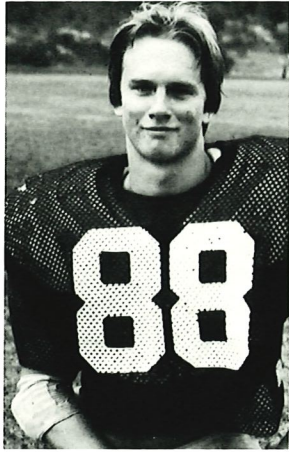




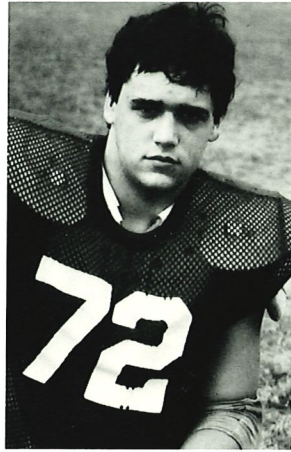
This year's golf team got off to a good start and really got into the swing of things. Not only had they captured the sports headlines but also the title of Lackawanna Southern Division League Champions.

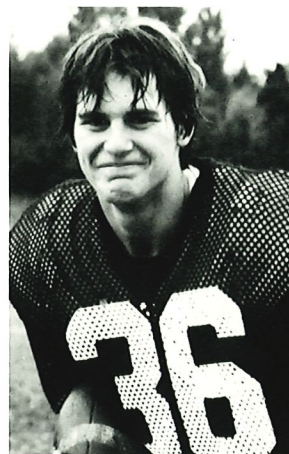

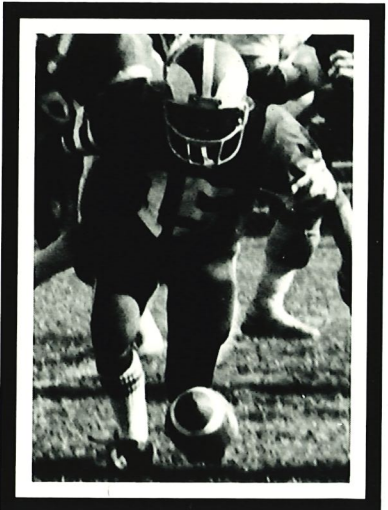
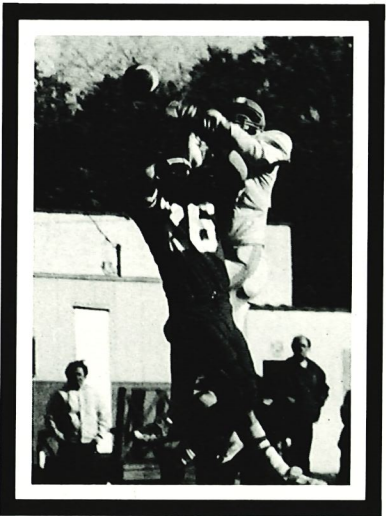
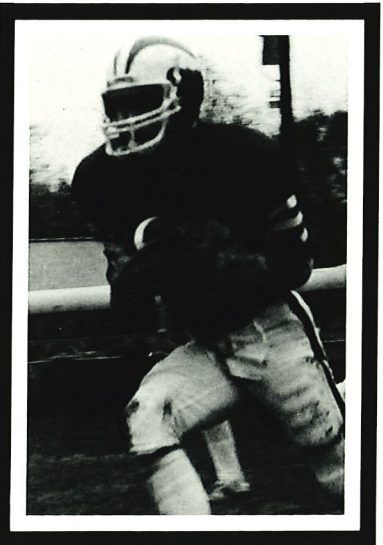
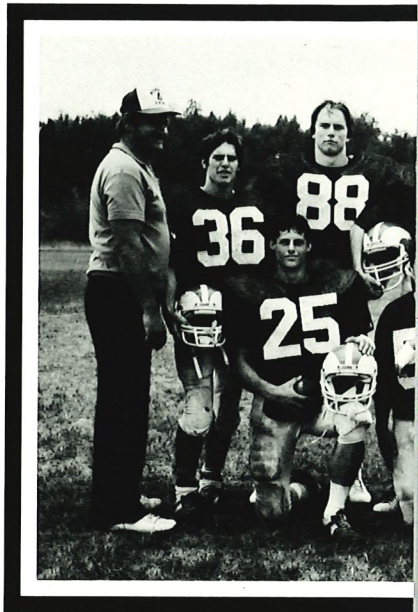
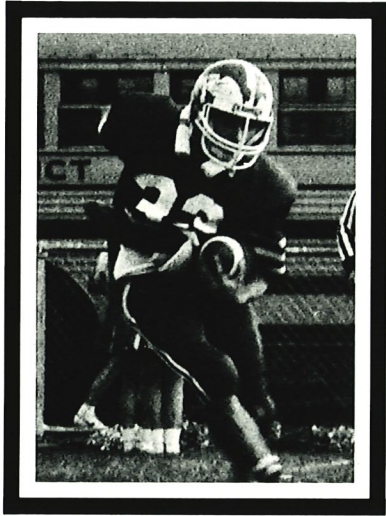
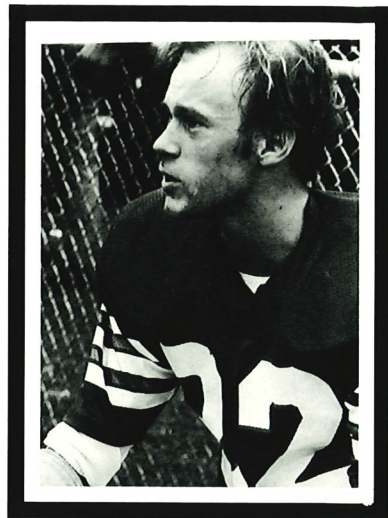
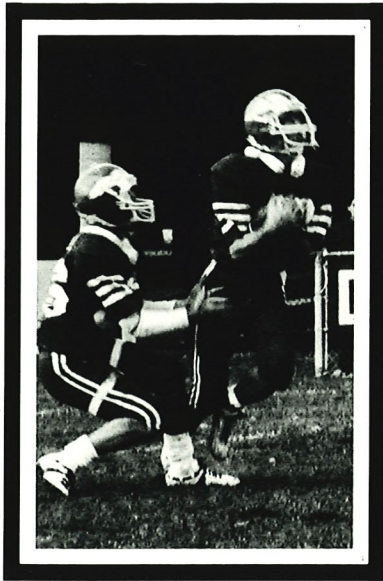


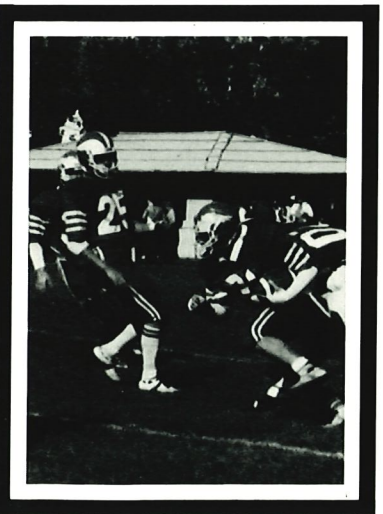
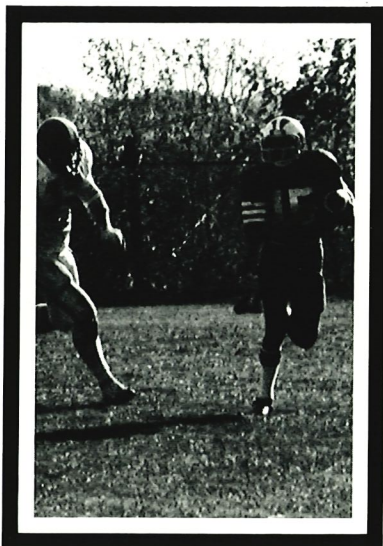
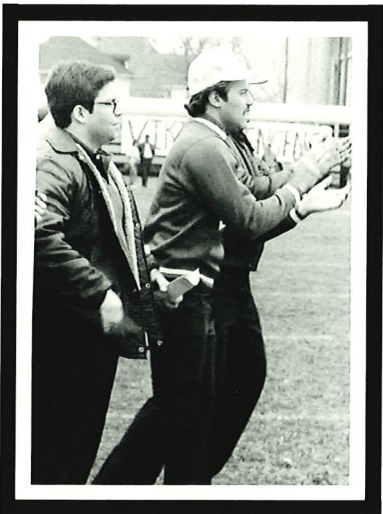
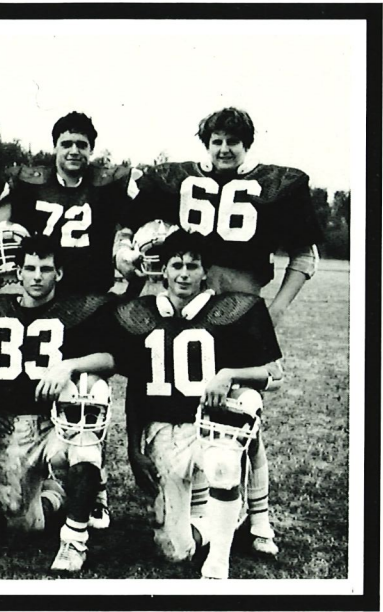
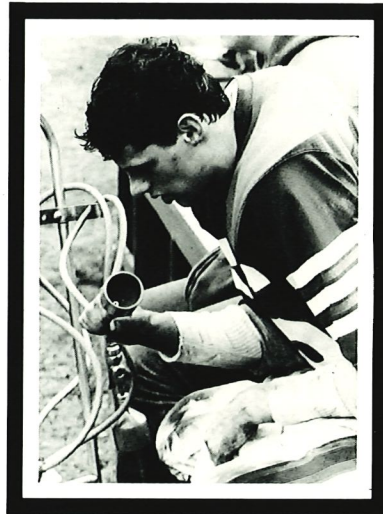
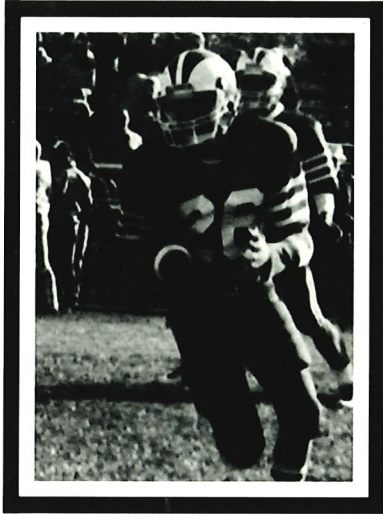
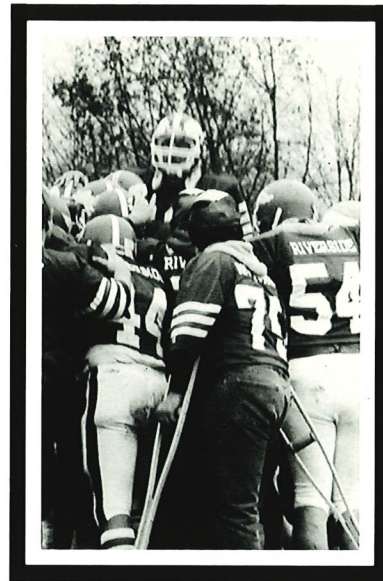
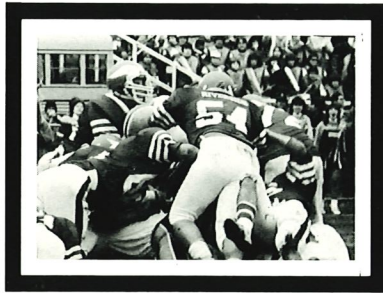
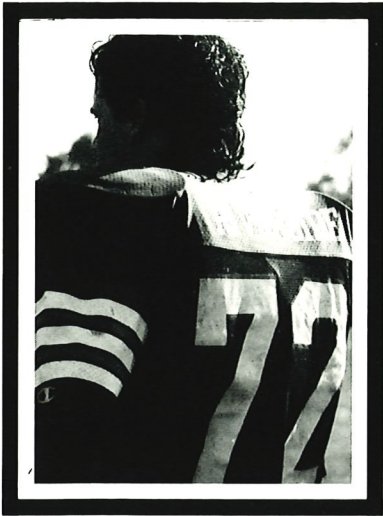


FOOTBALL TEAM

This year's Ski Club had a good year and can be seen on their trip to Vermont. (pg. 49)

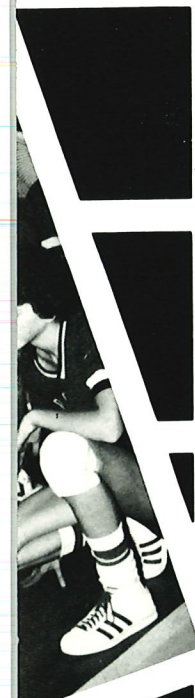
The Drama club had a very successful and productive year. Although it is relatively a new club, it is one that has great potential. (pg. 73)

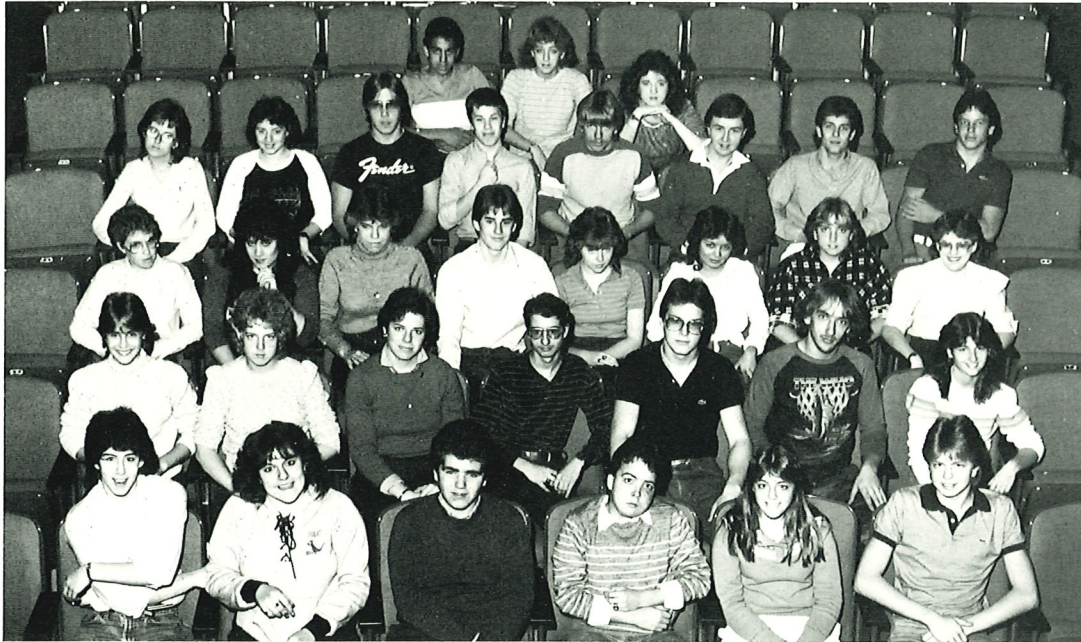


SCHOOL DANCES

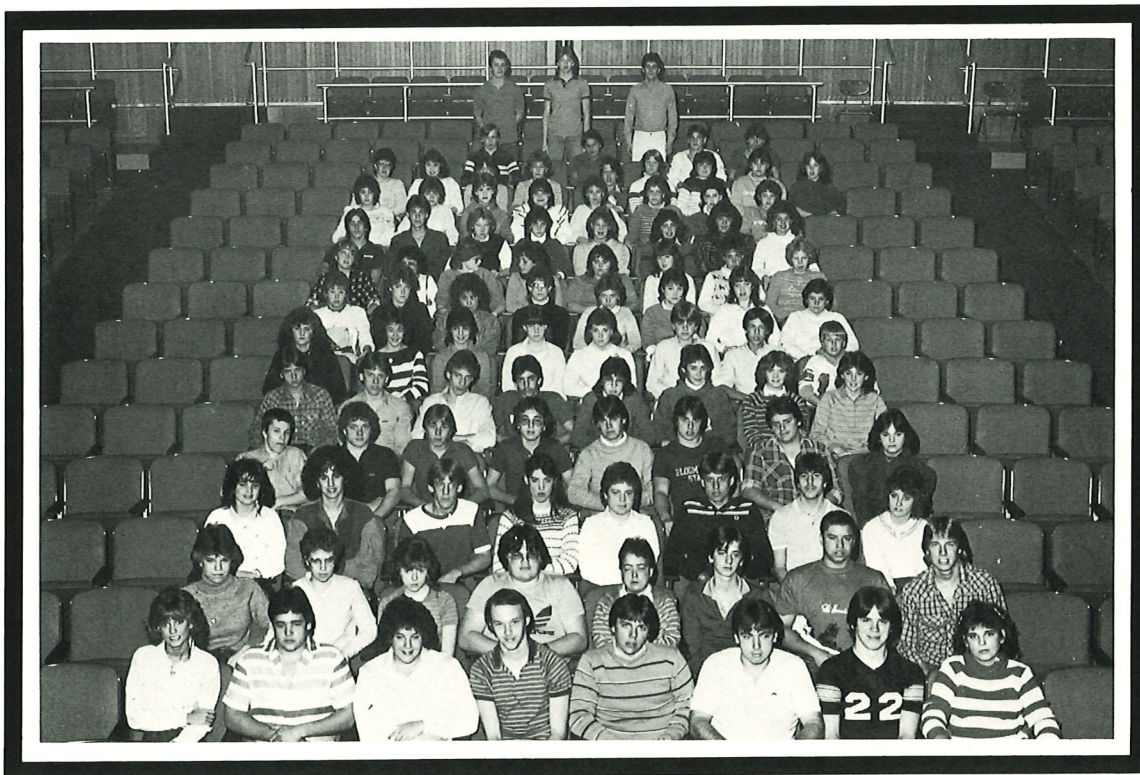
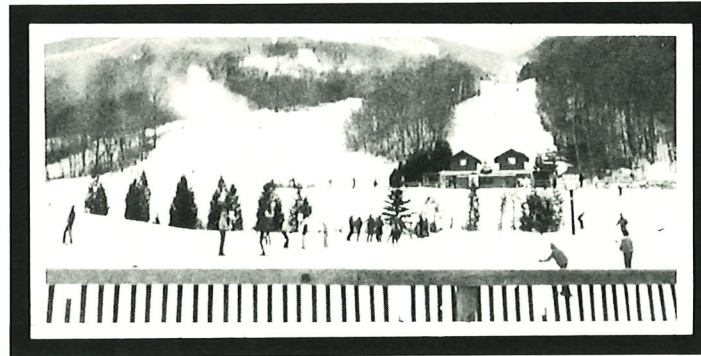
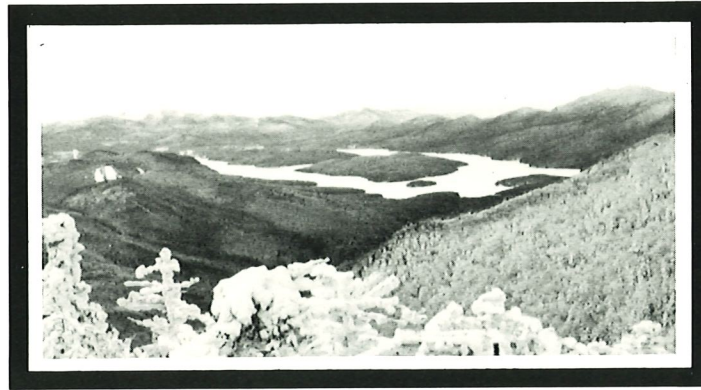
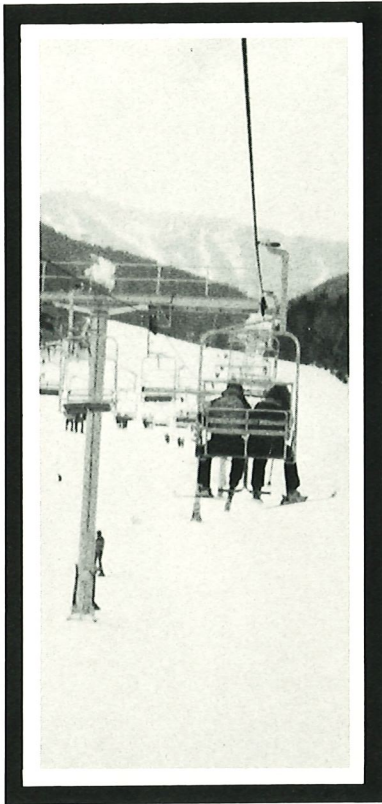
HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTION

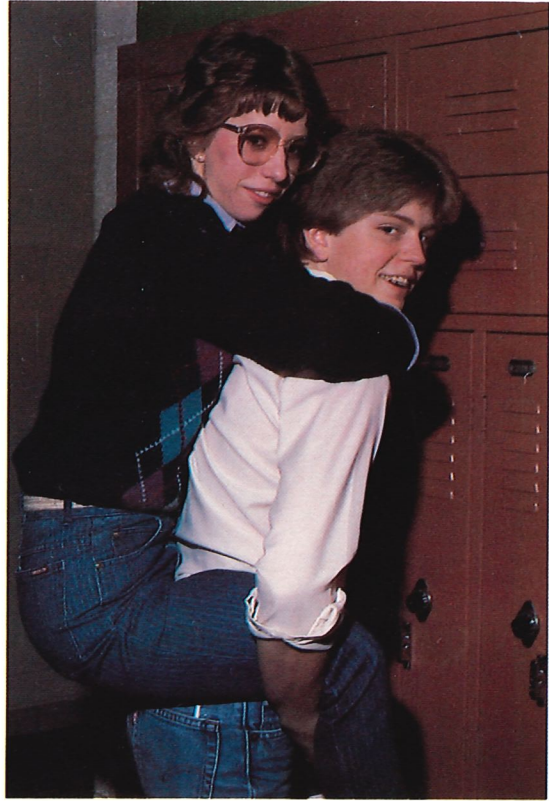

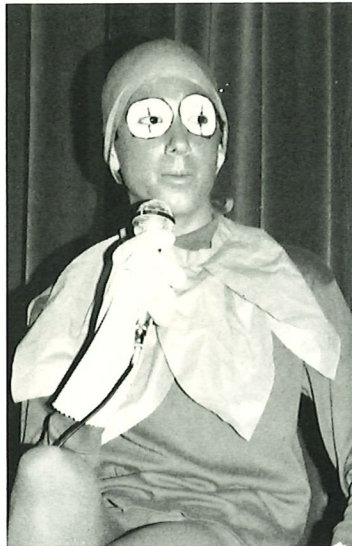
The ninth grade speech class presented its first variety show in 1983. The success of this initial production inspired an expansion of the format to include the participation of tenth grade guest performers in 1984.

The show originated with a desire to share with parents the skills and talents developed by students in the speech class environment. It has been a rewarding experience for everyone.

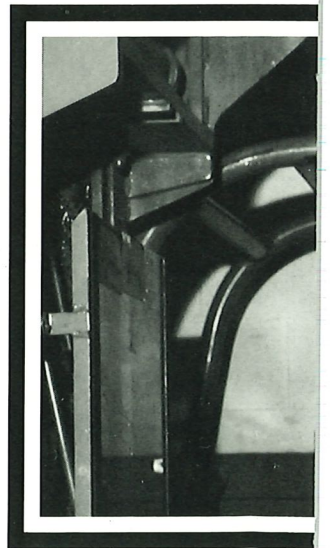
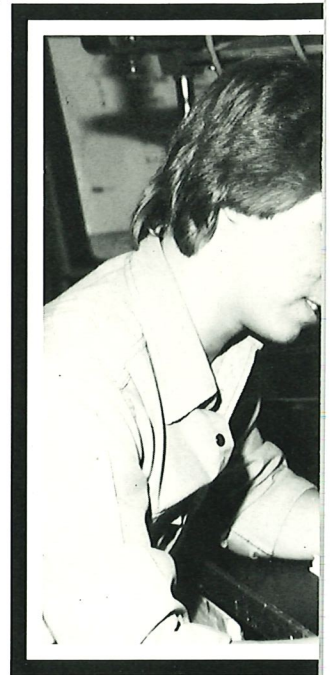
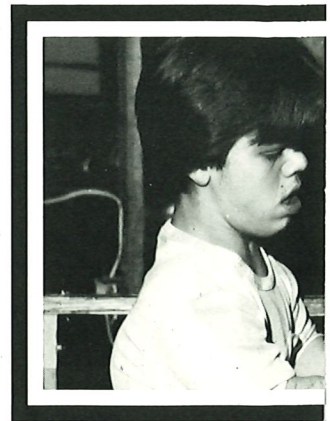

Robert Malinosky was presented with the Hank Evanish Award and also received the PTA's Science Award.

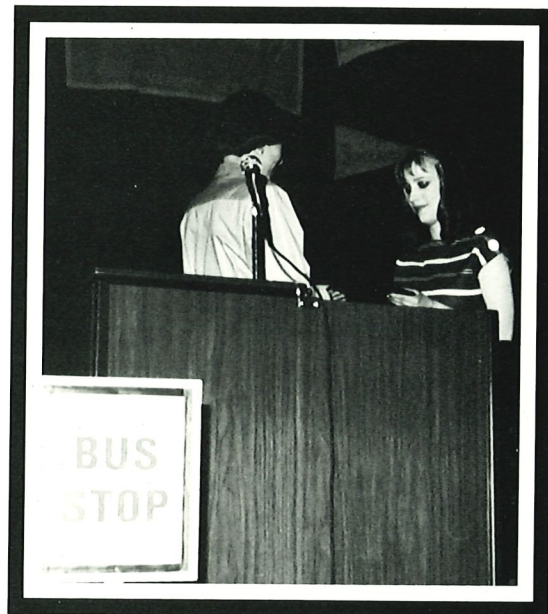

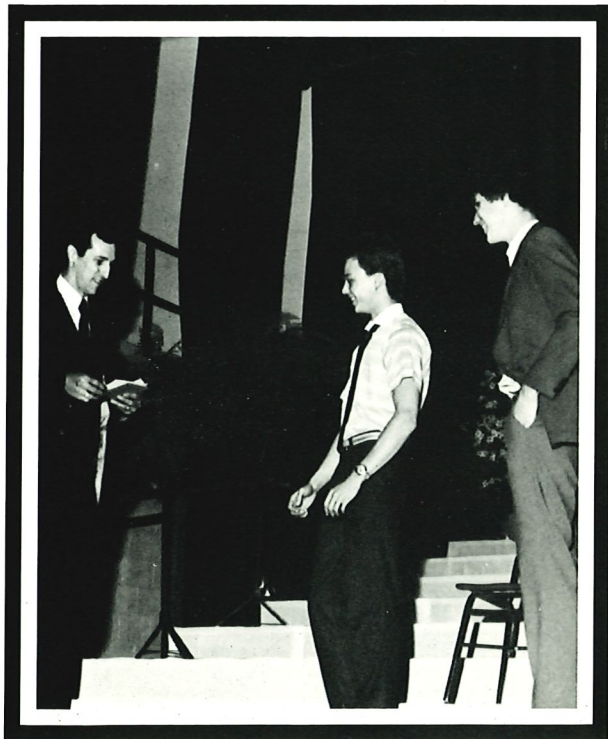




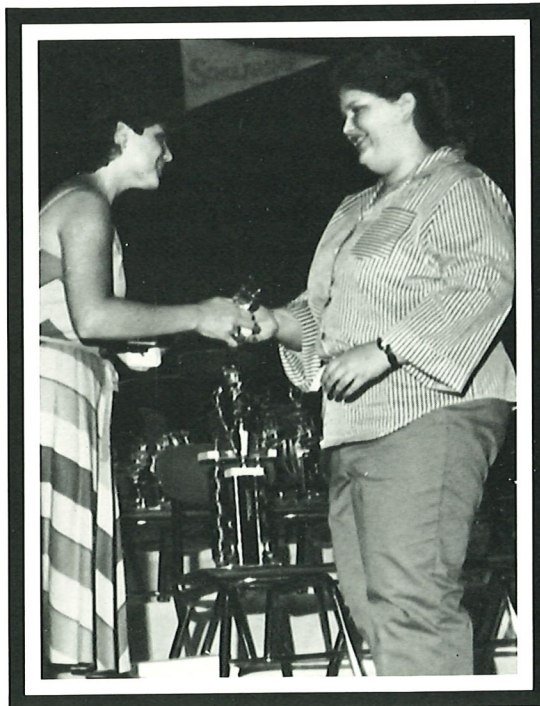
Miss Grace Horger presented Donna Kempa with the Miss Ruth Horger Award.

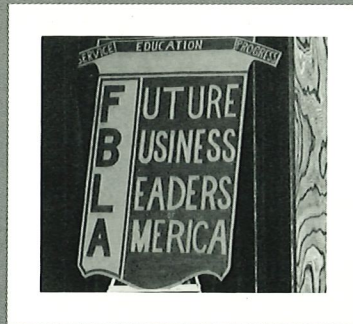


FACULTY BASKETBALL: YEARBOOK EVENTS

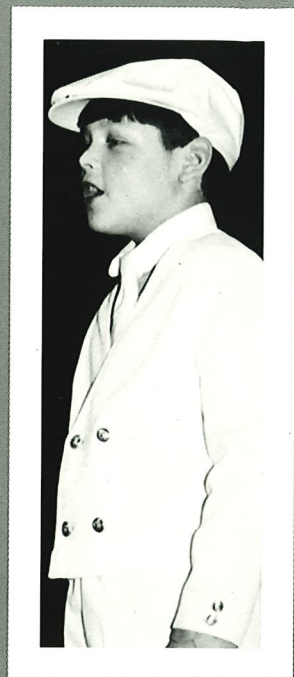
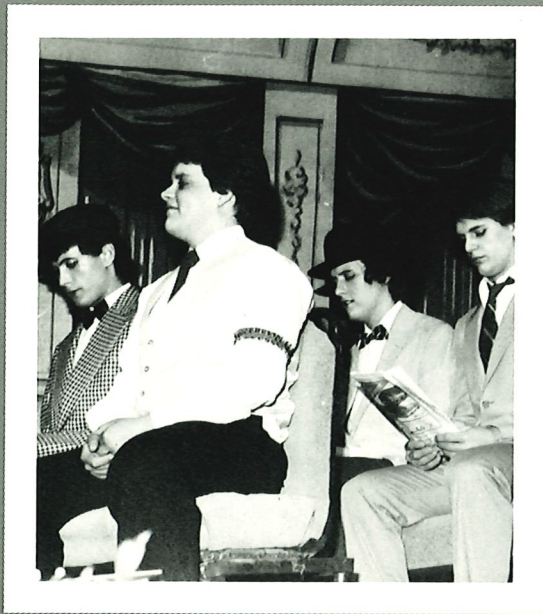

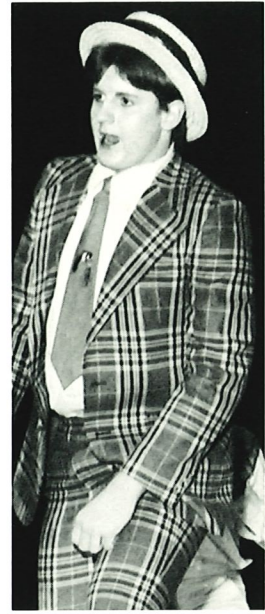
The seventh annual Passing of the Sword banquet was held on March 25th, 1984, at the Hilton at Lackawanna Station.
