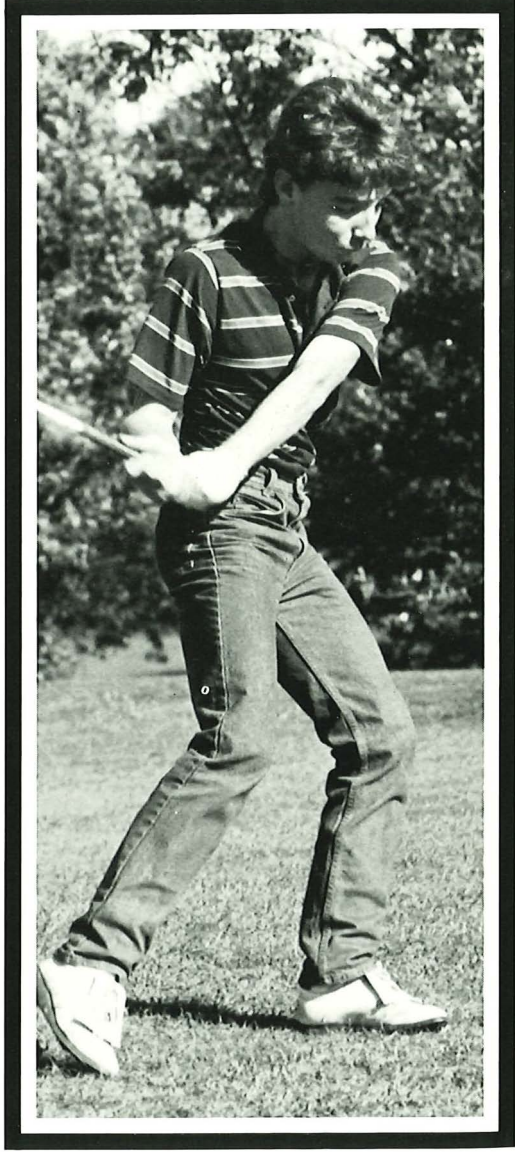
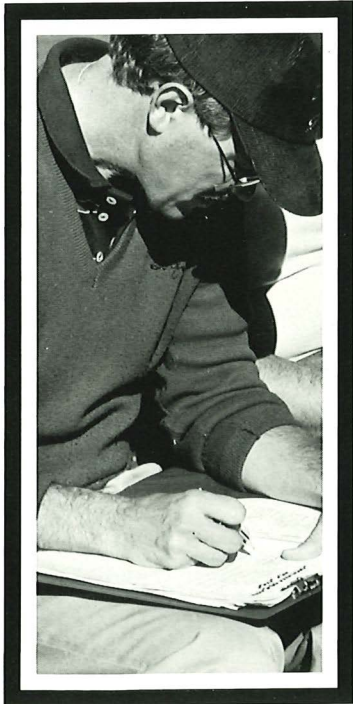
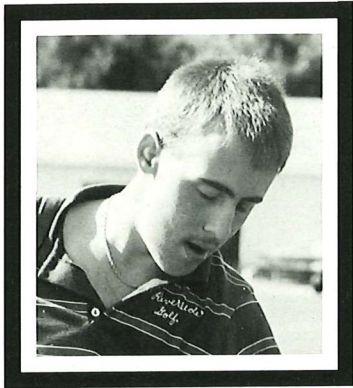
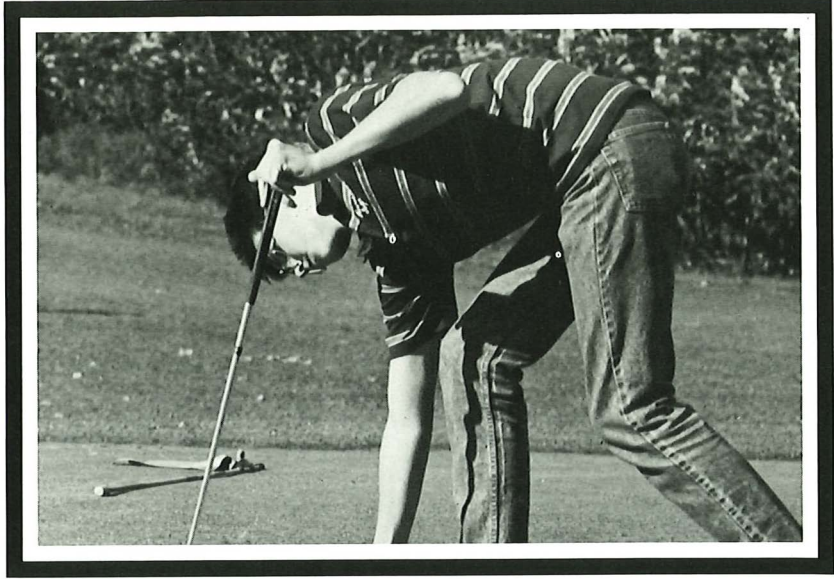
GOLF

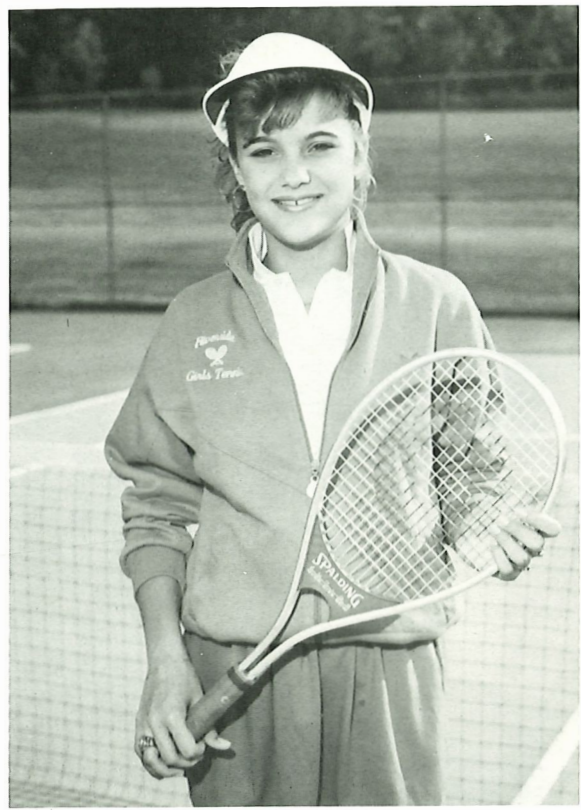


The 1987-1988 Girls' Tennis Team led an exciting year. Though the overall score of wins over losses wasn't impressive, the team showed terrific effort and spirit.

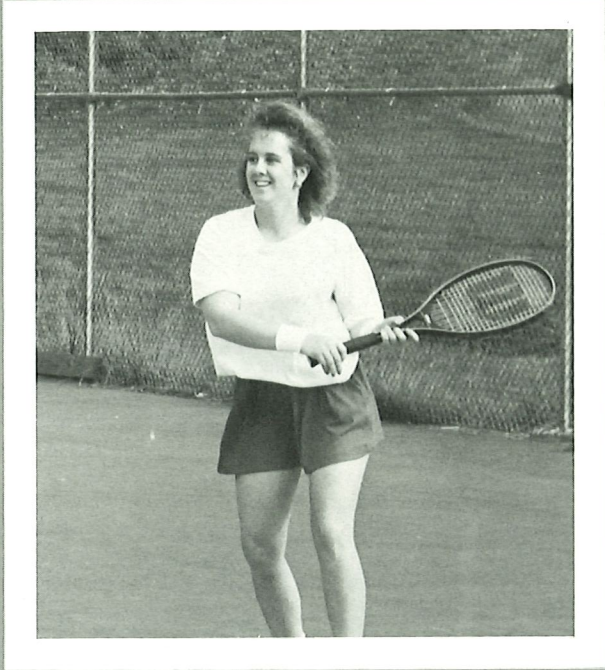

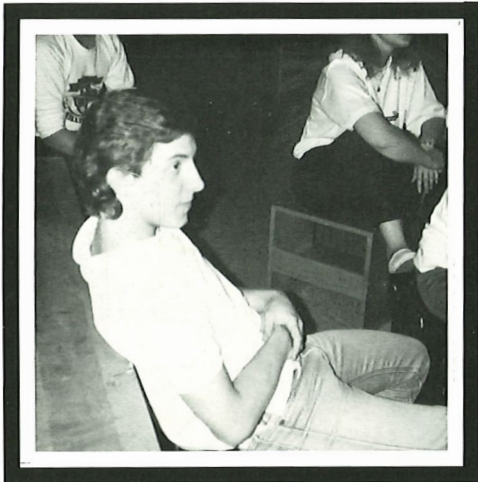




ART CLUB

Officers include: Ed Popil, president; Paul Novack, vice-president; Marissa Harrison, secretary; and Cara Smigiel, treasurer.

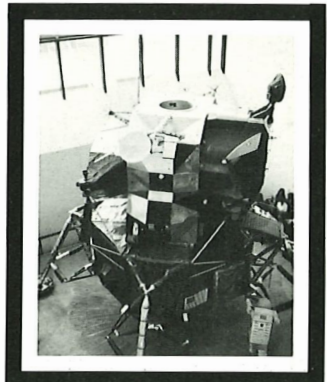
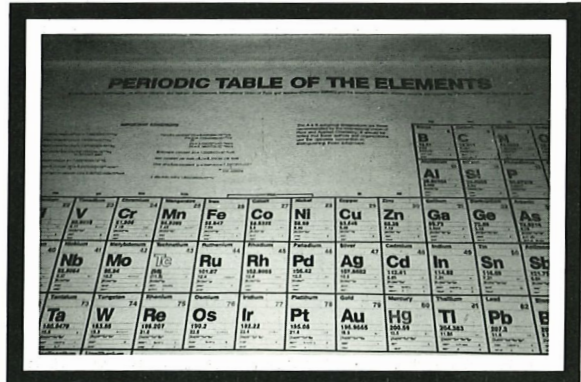

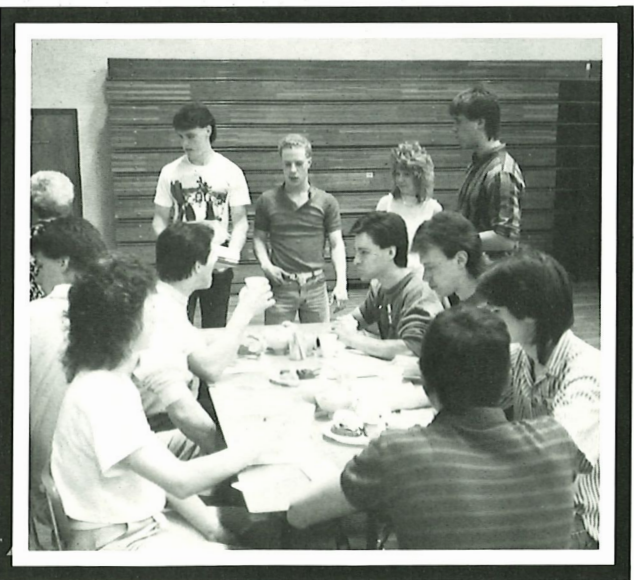
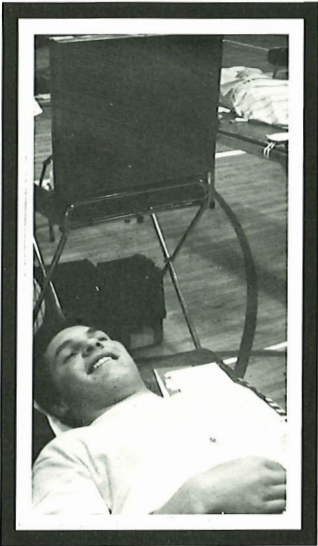
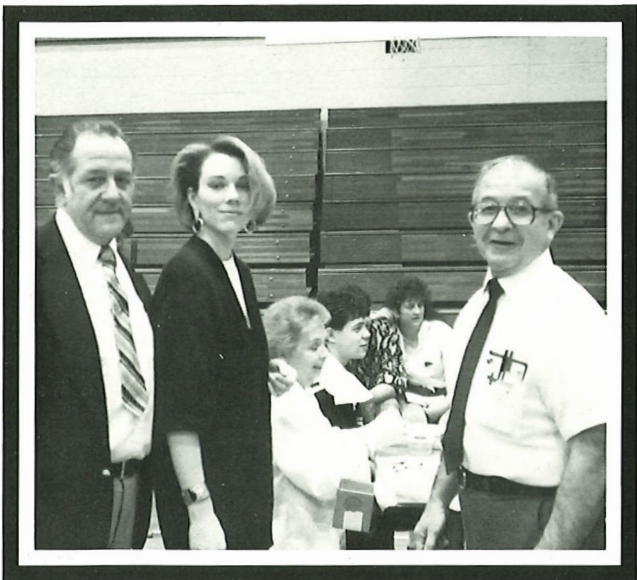


STUDENT COUNCIL

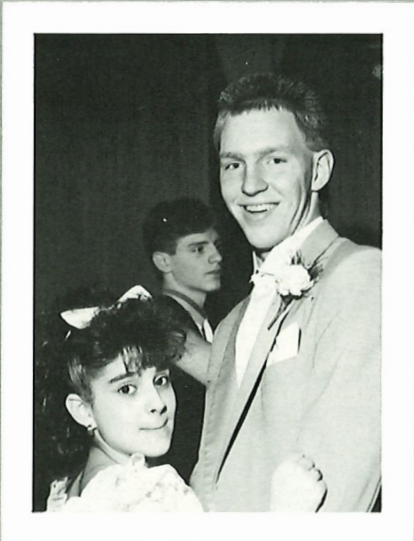


PASSING OF THE SWORD
