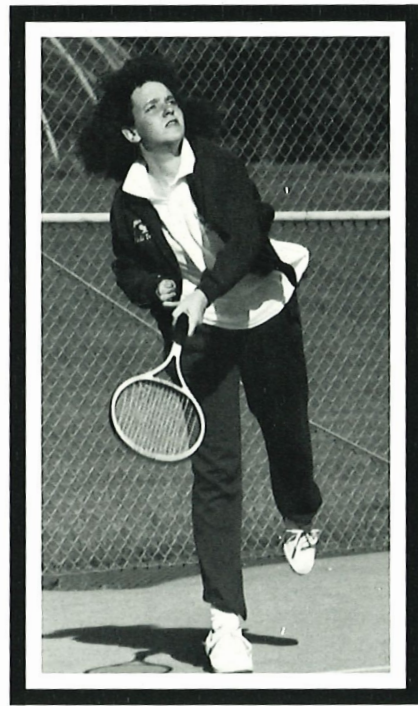
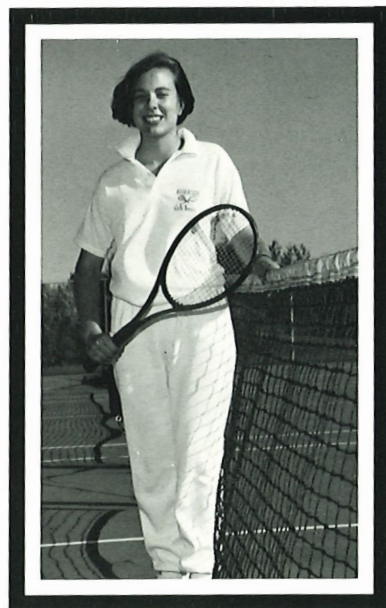
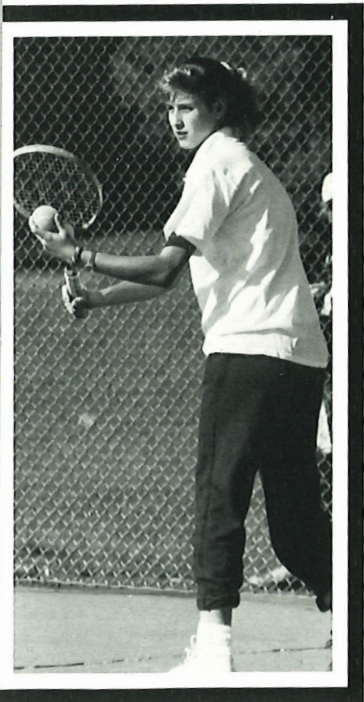
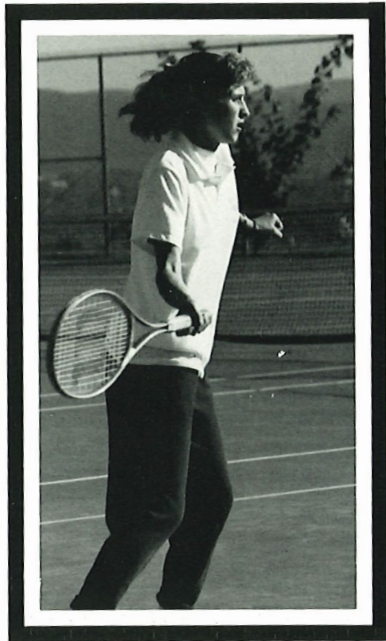

## IN MEMORIAM



### MISS BETTY JANE CASWELL

Miss Betty Jane Caswell was taken from us on September 11, 1989, but her memory and accomplishments will never be forgotten.

Miss Caswell was a dear woman who touched the lives and hearts of many by being involved in a large number of activities offered at Riverside High School.

Aside from being Fine Arts Department Chairperson, band director, cheerleading advisor, and spring play director, she was also in charge of planning and directing the music for graduation ceremonies.

The class of 1990 was the first class since 1946 not to be under her direction at the commencement ceremonies.

One of Miss Caswell's most notable accomplishments while involved in the music department was writing the words for the Riverside Alma Mater. She also originated the Christmas time tradition of singing carols in the auditorium.

Her death shattered the hearts of many — every age, every clique — because so many people loved her.

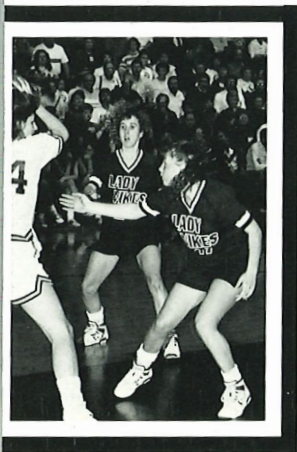


## DISTRICT II CHAMPS

Margee Fredrickson and Debi Wahlers were selected to the National Vocational Technical Honor Society.

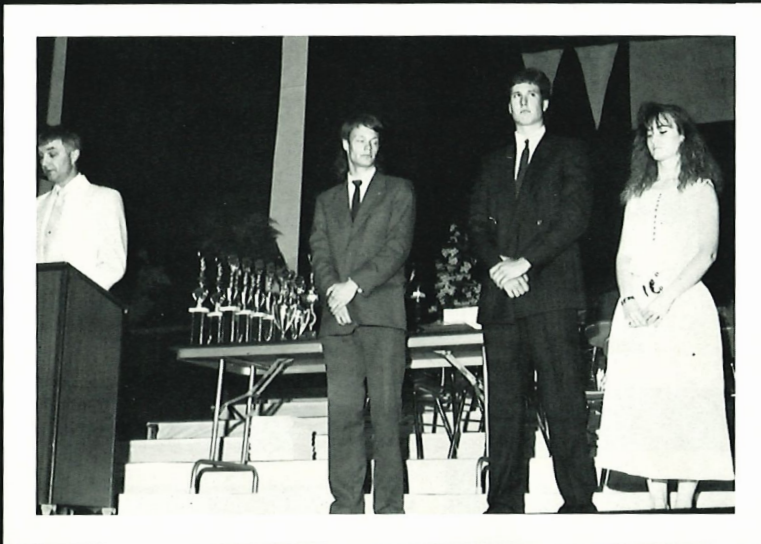
Each member of the Yearbook Staff was awarded with a plaque, and Mr. Pat Joyce, in turn, was presented with one of his own.

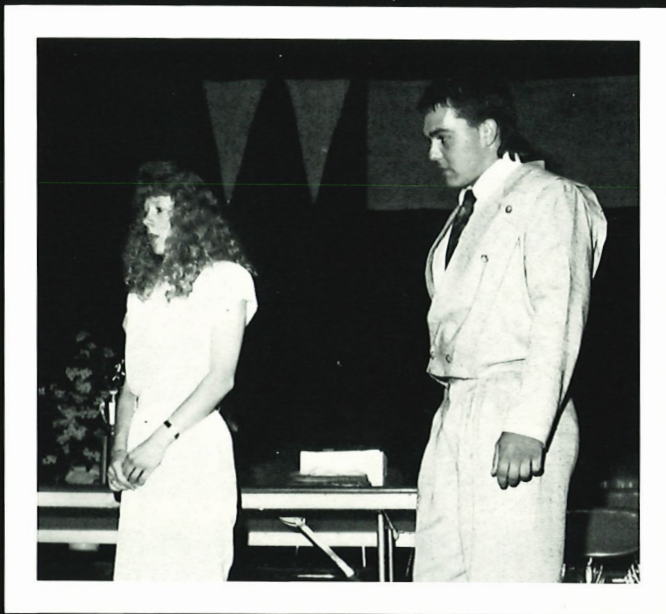
Jen Niemic and John Staretz received awards for outstanding athletic ability.

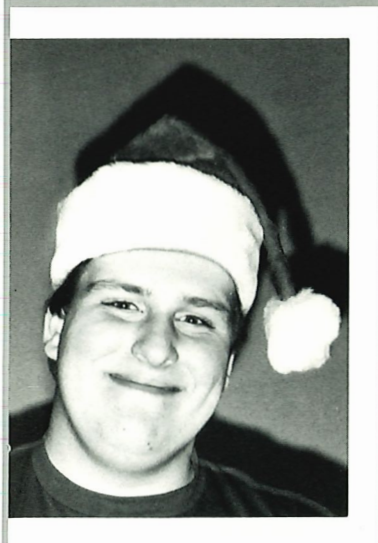
This Christmas the Honor Society continued their yearly tradition of reading to kindergarten children in both Taylor and Moosic elementary schools.

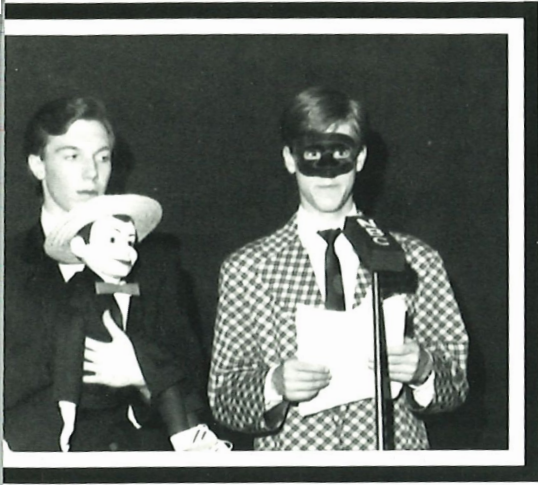




# “ANNIE”
