Karla Carrubba was placed on the second team and along with Jennifer Ostrich and Leigh Ann Evanish, received honorable mention.

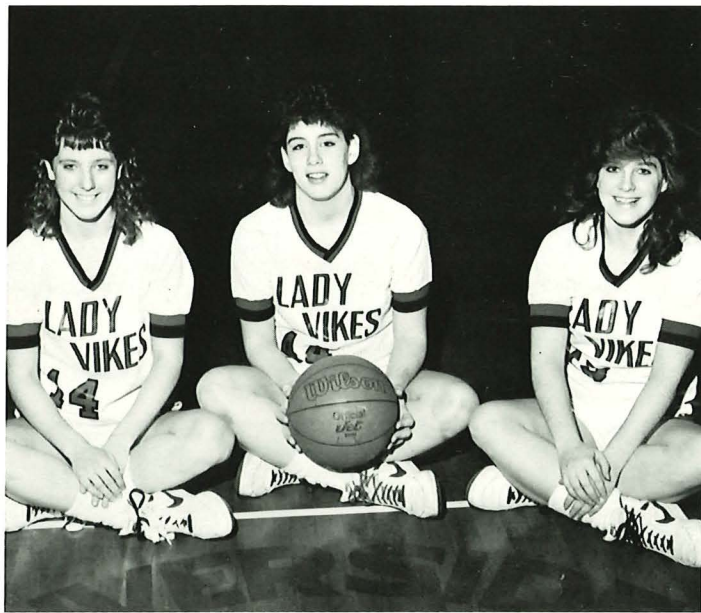
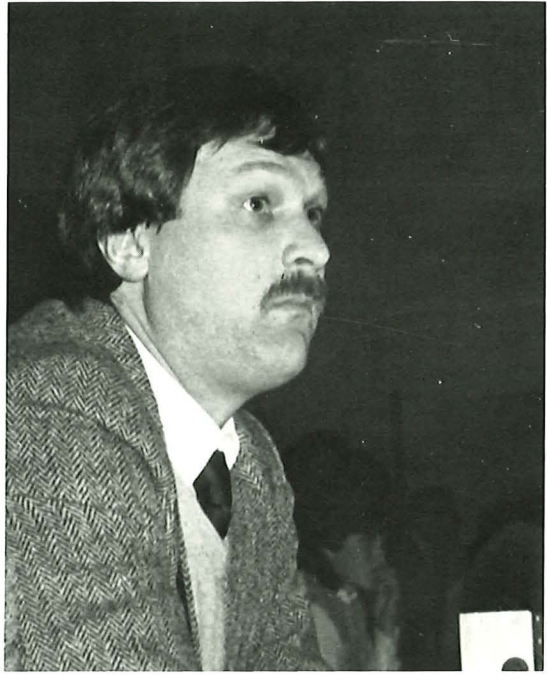
Leigh Ann and Karla were placed on the coaches All-Star team.

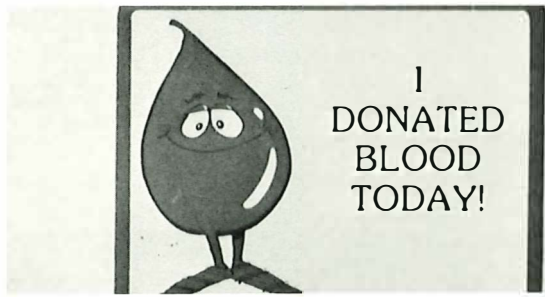


STUDENT COUNCIL

RON: Their performances were worthy of Hollywood.

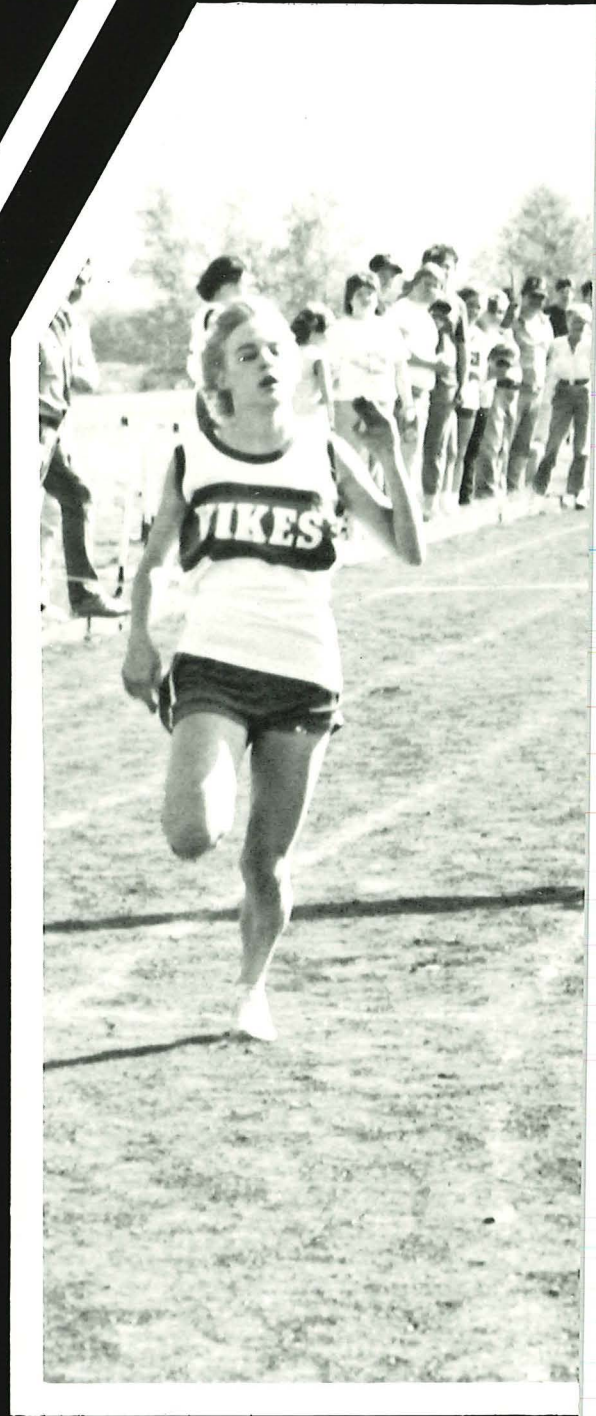

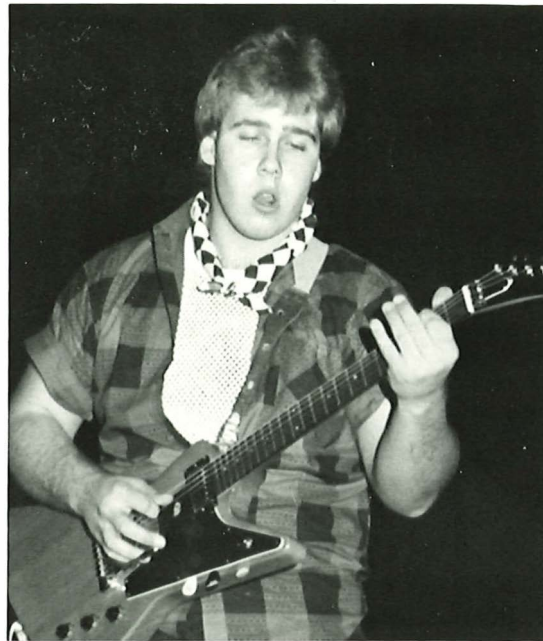


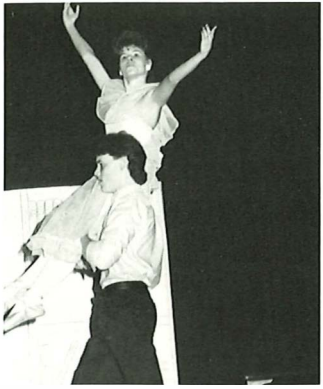


“STUFF”

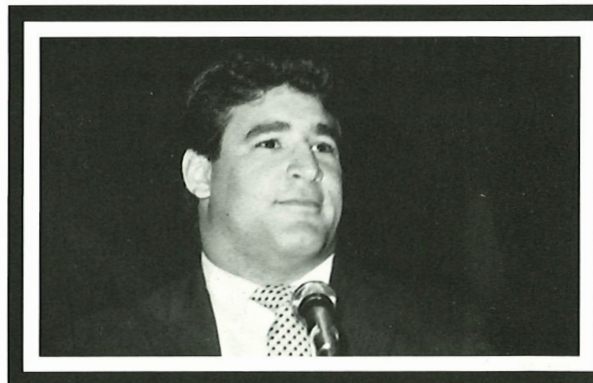




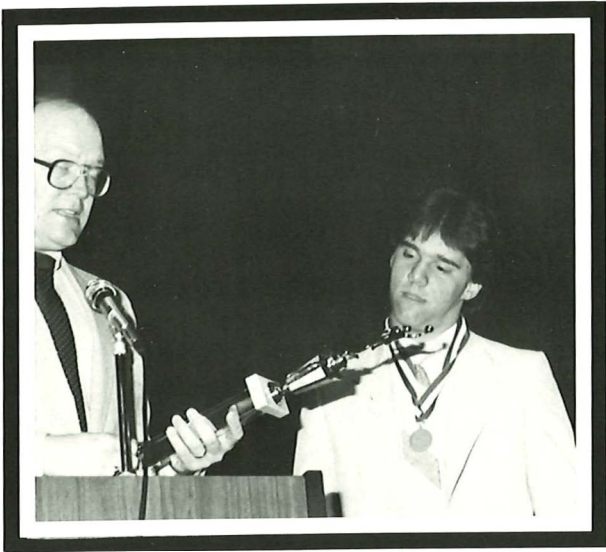


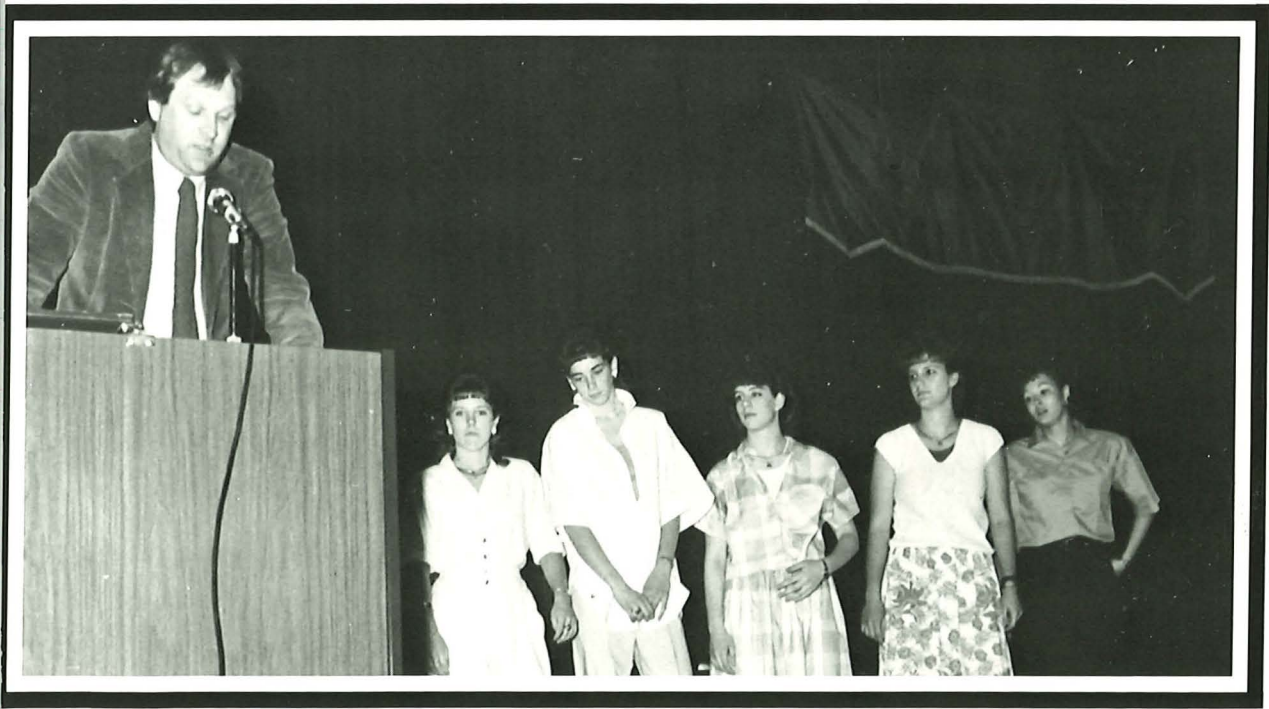
ALL HONORS

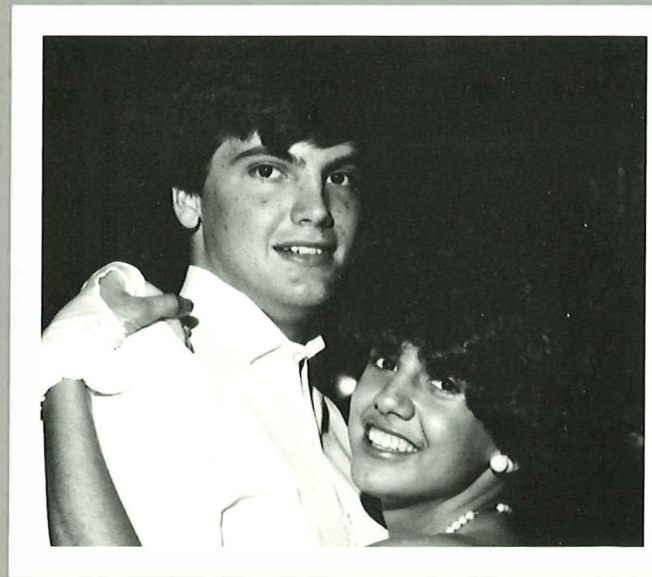
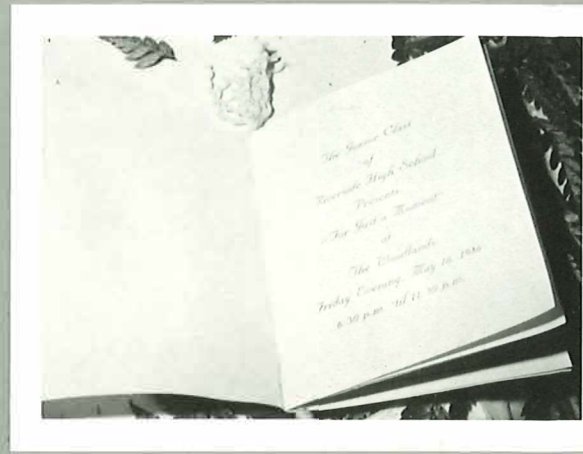


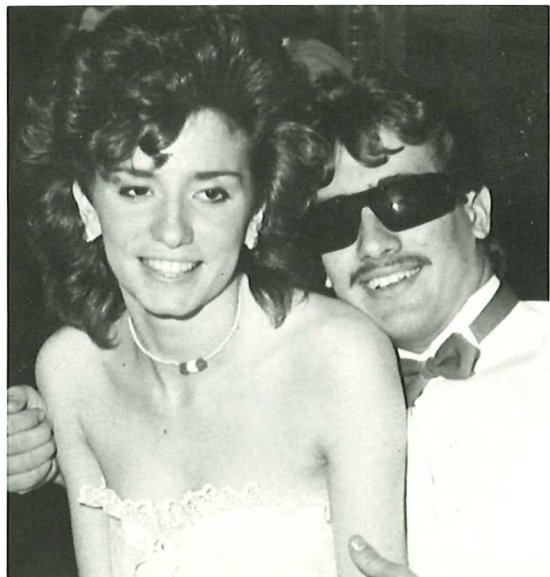


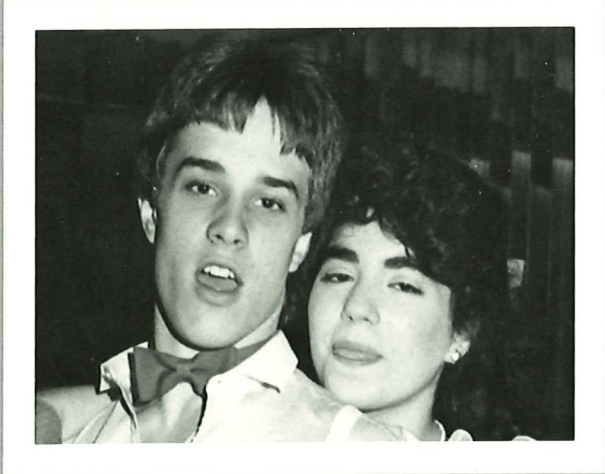
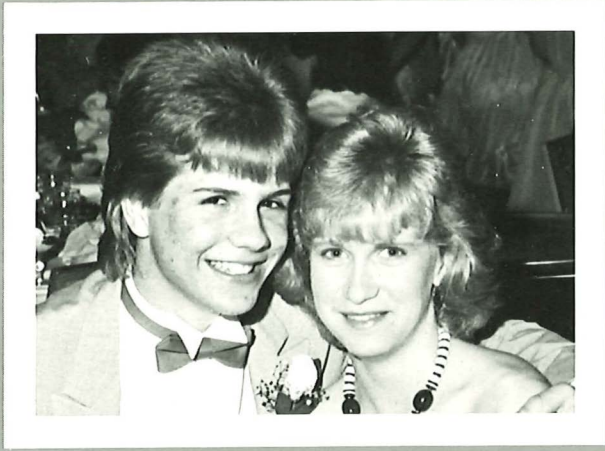
This year's Jr.-Sr. prom was held at the Woodlands. The Poets once again provided the music for this long to be remembered event.

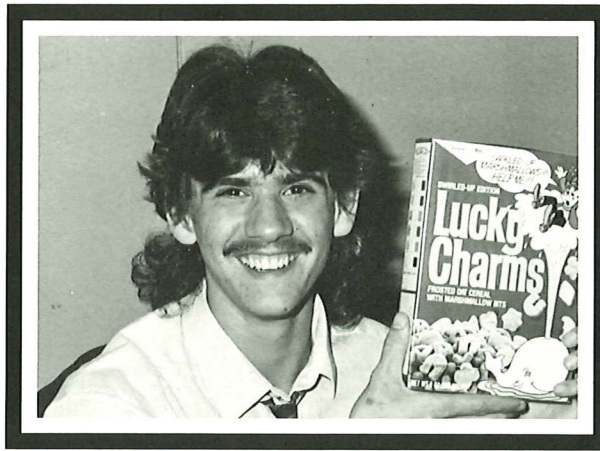




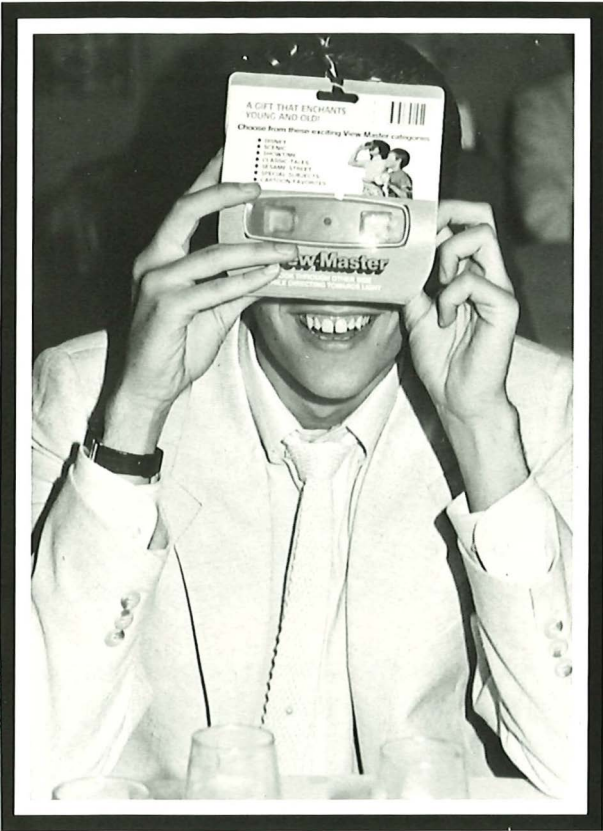


CLASS NIGHT
