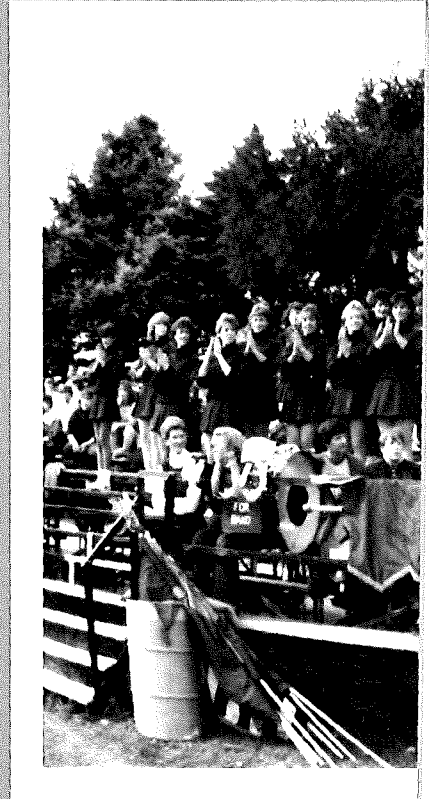

Known collectively as our faculty, they are the group of people who have taught, advised, and assisted us through our years at Riverside. We are grateful to them for their concern and dedication.

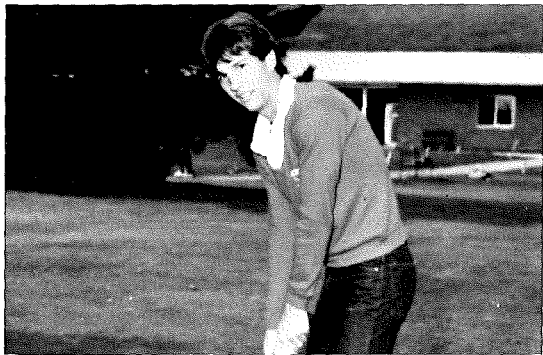
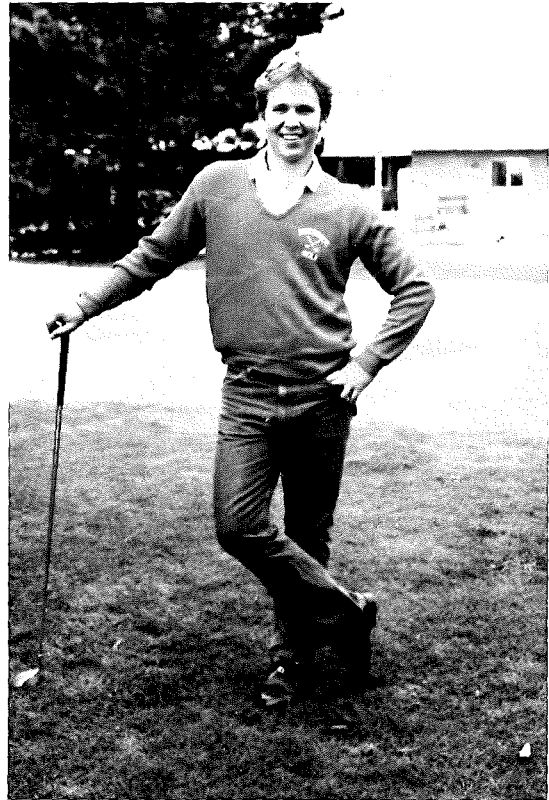
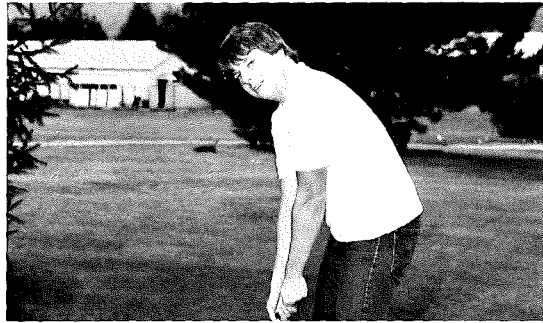
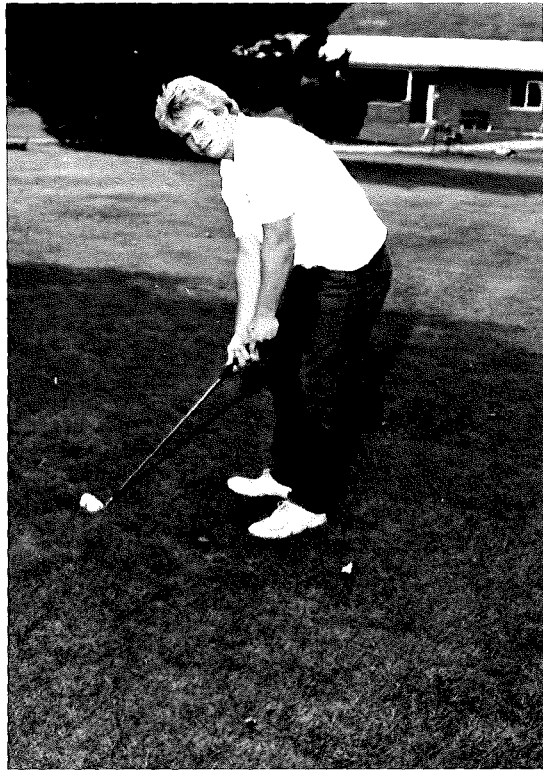

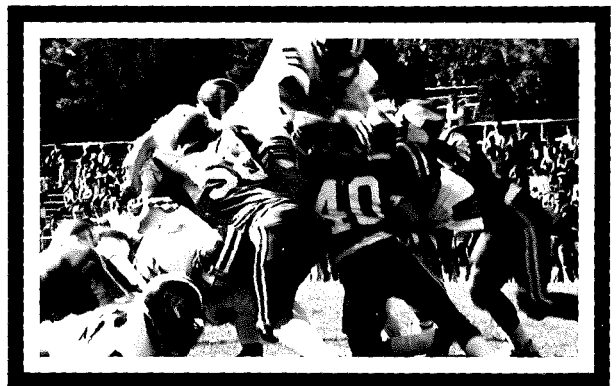
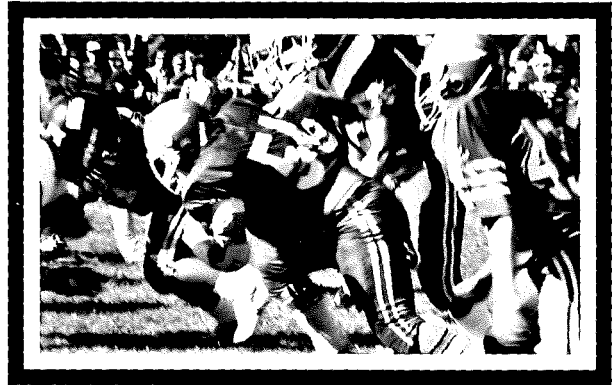
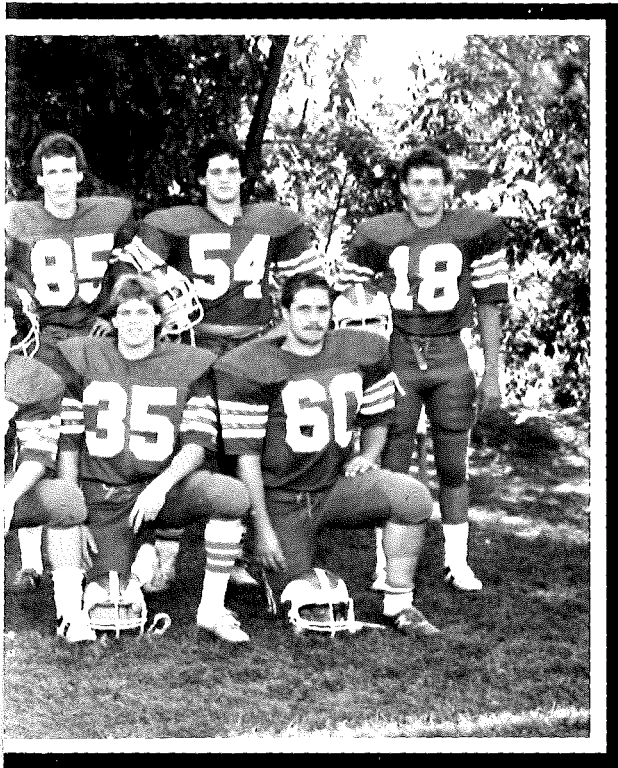
Although this season did not result in a number one standing, Mr. Butcher is very optimistic about the future of the Viking Football Team.

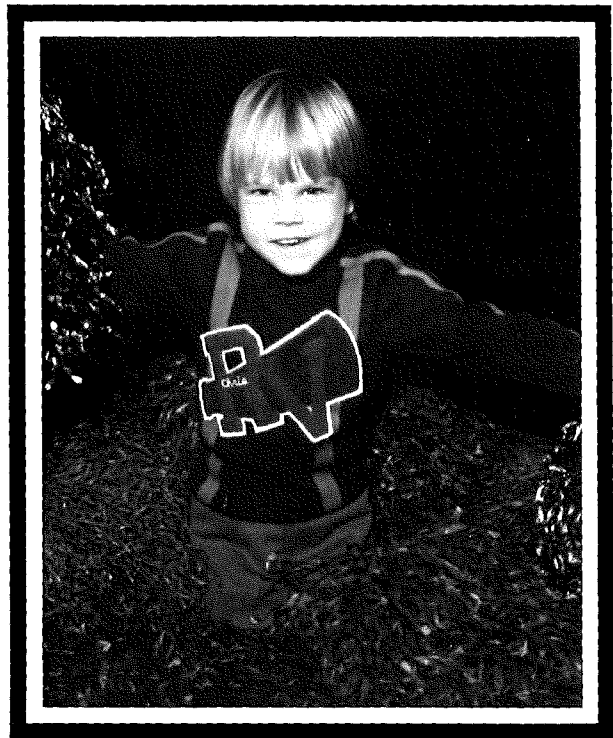
HOMECOMING ACTIVITIES

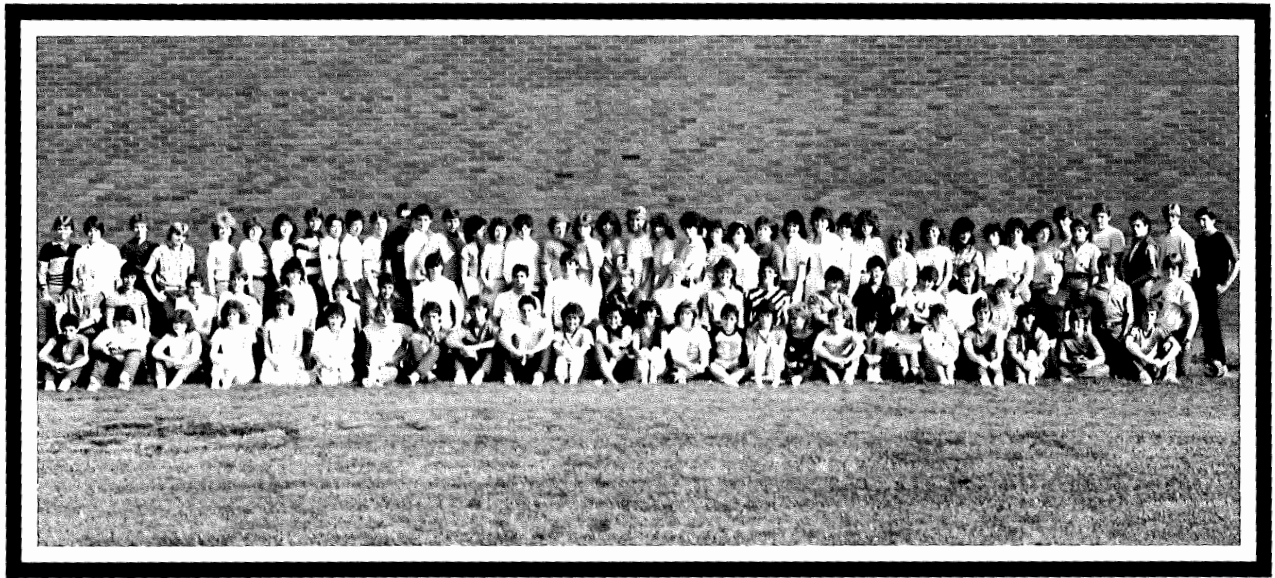


WINTER SEMI

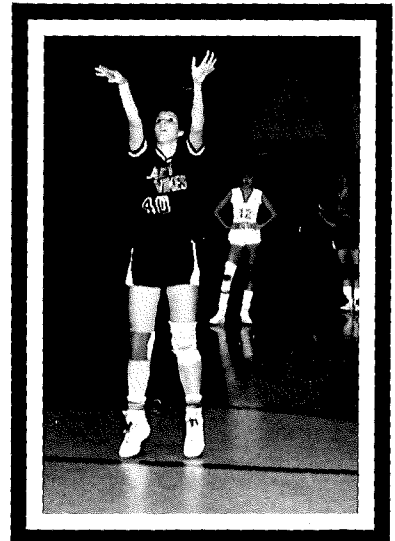
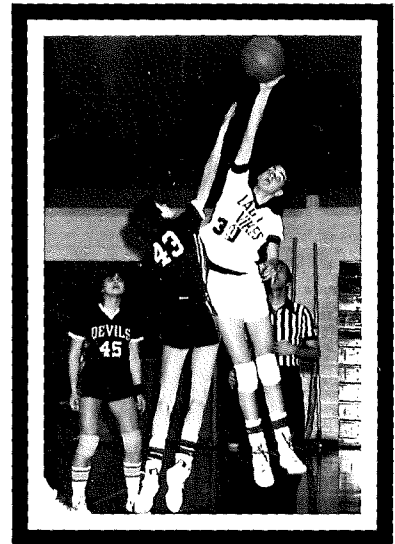
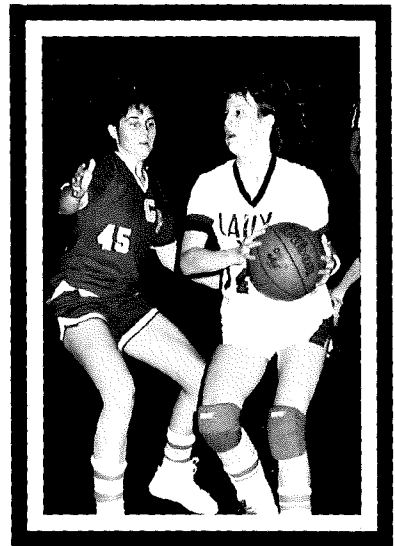


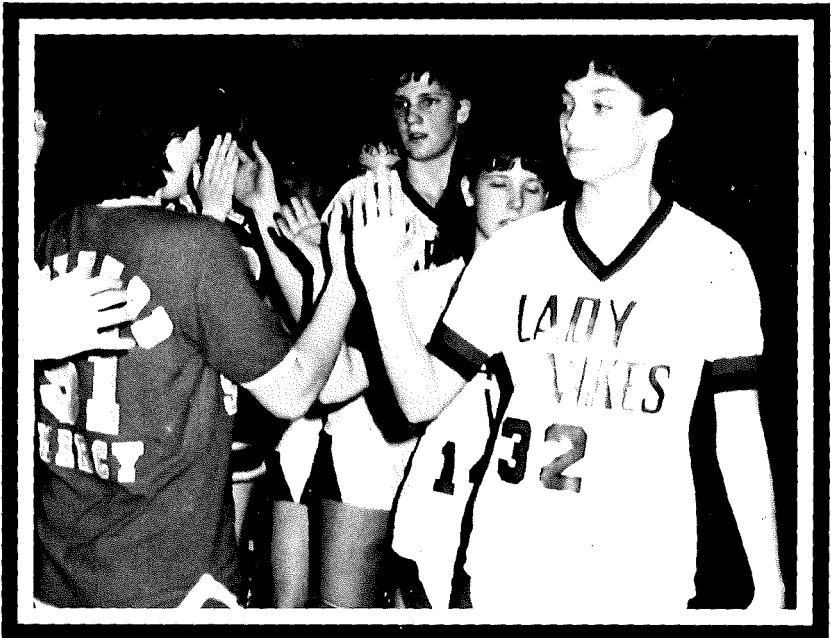
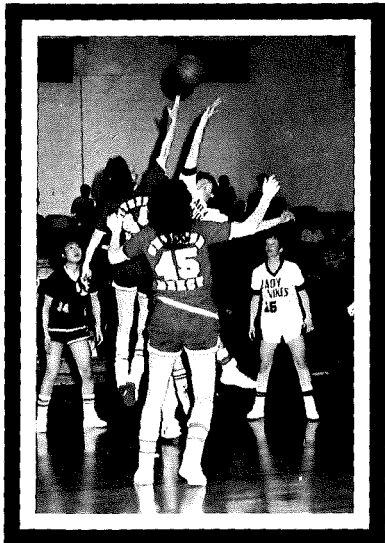
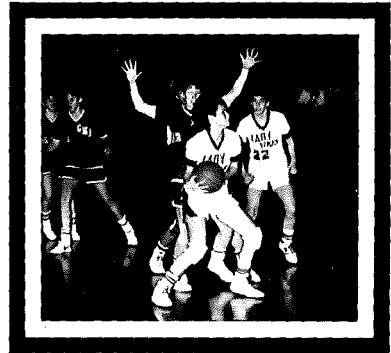
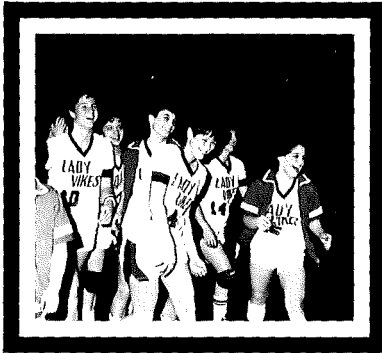
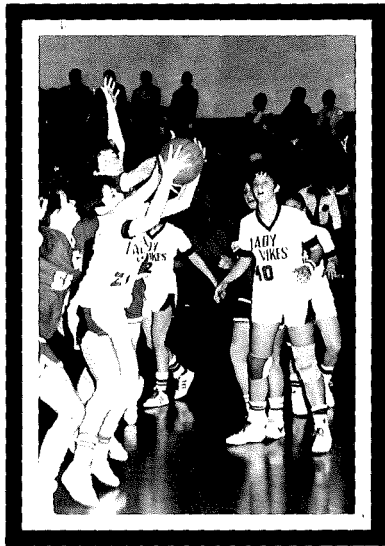
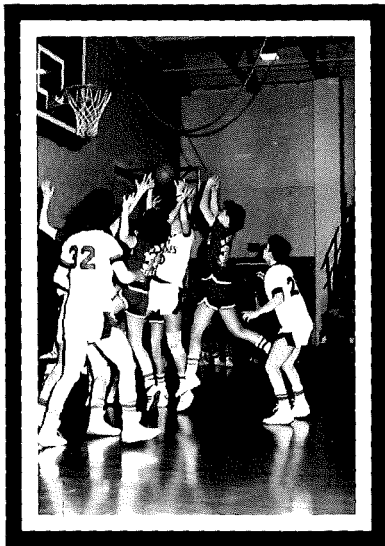
GIRLS BASKETBALL

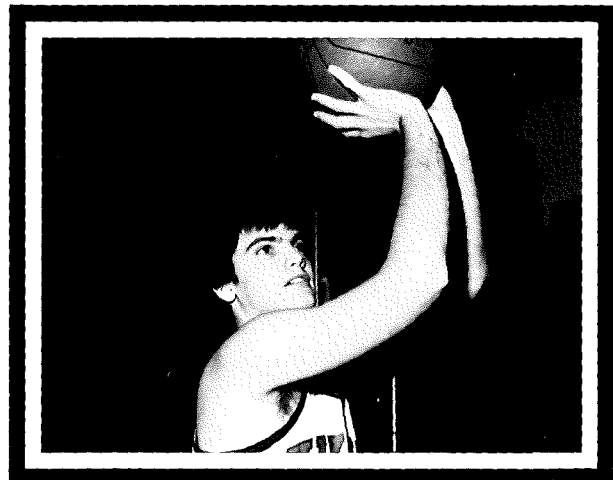
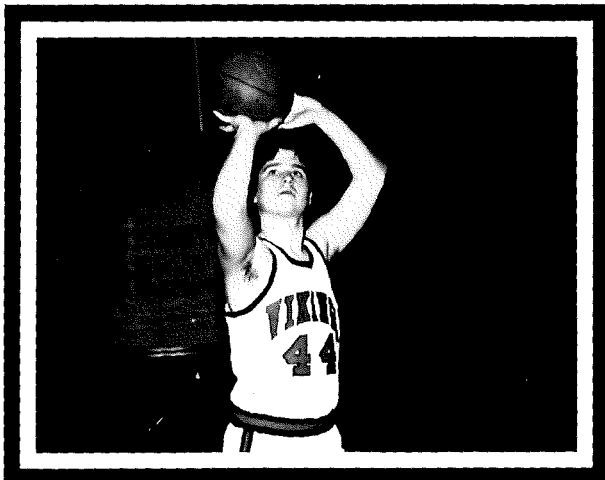
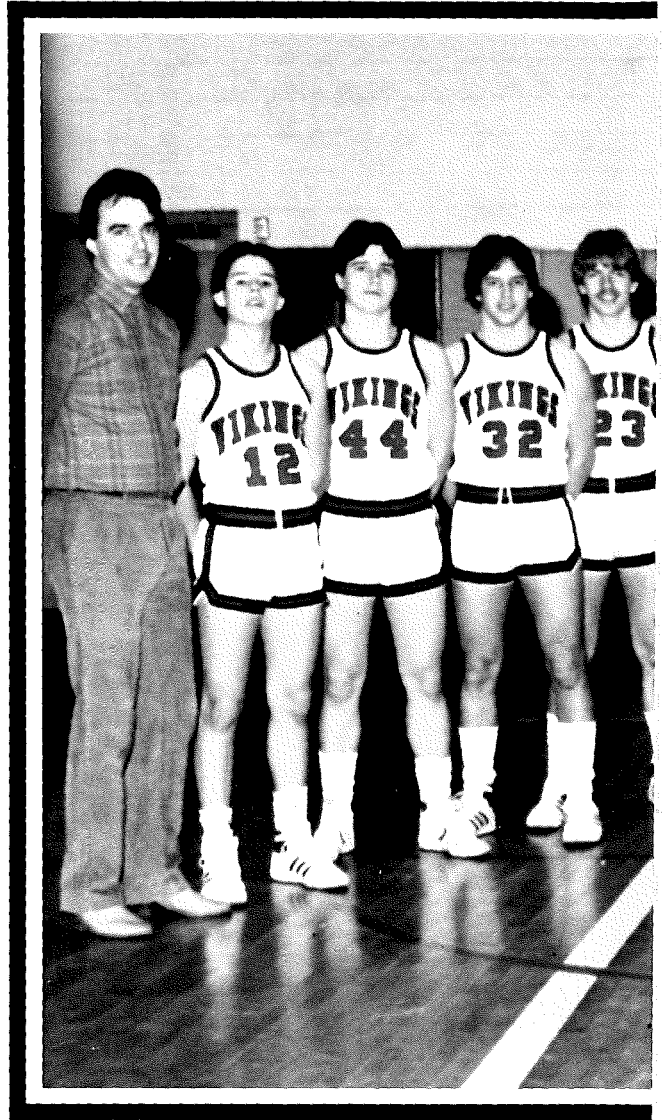
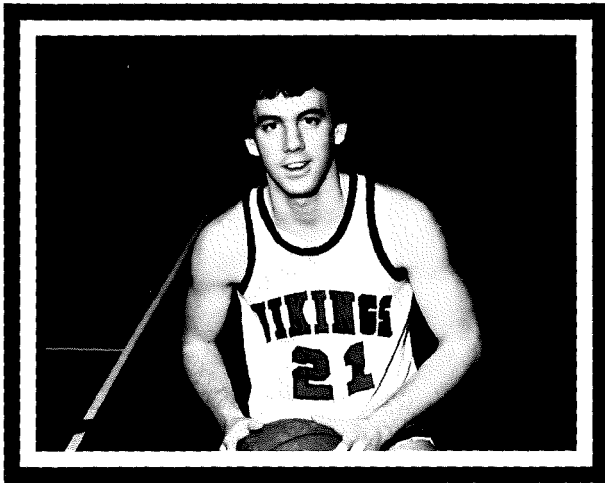


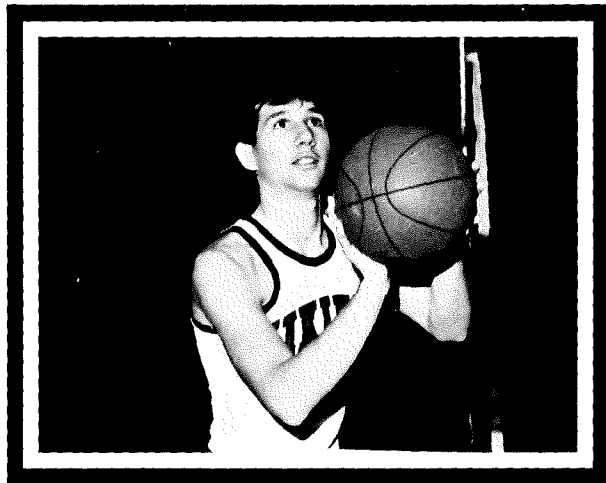
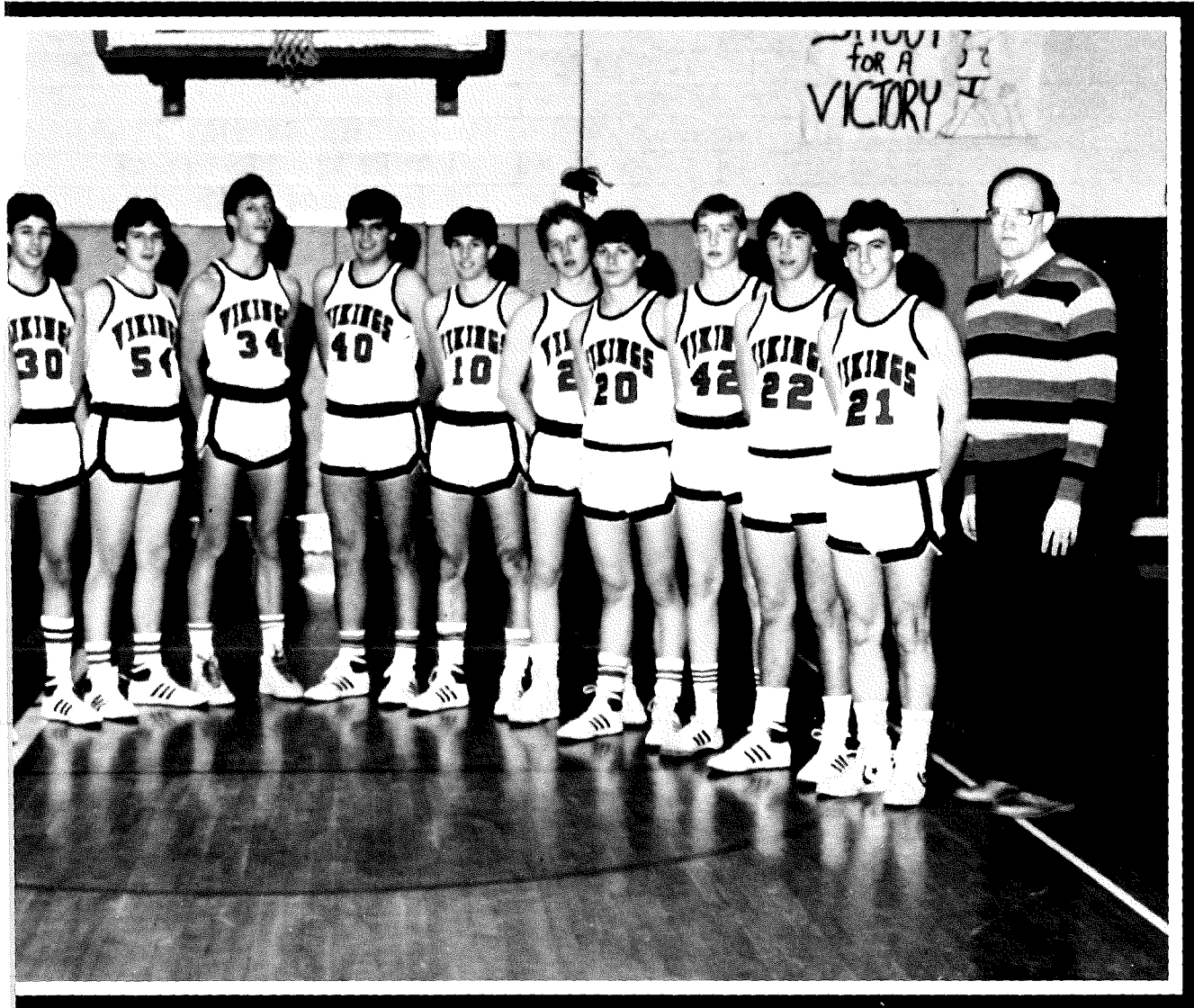


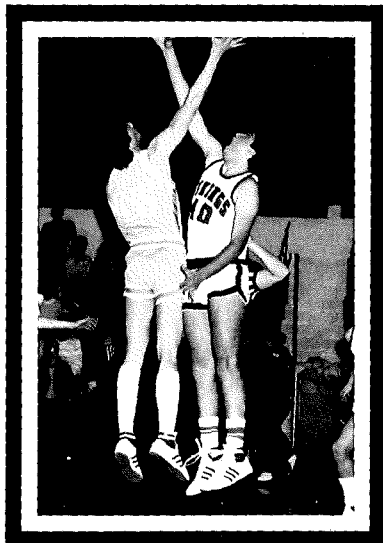
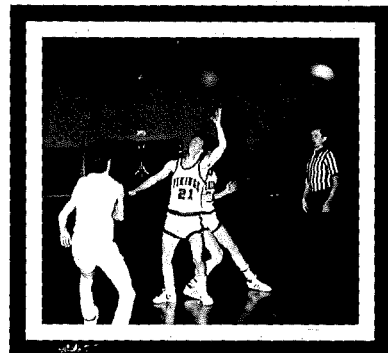
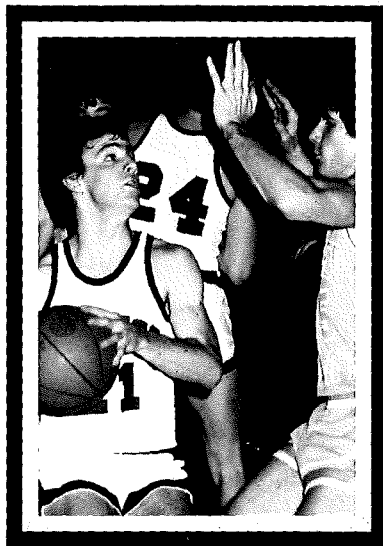
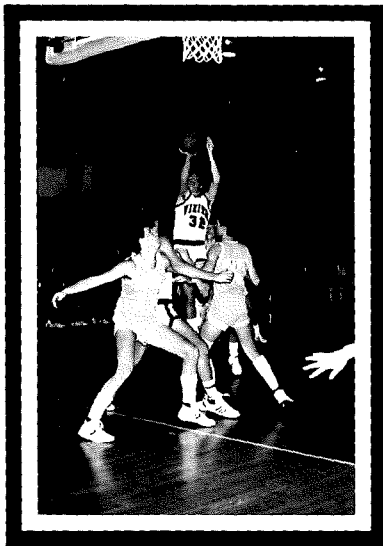


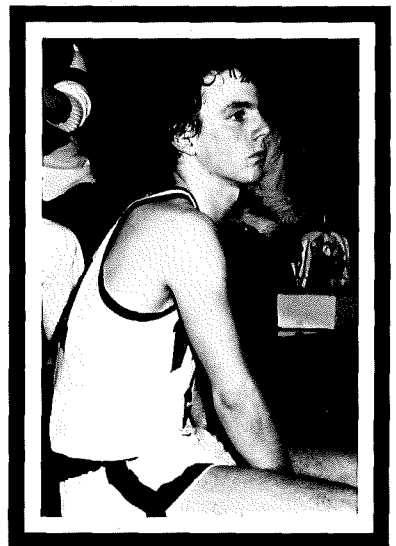
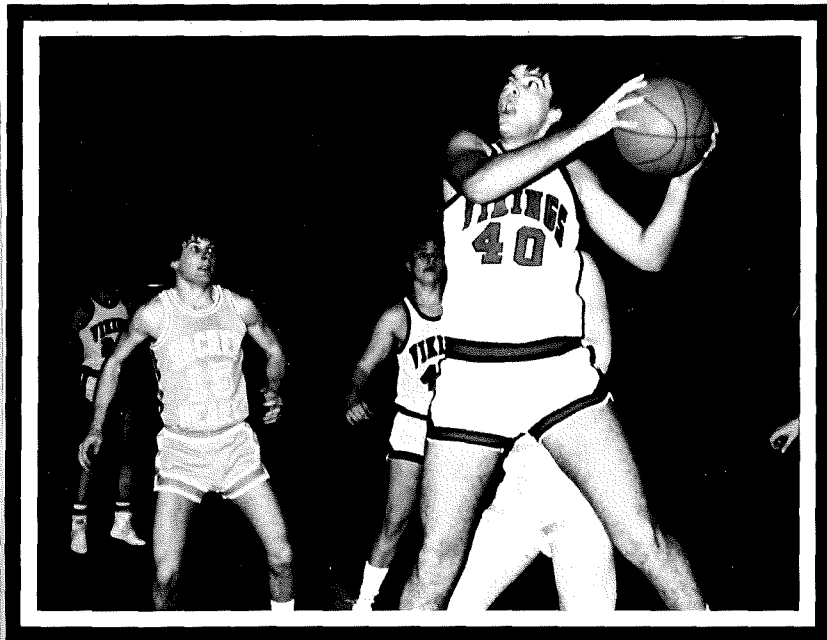
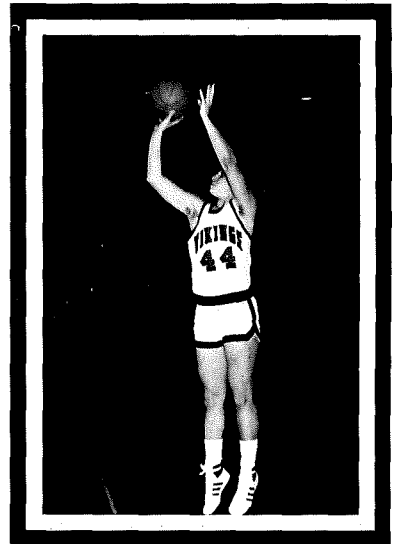
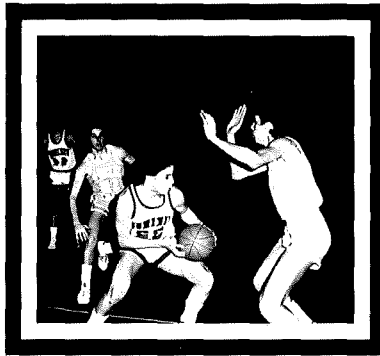
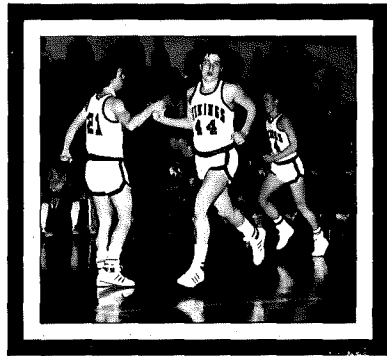
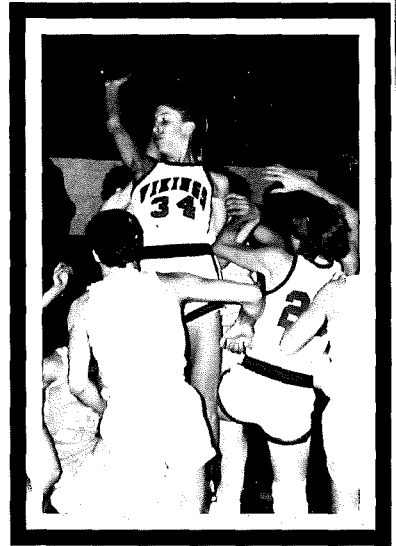
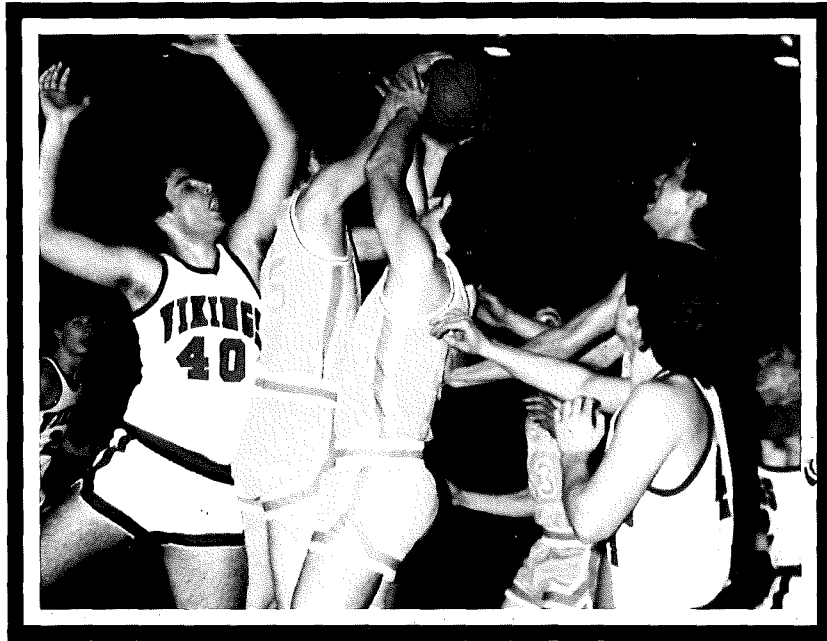
BOYS BASKETBALL

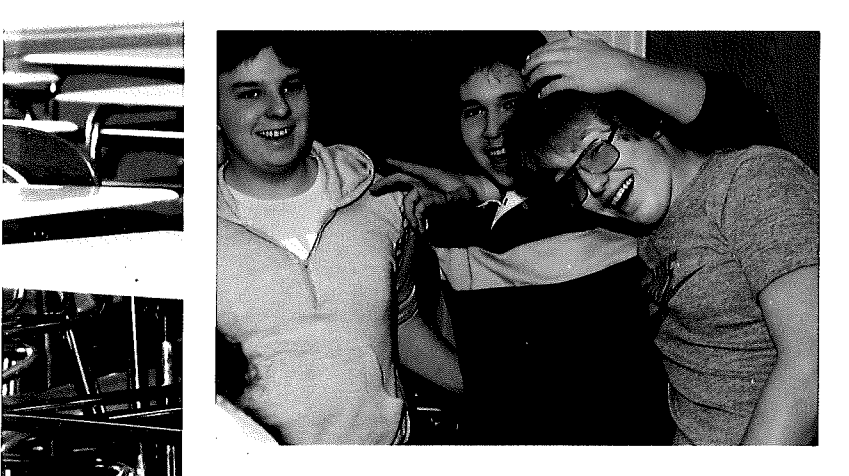
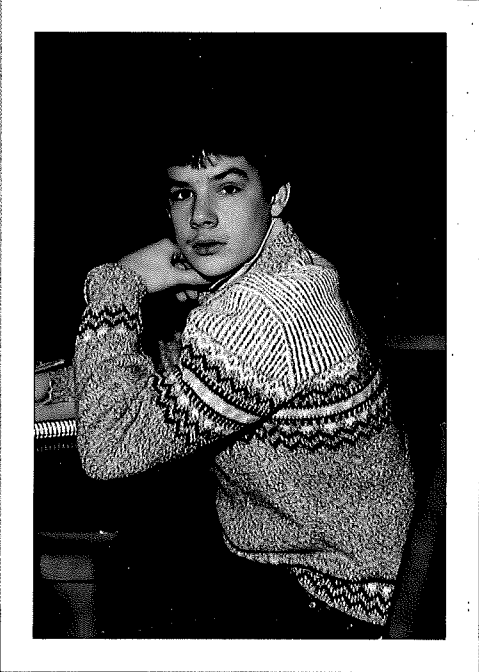
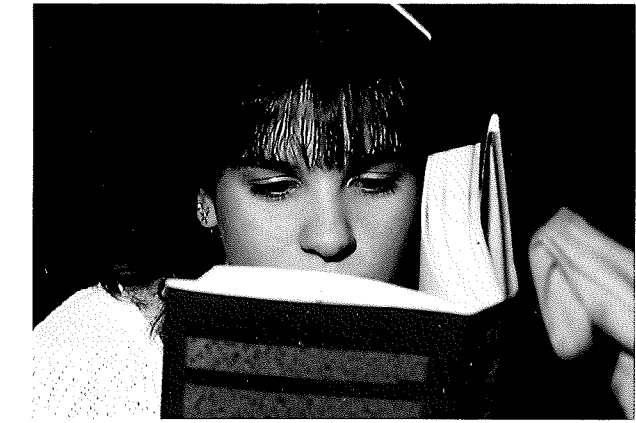
The major goal of the Riverside Junior-Senior High Drama Club, under the direction of Kathryn Dougher, is to instill an appreciation for theatre arts.

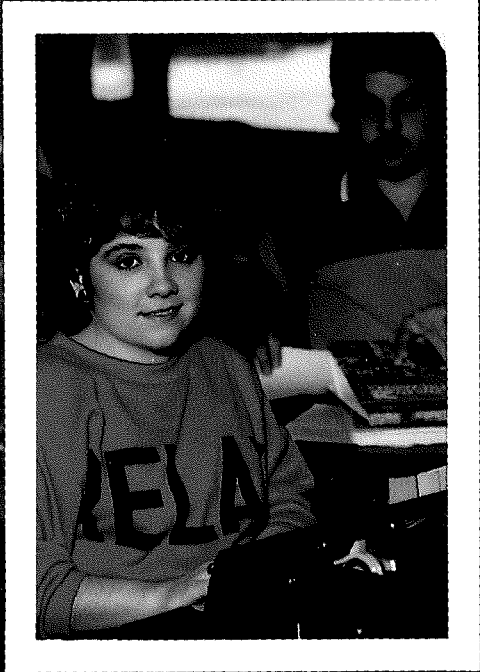

The club's "finale" for the school year was a trip to the Bucks County Playhouse to witness an exciting performance of "Dracula."





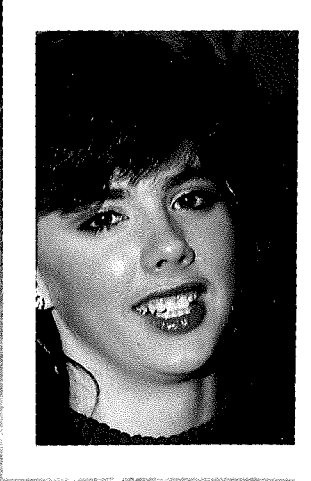
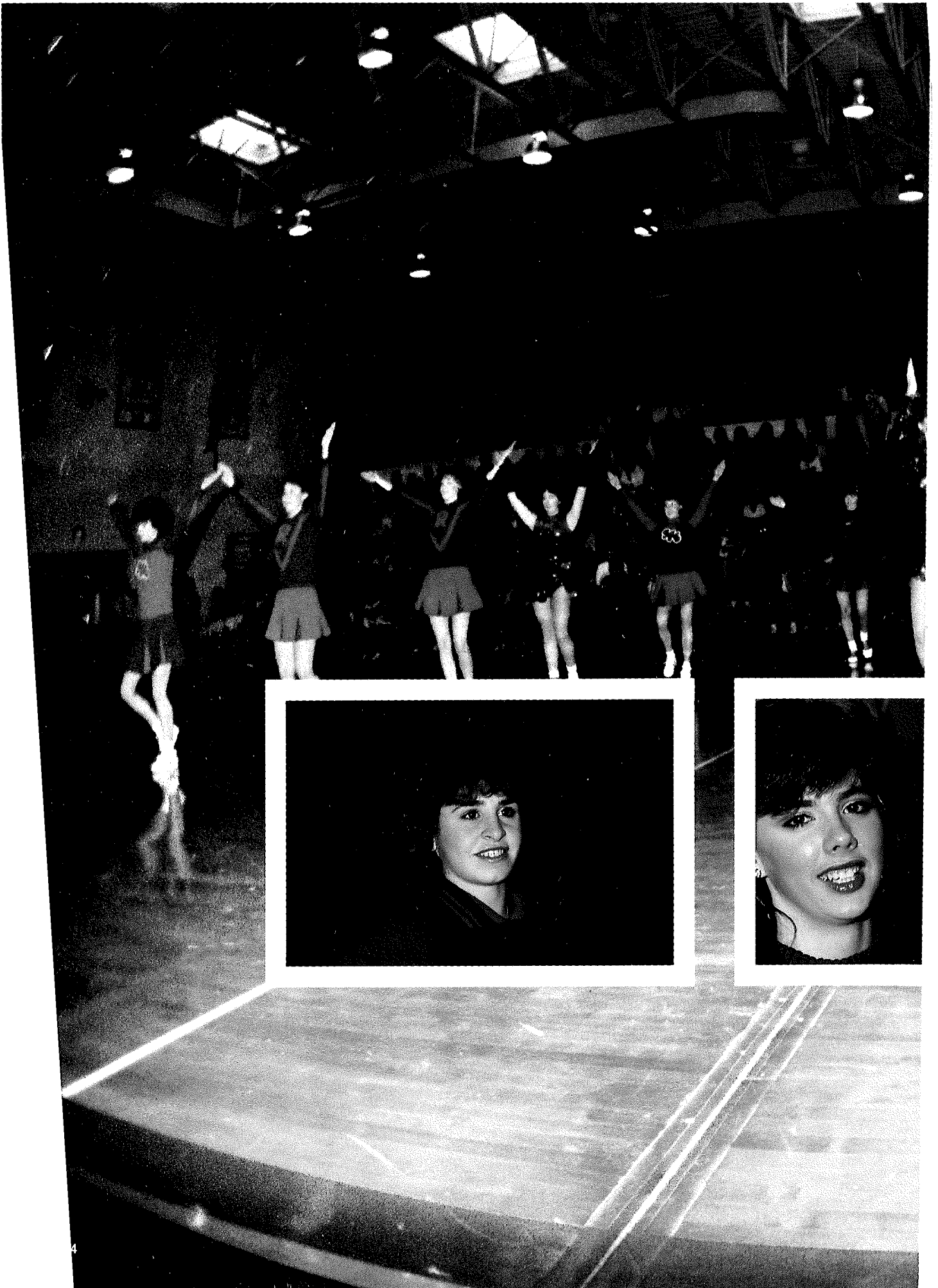


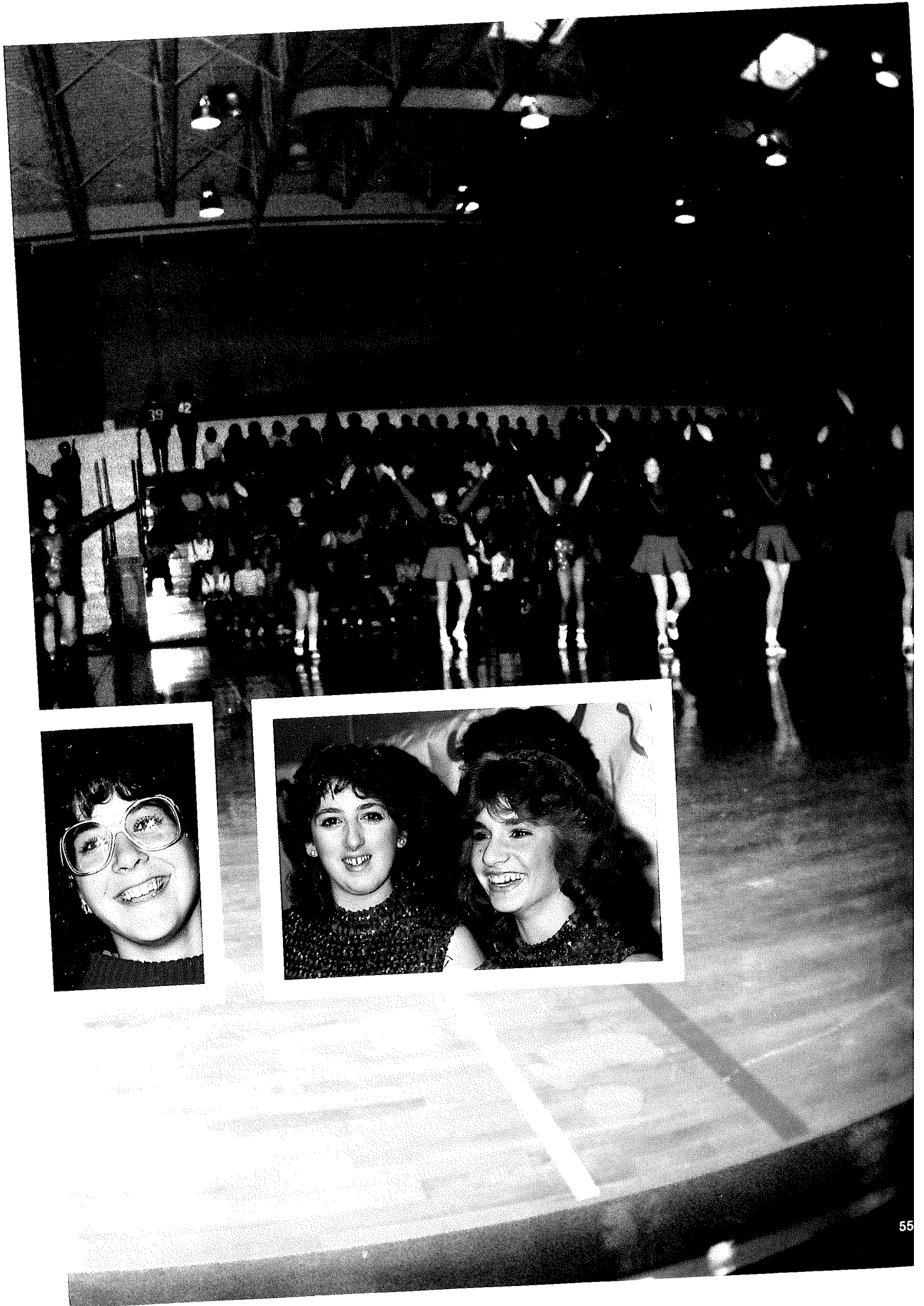

Representing Riverside on this year's Scholastic Team were Karen Kovalski, Jeanine Kasulis, Carol Janeski, and Karen Fadden.

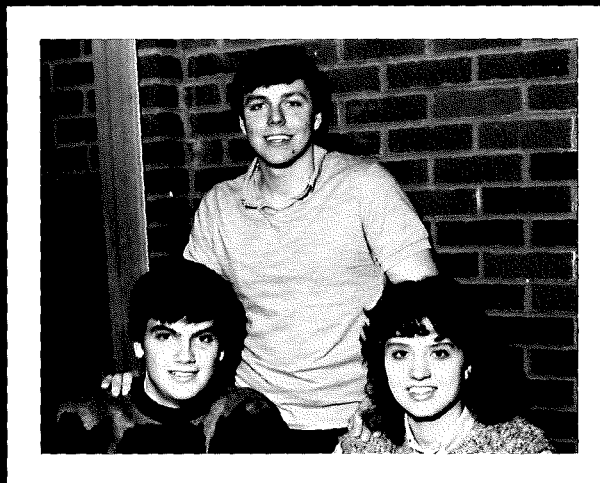

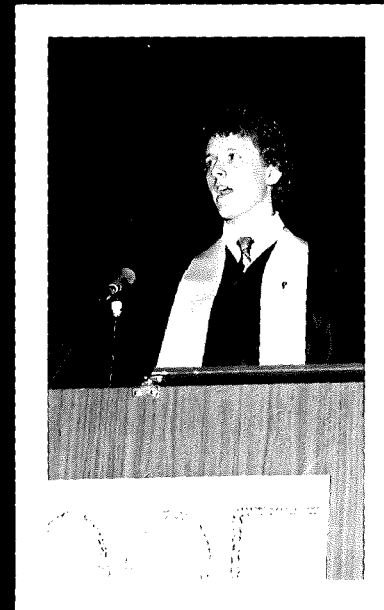
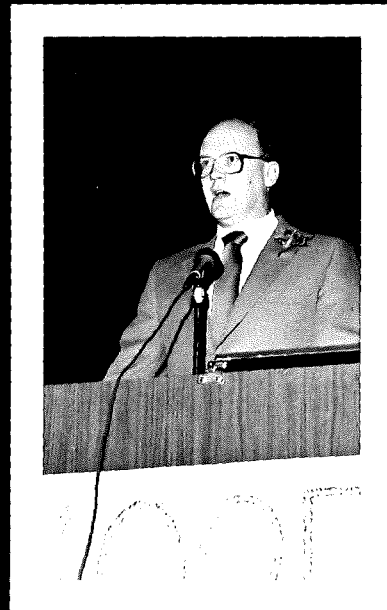
Representing Riverside in the Student Forum of the Northeastern Educational Intermediate Unit were Forum president Renee Geron and vice-president Michael Bailey.

Carol: But, the great times ended at graduation.

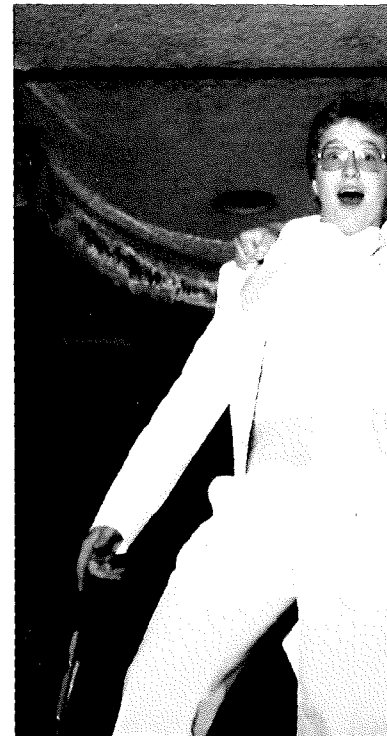

As the school year drew to a close, it was time for Class Night and Class Day. Following these events closely was graduation. With this our high school days came to an end.



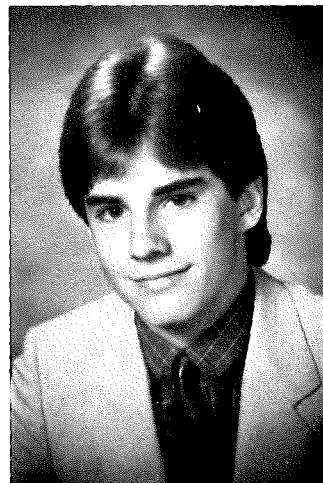




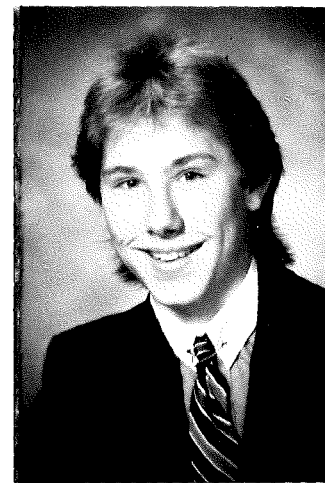

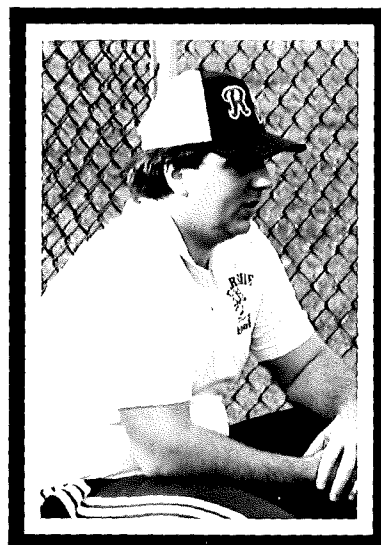
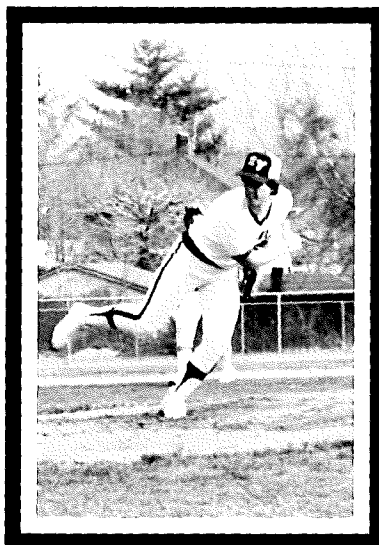
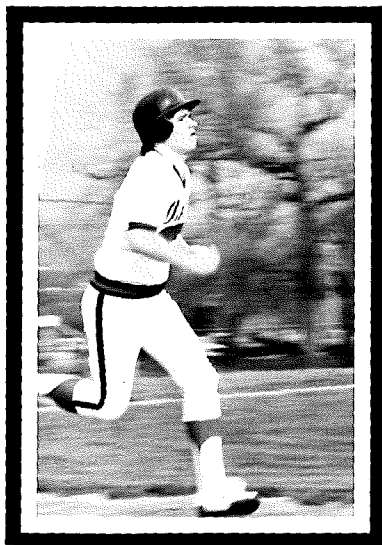




BOYS BASEBALL

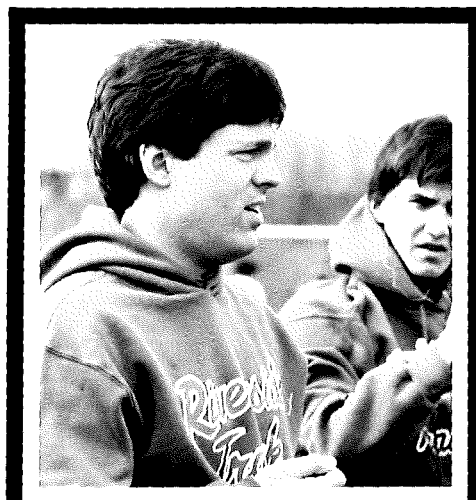
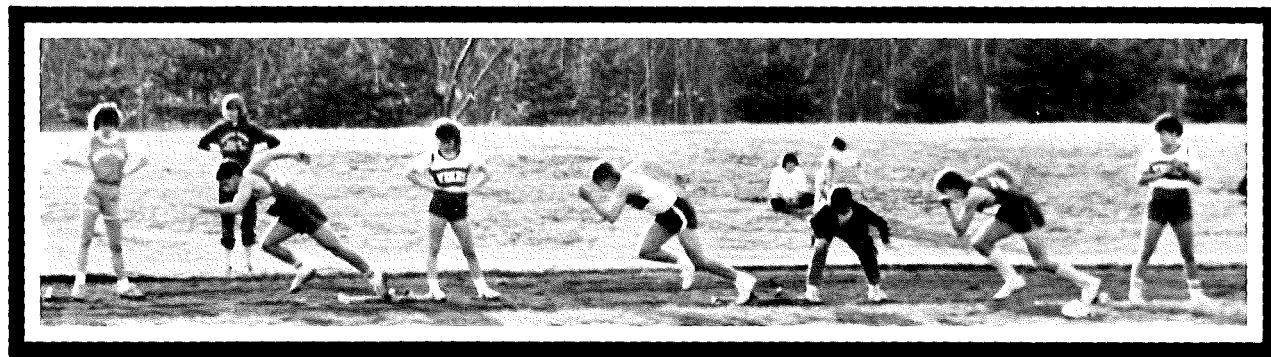
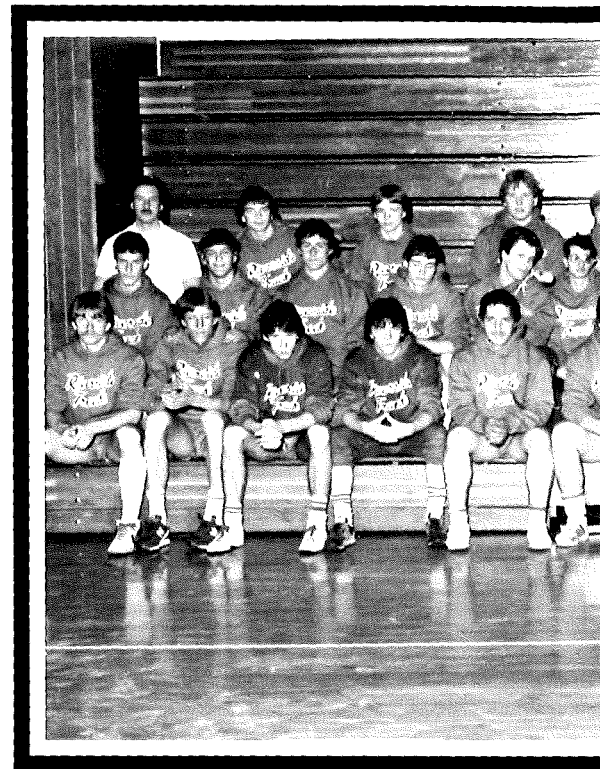
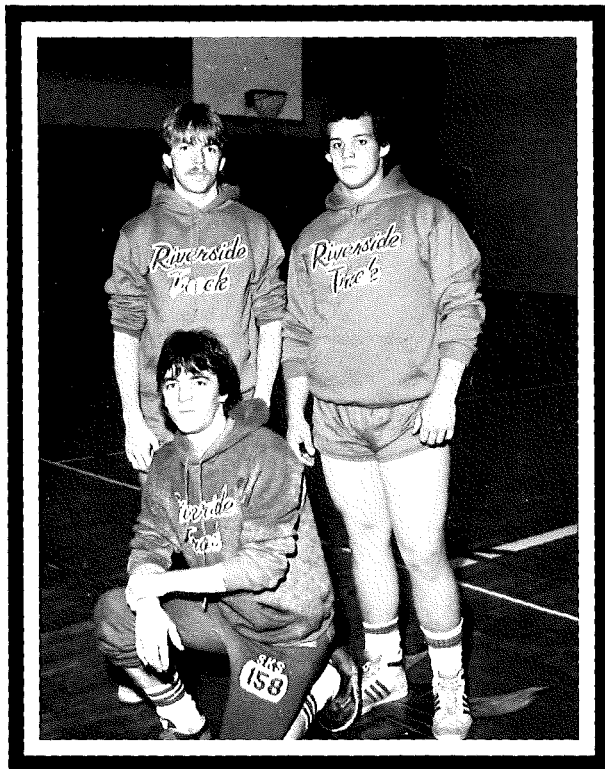


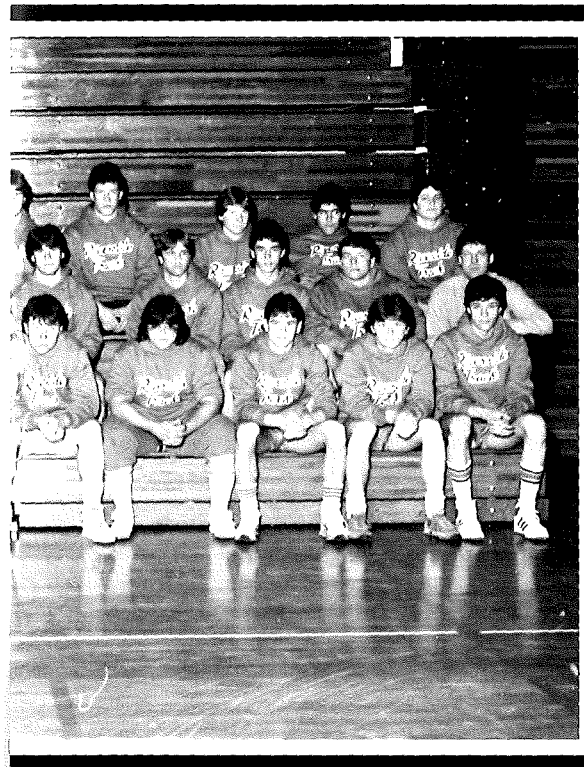


GIRLS SOFTBALL
